Syrian fortune seized in Puerto Banús money laundering raids

Rifaat al-Assad, an uncle of the current Syrian president, used eleven relatives to hide more than 500 properties in Spain

Guardia Civil officers swarmed Puerto Banús on Tuesday when they raided 15 properties belonging to the former vice-president of Syria, Rifaat al-Assad. The uncle of current president Bashar al-Assad is at the centre of a money-laundering investigation carried out by Spanish and French authorities. Numerous assets were seized, including luxury vehicles and antiques, and bank accounts frozen.

Al-Assad used seven of his children, two wives and two daughters-

in-law to conceal his business activities and more than 500 properties he owned in Spain, valued at 690 million euros. He acquired the properties over the years from 1988, using a web of companies linked to his relatives and avoiding putting any of the assets in his own name, according to the order issued by a national court judge. One of the properties involved is La Máquina, an enormous estate that occupies almost a third of the entire municipal area of Benahavís. **P3**

MALAGA. The funding for Malaga in the 2017 State Budget has now been announced, and it is the lowest so far this century. The province is due to receive approximately 138 million euros, which is about 40 per cent less than last year. Not only will this make it impossible to progress some long-awaited infrastructure improvements, but it will also stifle new projects. This is a far cry from 2008, when investment funding in Malaga totalled 1.2 billion euros.

The train to Marbella will have to be put on hold yet again, even in the format proposed by the former Minister for Public Works, Ana Pastor, by extending the suburban line from Fuengirola, and despite promises during the last legislature that it would be given priority. It appears that those in charge of investment funding are once again evaluating a completely new railway route from the airport,

which would link up with the high speed line. The government has only allocated 350,000 euros for the coastal railway project, barely enough to pay for the studies carried out by the state-owned Cedex company.

The only noteworthy funding from the Ministry of Public Works this year is the northern access to the airport from the second bypass, which will receive 6.5 million euros. There will also be money for the A-7 link road in Fuengirola (500,000 euros). Improvements to the exit from the A-7 at Benalmádena-Arroyo de la Miel, one of the busiest and most dangerous on the provincial road network, will receive 422,000 euros.

On the other hand, hardly any funding has been allocated for the Bobadilla-Ronda-Algeciras freight railway line, which is key for the development of this logistical area, at least for the Malaga stretch.

At the Cadiz end, minister Íñigo de la Serna has announced an insufficient 20 million euros to remodel the stretch in Algeciras. There are still plans to carry out a study into a new bypass in the metropolitan area.

Baños del Carmen to benefit

The Ministry of Industry will pay 1.7

million euros for the Digital Content Pole (a training centre in new technologies in the audio-visual sector) in Malaga city. The Ministry of the Environment has allocated 500,000 euros to start regeneration works at the beach at Los Baños del Carmen, with specific amounts for replacing the sand, recovering coastal systems, accesses and controlling erosion of the coast. The Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport will only be providing 100,000 for the long-awaited State Public Library at San Agustín, while the Ministry of the Economy plans to continue work on the Oceanography Centre in Malaga Port, which have currently been suspended due to a problem with the foundations (2.15 million).

From public companies, most of the funds allocated to Malaga by Adif will be used on the Antequera-Granada high speed railway line (27.8 million), although all the works will be in Granada province because those in Malaga have already been completed. Aguas de las Cuencas Mediterráneas (Acuamed) will be provid-

ing 141,000 euros towards energy improvement at the Marbella desalination plant and funds for re-use of waste water at the treatment plants at Cerro del Águila, La Víbora and Arroyo de la Miel, all of which are on the Costa del Sol (1.7 million altogether). The pipes in Campanillas will also be improved.

The plans to improve roads and parking at the airport will be allocated 3.2 million euros from the State budget, while State ports will be providing 165,000 euros for a study into moving the freight train underground. Archidona's new prison, which is due to open this year, will receive 21.4 million, the largest amount of funding in Malaga province this year. One million euros are also earmarked for remodelling the Parador hotel in Nerja, a project which will cost eight million.

The four political parties which represent Malaga in parliament had different reactions to the news. PSOE and Podemos were the most critical. Socialist MP Miguel Ángel Heredia complained that Mariano Rajoy's government had once again placed the

province at the back of the queue for investment. "Malaga is only going to receive a miserable one per cent of the investment in Spain. This will mean that major projects cannot be carried out," he said. Alberto Montero from Podemos said the budget represents the general tone of a government "which questions the bases of recovery" by not increasing the amount of investment in Malaga, and agreed that progress is being jeopardised. "The coastal train continues to be nothing more than a wish. These budgets anchor us in a past of tourism and construction to which we do not want to return," he said.

PP's Carolina España, however, said that the government is maintaining its "strong commitment" to Malaga with budgets which are "realistic, focus on giving continuity to projects which the province needs, as well as ensuring economy recovery, creating employment and greater social protection," while Guillermo Díaz, of Ciudadanos, pointed out that there had been larger budgets "on paper" in the past, but these had not been fulfilled. He said his group will be closely watching to make sure that the northern airport access, the Baños del Carmen and access to Arroyo de la Miel projects are carried out.

Rifaat al-Assad, the Syrian president's uncle, under investigation in Puerto Banús

The Guardia Civil raided the reclusive millionaire's properties on Tuesday as part of an international money-laundering operation

MARBELLA / MÁLAGA. It isn't a palace, it's a luxury apartment block at the entrance to Puerto Banús, but locals call it the 'Syrians' palace' rather than by its name, Gray d'Albion. The building, with its pink marble façade and golden domes, is the height of ostentation. On Tuesday, however, people were gazing at it for a different reason. Early that morning 30 Guardia Civil officers arrived to search the homes and offices of Rifaat al-Assad, the brother of former Syrian president Hafez al-Assad and uncle of present leader Bashar al-Assad.

Rifaat al-Assad is at the centre of an investigation into money laundering by a criminal organisation. The investigation, called 'Operation Scar', is being led by judge José de la Mata and information has been obtained from French judge Renaud Van Ruymbeke, who is investigating Al-Assad's wealth in that country.

De la Mata authorised 15 raids to be carried out on Wednesday, most of them in Puerto Banús, three summonses were issued, and the bank accounts of 16 people linked to Rifaat al-Assad were frozen, as were a further 76 company accounts.

The Guardia Civil removed numerous items from the building, including jewellery, antiques, tapestries and six vehicles. The fire brigade assisted with the operation and opened several safes, which were found to contain documentation but no money. So far, nobody has been arrested.

As well as the Gray d'Albion building, where Al-Assad owns most of the

apartments and where some of his sons have their permanent residence, the Guardia Civil also searched other properties associated with the Syrian: the Park Banús hotel, the Benabola apartments, an underground car

park by the entrance to the port and several commercial premises.

According to judge De La Mata, Rifaat al-Assad used seven of his children, two wives and two daughters-in-law to hide his businesses and 503

properties in Spain, which are valued at 690 million euros and were acquired through 34 companies associated with his relatives. He is believed to have been investing in this country since 1988.

From the Hama massacre to a Puerto Banús hideaway

MARBELLA. There could be better places to hide than Puerto Banús, which is known as a place where people go to be seen. However, despite his aversion to photographers, that is where Rifaat al-Assad decided to call home for much of the year, when he was not in Paris or London.

Born in 1937, he moved to Marbella in 1986, two years after his

brother, then president of Syria, sent him into a comfortable exile after being informed that he was plotting against him. Rifaat enjoyed a certain prestige with the authorities, after being credited with putting down a rebellion in Hama, Syria's fourth largest city, in a massacre in which at least 10,000 people died.

When banished, Al-Assad went to Marbella with a large entourage.

When photographers tried to film him in Puerto Banús his bodyguards drew their weapons, something which has discouraged people from trying to get close to him ever since. He is reputed to be difficult to do business with, and local entrepreneurs tend to avoid him.

In June 2000, when his brother died, he made a rare public appearance to criticise his nephew and cast doubts on his ability to run the country. His name came up again last year, when the French authorities confiscated several properties as part of an investigation which has now spread to Spain.

Four Britons arrested after a shootout outside a Fuengirola bar

The man allegedly responsible for firing the gun had been arguing with three fellow Britons who were on a golfing holiday

MALAGA. Four Britons were arrested, two of whom with bullet wounds, after a shooting and brawl on Calle Miguel Márquez, behind the promenade in Fuengirola, at around 5am last Sunday morning. According to witnesses, the incident had originally started inside a bar next to the scene which is popular with Britons. Three of the men, aged between

55 and 60, believed to be friends on a golfing holiday, had become involved in a heated argument with another 42-year-old Briton.

The argument grew so fierce that staff in the bar had to force the men out into the street and lock the door while other customers sheltered inside. Shortly afterwards those trapped inside heard the argument escalate and shots were fired.

Police arriving on the scene found one semiconscious man next to a car with blood on his face after seemingly receiving blows to the face and back of the head.

Another two men were found a few metres away from the car, one of whom had suffered a gunshot wound to his ankle, while the

fourth man, who was also injured with a gunshot, was later found inside the hotel in which the three tourists were staying.

All of the wounded were treated for their injuries at the Costa del Sol Hospital, while under police custody.

Sources close to the incident said that the 42-year-old man who had been found next to the car had been trying to conceal keys to it. Inside police found a pistol, another weapon and several cartridge cases.

Police believe this man fired the gun and a judge later ordered him to be held without bail.

The three golfing tourists were later released and returned immediately to the UK.

Over 400 marijuana plants seized in raid on Pizarra drug farm

COÍN. Officers from the Guardia Civil based in Coín and Pizarra have arrested two youths in connection with the growth and production of marijuana in the rural

Gibralmor area near Pizarra, in the Guadalhorce valley.

The arrests were made as part of operation 'Likamar', an investigation that was first started in February, according to Guardia Civil

sources. The officers raided two homes in the area and seized a total 402 marijuana plants that were being grown, half a kilo of the marijuana drug ready for use, a vehicle and two stun guns.

According to the Guardia Civil, the two detainees, who are from Pizarra and Benalmádena, were also involved in distribution the drug.

Tourist loses teeth after Gibralfaro assault

The woman, who was visiting the city, had her handbag stolen from her last Friday afternoon

and fell on the steps in the immediate aftermath of the incident while the perpetrators fled the scene.

National and Local Police forces found the bloodied woman in a state of shock but managed to find out what had happened before she was transferred to the city's Clinico Universitario Hospital with serious injuries.

Work on seafront walkway in Torrequebrada restarts after storms change plan

BENALMÁDENA. Workers in Benalmádena have this week restarted building work on the new seaside promenade in the Torrequebrada area of the resort.

Work was well advanced on the 450,000-euro project before recent storm damage. The rain caused shifting in earth behind containing walls, forcing engineers to pause construction and rethink the plan.

So far some 330,000 euros of the plan has been spent. This second phase has a budget of 114,000 euros, covering mostly landscaping and other finishing touches. Workers will surface the path, install benches and other wooden features, lighting, watering systems, final landscaping and a protective railing on the viewpoint which is part of the work.

The contract for this project, which is funded by the Diputación provincial authority, was originally awarded in late 2014 and was due to be finished in May 2015. However delays in getting government planning permission postponed the start of construction until late last year.

Mijas finalises plans for coastal path from La Cala to Fuengirola

The cost of this section of the 'Senda Litoral', which will cover a distance of 5.3 kilometres, is expected to be around two million euros

MIJAS. The dream of building a 5.3-kilometre coastal walkway in Mijas Costa between La Cala and Fuengirola is a step closer to becoming reality after the local council announced that it has submitted a master plan for carrying out the works.

Mayor of Mijas, Juan Carlos Maldonado, along with the town councillors for Planning and Infrastructure, Andrés Ruiz and José Carlos Martín, explained that project details have already been sent to the national government and the Junta de Andalucía for them to carry out their analysis of the proposals.

Maldonado stated that the path is one of the most called-for improvements by residents to Mijas Costa, following the success of the path running from La Cala towards Calahonda.

The project is part of a wider scheme, promoted by the Diputación provincial council, to provide a coastal path, or 'Senda Litoral',

along the entire length of the Costa del Sol from Nerja to Manilva.

Maldonado said that Mijas was aiming to be the first municipality on the Costa to finish its part of the walkway.

The national and regional governments will now report back to the town on the project, with councillors hopeful of a quick decision, given

that the relevant authorities were involved while it was being drawn up. Once permission is given, the project can be put out for tender.

Councillor for Infrastructure, José Carlos Martín, added that their aim is to get approval before the end of the year and claim government funding, adding money from council funds as well if needed.

Walkway link built as plans begin to join Malaga and Torremolinos

MALAGA. Malaga city hall is in the process of finishing a temporary wooden boardwalk which runs nearly 1.5 kilometres along the beach between Guadalmar and Los Alamos, near the Parador hotel and golf course.

It aims to make access to the area easier for sunbathers and other beach users. This is a temporary measure while the Diputación, the provincial council, draws up plans for a permanent path along this stretch as part of its 'Senda Litoral' coastal walkway project.

Axarquía villages hit by nighttime earthquake

(Granada).

It wasn't felt by residents in the local area as it occurred 55 kilometres below ground, scientists said. It is normal for this area to experience earth tremors between 50 and 70 kilometres below ground level. No emergency calls were received afterwards and villagers woke up on Wednesday morning oblivious to what had happened.

MAKING A MEAL OF IT

If Article 50's triggering meant "Now We're Cooking!" then the menu certainly isn't a smorgasbord. While the exit deal will be complicated, it will use more basic ingredients than everything that's been stirring in the UK political cauldron. It is supposed to do no more than fill the gaps left by giving up the treaties on financial, legal, territorial and institutional obligations.

There will need to be arrangements in a number of areas including Pan-European projects; international commitments; commercial contracts under EU law; pending European court cases; UK's Cyprus base, Gibraltar and Northern Ireland; Britain's EU officials, MEPs and court judges; and regulatory bodies, which alone provide much for the UK to digest.

As advertised, the first serving is citizens' rights and the only item to really fight over, the budget settlement (the final bill). Trade will come later because, as my Nan always said, "You can't have pudding if you don't eat your greens."

Also, trade will be separate because such deals are for non-EU countries, come under a different treaty basis and are agreed unanimously, unlike Article 50's majority vote.

The complexity, including UK ambitions and WTO processes, always meant that instead of completion in 2019 this will be one of several later deals bridged by some transitional arrangements. These could include foreign policy/security cooperation, and shared markets for energy, transport etc.

The Article 50 withdrawal agreement won't set out the future UK-EU relationship,

though it will be guided by a "framework" for that. Even so, allowing time for voting on the final deal, they have under 12 months of actual working days to prepare it after the EU agrees objectives (expected in May), not counting holidays and weekends.

This all means three possible dishes: an exit deal only; an exit deal plus an accord on key future partnership issues; or no deal. The first is possible and the second challenging. The UK government admitted that it has done no impact assessment on the third even though it would be messy, leaving people and businesses with just legal crumbs to use if court cases arise. Inevitably the UK needs some deal or else much of what follows, including trade, will be put at risk.

Having set the timer the UK is in the pressure cooker. It needs to manage the British public's expectations, as well as all EU 27 cooks (who are actually head chefs) and mainly, the Westminster parliament, which must authorise the UK's EU withdrawal. The exit deal will also require some separate bills, besides the Great Repeal Bill (on which a white paper was published 30 March, giving us - and lawyers - more to chew on).

Therefore, the government should heed the old cookery adage: "First catch your hare." In other words, plan to deliver with only what you've got to use. Hopefully, the EU comes to the table united around the same approach, or it'll be thin gruel all round.

European Council draft Brexit guidelines come as a shock to the UK and Gibraltar

The EC said that after Brexit, Spain must have a say in whether agreements with the UK should apply to Gibraltar

GIBRALTAR. For many who voted for Brexit in last year's EU referendum, Wednesday 29 March was a long-awaited day of celebration. Triggering Article 50 was like firing a party gun and releasing colourful streamers to add to the fun and festivities. A few days later, however, those festive strips of paper were limp and tangled and some of the British media even began talking about sending warships to Spain, after the content of the European Council's draft guidelines for the Brexit negotiations became known.

Clause 22

The draft guidelines were issued on Friday 31 March. They took a firm line, and made it clear that the EU

"will act as one" in negotiations over Britain's withdrawal, but will be "constructive throughout". They reiterated the EU's wish to have the United Kingdom as a close partner in the future. However, Clause 22 appeared to come as a shock to both the UK and Gibraltar:

"After the United Kingdom leaves the Union, no agreement between the EU and the United Kingdom may apply to the territory of Gibraltar without the agreement between the Kingdom of Spain and the United Kingdom," it stated.

Like the other member countries of the EU, Spain will have an automatic veto over any of the UK's Brexit negotiations, but the wording of this clause appears to mean that Gibraltar could be excluded from future trade agreements between the UK and EU. Its inclusion, however, is important for several other reasons:

Firstly, it appears to acknowledge that Spain has a claim to Gibraltar, which it ceded in perpetuity to Britain over 300 years ago; secondly, it indicates that bilateral discussions

between the UK and Spain would be in order. This is something upon which Spain has been insisting in the past, refusing to take part in trilateral talks in which Gibraltar was involved; thirdly, it places Gibraltar as a bargaining chip in the Brexit negotiations.

"Disgraceful attempt"

A statement issued by the Gibraltar government on Friday afternoon said that "Gibraltar has shamefully been singled out [...] for unfavourable treatment by the Council, at the behest of Spain," and quoted chief minister Fabian Picardo as saying "This is a disgraceful attempt by Spain to manipulate the European Council for its own, narrow, political interests. Brexit is already complicated enough without Spain trying to complicate it further."

Amid general belief that the British prime minister appeared to have forgotten about Gibraltar in her Brexit negotiations, Picardo appeared on the BBC's Andrew Marr show on Sunday, where he stressed to interviewer Eddie Mair that these were only draft

guidelines, and that they did not mention sovereignty over Gibraltar.

He insisted that Gibraltar is fully involved in the discussions about Brexit, and said it wasn't important that Theresa May hadn't mentioned it in her letter to European Council president Donald Tusk because Gibraltar is referred to "tangentially" in the Brexit White Paper.

The UK's defence secretary, Michael Fallon, confirmed this when he appeared later on the same show, saying that Gibraltar was referenced eight times in the White Paper. Picardo also said that any trade deals etc. agreed between the EU and the UK should automatically apply to Gibraltar.

Media explosion

By then, however, some of the British media had begun to accuse Spain of using the Brexit negotiations to make a "land grab" for Gibraltar, and matters came to a head when former Conservative Party leader Michael Howard suggested to Sky News on Sunday that Theresa May would be prepared to go to war to protect Gibraltar in the same way that Marga-

ret Thatcher did over the Falklands.

Social media exploded, with heated arguments between people who thought it would be best for Gibraltar to accept Spain's joint or sole sovereignty in order to remain in the EU and others who urged the British government to take military action against Spain to stop it "getting its hands" on the British Overseas Territory.

Such was the hostility expressed towards Spain by some elements of the UK media over the weekend, that on Monday Spanish foreign minister Alfonso Dastis said that some in the UK were losing their cool over Gibraltar unnecessarily, and that the Spanish government was "surprised" by the tone of some of the comments. However, with regard to Clause 22 of the draft EC guidelines, he insisted that as the EU is negotiating Brexit as a bloc, it is obliged to support Spain and not the UK's position with regard to Gibraltar.

Further disappointment

In general, politicians in the UK and Gibraltar are keeping calm. Fabian Picardo says he has received reassur-

ance from Theresa May and Boris Johnson that the British government continues to support Gibraltar and that it will continue to be fully involved in the Brexit negotiations. On Wednesday, Britain's minister for Brexit, David Davis, told the chief minister that the UK would not enter into any deals which did not include Gibraltar.

It had been hoped that Clause 22 could be dropped from the draft guidelines, but there was further disappointment on Wednesday when the European Parliament voted to approve the EU's negotiating parameters without any amendments.

Although 209 MEPs supported the inclusion of a reference to Gibraltar, 440 voted against as part of a pact not to allow any amendments to be tabled, something which deputy chief minister Dr Joseph Garcia described as unfortunate.

"The government (of Gibraltar) is very grateful to the 209 MEPs who defied this intense pressure and decided to vote to include Gibraltar anyway and to the Office in Brussels for their work," he said.

New security checks could mean long border delays

GIBRALTAR New EU security controls are to be implemented at Schengen borders with effect from Friday 7 April and as a result it is possible that there will be delays for pedestrians and motorists entering and leaving Gibraltar.

In fact, there were queues of over

two hours to leave the Rock and cross into Spain from Wednesday afternoon until late that night, despite the fact that the new controls had not yet officially been implemented. No explanation has been given for the delays, which brought traffic on the Rock to a standstill.

As the UK is not part of the

Schengen Agreement, Gibraltar does not have to introduce any further controls but Spain is obliged to do so. This means that from today onwards Spanish officials will have to check all identity documents against national and EU data bases. Although the checks take very little time to carry out, the sheer numbers of people who cross the border between Spain and Gibraltar each day is raising fears of long delays for pedestrians and motorists, although the Spanish authorities have said they will assign extra personnel to the border to prevent this.

Artificial nests installed to attract ospreys

By D. B. Gibraltar's Environment Department has begun installing artificial nests in the Nature Reserve, hoping to attract ospreys back to the Rock. These birds, also known as 'fish eagles', used to nest on the steep east side cliffs until the 1930s. Their overall numbers began to decline throughout western Europe due to egg collecting, hunting and habitat destruction, and in Gibraltar it is likely that quarrying and military activity during WW2 contributed to their disappearance. They do migrate across the Straits and it is hoped the nests will entice them to stay.

Bar licences extended despite "pantomime"

Councillors and residents show "indignation" over bullfight

VÉLEZ-MÁLAGA. Izquierda Unida (United Left) councillors at Vélez-Málaga Town Hall have strongly opposed plans by the mayor, Jose Antonio Ferrer (PSOE), to bring back bullfighting to the town. NERJA. The 18th Nerja Residents' Day took place on Plaza de España on Sunday. Thirty-four stalls represented the large number of associations, companies and other organisations that are formed by, or work with, foreigners in the town.

There were music and dance performances and the American International Club presented a donation of 2,000 euros to the Almuñécar Asociación de Alcohólicos Rehabilitados, 2,000 euros to Cruz Roja and 500 euros to Solidaria de Alimentos which runs the food bank in Nerja.

A spokesperson from the Nerja foodbank organisation said, "The British have a great tradition of raising money and we have been the recipients of donations from many organisations throughout the years."

More than 2,500 people attended the event that aims to demonstrate how the different nationalities that make up Nerja's approximately 21,000-strong population live and collaborate together. Of that number, 5,970 people registered on the town hall 'padrón' are not Spanish, 2,173 being from the UK.

Brexit

However, not even the glorious sunshine and light-hearted festive atmosphere could quell concerns over Brexit among the Brits, with

last Wednesday's official triggering of Article 50 still fresh in many people's minds.

"There are a lot of interests at stake for things to change radically and we trust that everything will remain as normal after Brexit," 72-year-old Anthony I. Foster, who has lived in Nerja since 1981 told SUR.

The Axarquía association of international interpreters who work at the local health centres confirmed the concerns of many patients over the future of healthcare. "If we leave the EU, what is going to happen to our European health cards?" the president, Christopher Cluderay, asked.

Representatives from SUR were also at the event, distributing copies of SUR in English as well as this newspaper's Spanish, German and Russian sister publications.

'Falcons at the ready' - Malaga airport's bird patrols gear up to protect flights in high season

The airport's wildlife committee has met to discuss safety measures to prevent a buildup of birds interfering with planes

MALAGA. The group of falcons at Malaga airport, used to keep other birds from interfering in the take-off and landing of planes, is gearing up for high season. Birds on or near the runway or approach routes can pose a risk to flights.

The falcons were just one of the measures to control the movement of birds in the area which were explained in a recent meeting held by the airport's wildlife committee. The amount of flights a day at the airport is due to rise significantly in the coming weeks as the summer season starts.

The wildlife committee consists of representatives from the local councils of Malaga, Alhaurin de la Torre, Torremolinos and Cártama, among others. Representatives from the provincial government and the department of the environment of the Junta de Andalucía were also present at the meeting.

These were joined by members

of Aena, the airport authority, and the UK's Civil Aviation Authority.

Problems such as how to stop unauthorised landfill sites, which could attract flocks of birds, in the Guadalhorce valley area surrounding the airport were also discussed.

The committee also recognised the need to focus their efforts on

identifying and controlling the amount of unauthorised pigeon coups and removing ponds, pools and other types of surface water which could attract the attention of birds.

They also cited Malaga's geographical location as a migration route between Europe and Africa,

the favourable weather conditions in the area and the food available to the birds as reasons why there is a strong presence of birds in the Guadalhorce valley.

The committee agreed to carry out several studies to improve knowledge of the population of birds, the typology of the species present and their movements throughout the valley.

The Aena airport authority emphasised the importance of working together with local government in reducing the number of birds "that could pose a danger to air transport, which is of vital socio-economic importance to the region."

The airport has been working on this issue for thirty years, using falconers who are part of the wildlife control service and responsible for the training of several falcons that provide a 24-hour service.

The falconers train the birds of prey to fly around different parts of the airport at various times of the day to make it clear to other birds that this is a zone that they control.

The meeting comes as high season starts, during which planes will fly to 126 different destinations with 15.5 million seats available.

Norwegian Airlines offers three new routes to keep pace with competitors

MALAGA. Low-cost airline, Norwegian, will start three new routes from Malaga airport next month as well as increasing their onboard capacity by just over 20 per cent for the summer period, adding nearly 230,000 extra seats for passengers in total.

The airline will now fly to the German cities of Düsseldorf and Hanover as well as Rome Fiumicino airport in Italy.

One of the new routes involves the use of the Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner, the largest aeroplane using Malaga airport, with capacity for 344 passengers.

Altogether, the company will be offering 23 routes to and from Malaga this summer, three more than last year, with five Norwegian and German destinations and four UK airports included.

Other companies have also increased the number of flights from Malaga, with Ryanair now running flights to Amsterdam and Frankfurt, while Jet2 have increased their links with UK airports with flights now landing at Birmingham and London Stansted Airport.

A passionate reason to grow a beard

El Paso often attracts foreign residents to take part and this year is no exception

RIOGORDO. El Paso, Riogordo's famous Passion Play, has been performed at Easter in the town since 1951. It is as popular with tourists as it is with locals, regularly attracting around 10,000 people.

The event has been designated by the provincial government as a festival of special tourist interest, having been given the 'Medalla de Oro' (gold medal), among other awards. It has also been ranked among the top 90 Passion Plays in Europe and it has even been taken to 'Europassion', a European-wide conference of Passion Play organisers.

The play, which covers the life of Jesus Christ as an adult and focuses on his arrest and death, is performed in the open air on the side of a hill which is known in Riogordo as El Calvario and has a permanent, hand-painted and lovingly-crafted theatrical set.

Getting involved

Each year, among the 500-strong cast of the Passion Play (El Paso), a handful of expatriates get involved too. Their reason for doing so is generally to, "become more

integrated," in the life of the village, or at least so say Richard Weale and Stephen Bishop.

The two men, both originally from England, have recently retired to Riogordo and have been growing their hair and beards in preparation for this year's El Paso, which will take place on 14 and 15 April.

"I'm normally cropped and

clean-shaven," says Stephen Bishop, 63, a former transport planner from Worcestershire. Stephen adds laughing; "to be honest I'll be glad to get rid of it." While Richard says that, although he's never had a full beard before, he'll "wait for feedback," before he decides to shave it all off after Easter.

He and Richard, along with Richard's partner, Carole, 56, have

been told that they will play villagers. "I think there is a long waiting list to get a bigger part," jokes Richard, 57, who volunteers for the Red Cross here in Spain and is learning Spanish.

"We bought a house here in 2003 but only recently started living here permanently," he says. "We have seen El Paso a number of times but this is the first year we have been here at the right time for the rehearsals."

Stephen and his wife, Caroline, are also relative newcomers to Ri-

ogordo and have a base in the UK as Caroline is still working.

Plans to stay

The pair plan to stay in the village permanently once Caroline retires within the next year or so. "We love it here," admits Caroline who is defiant that Brexit has not put them off making the decision to move. "Nobody knows what is going to happen and decisions won't be taken for another two years. For us, we don't want to waste those two years. It's no good worrying," she says.

For now the focus is on rehearsals and hair-growing for El Paso. Rehearsals start this week and, as the new cast members say, they are looking forward to taking part in the, "biggest annual event in Riogordo."

Hotel Incosol set to reopen after purchase by Banco Sabadell subsidiary HI Partners

The Marbella hotel, closed since 2012 after its owners went into administration, will now have its facilities rebuilt to revive the iconic brand

MARBELLA. Hotel Incosol, a feature of Marbella since 1973, is set to be relaunched after it was bought by HI Partners. The company is a subsidiary of the Banco Sabadell banking group.


The hotel was a pioneer in health tourism before it was forced to close in 2012 after Grupo Jale, which owned and managed the property at

the time, went into administration.

After several failed attempts to buy the hotel, largely due to problems stemming from the ongoing bankruptcy proceedings, HI Partners finally acquired the emblematic building last December for around 20 million euros.

Work has now begun on renovating the facilities, although it has been acknowledged that it will be a long process given that most of the rooms and equipment in the hotel have been unused for around five years.

HI Partners have also taken official, legal steps to inform the 170 workers who lost their jobs during the bankruptcy in 2012 that it will be reopened, although this may not be for some time.

Ilunion takes control of four-star Hotel Hacienda Puerta del Sol in Mijas

MIJAS. The hotel chain Ilunion has acquired its third establishment in the province after it was confirmed that it has taken control of the Hotel Hacienda Puerta del Sol.

The hotel chain, which now runs 26 hotels in the country, will rename the hotel the Ilunion Hacienda del Sol, but it will remain a four-star hotel. The move involves the rental management of the hotel by Ilunion, and it will be open all year round.

The chain's other hotels in the province include one in Malaga city and one in Fuengirola.

This particular hotel consists of 136 rooms and its facilities include open air and heated swimming pools, outside gardens, saunas, tennis courts, minigolf and a children's play area. All of the 29 members of staff will keep their jobs under the new owners, although it is unknown whether there are any plans to increase the number of workers at the hotel.

Lane closures on A-357 aim to reduce Parque Tecnológico bottleneck chaos

The measure has been welcomed by drivers used to long delays, but more investment, such as the extension of the local train service, is called for

MALAGA. So far the relief measures started this week to take pressure off the routes leaving Malaga's Parque Tecnológico appear to be working. The A-7056 road leaving the high-tech complex regularly used to fill up during evening rush hours and cause delays on the A-357 motorway from Malaga to Cártama as well.

From now on, every day during the evening rush hour, Guardia Civil officers will reduce the A-357 motorway heading to Malaga from two to

one lane where traffic from the A-7056 filters in. This allows cars joining the motorway from the park to filter in continuously along the spare lane. Previously, traffic entering from the A-7056 had to come to a virtual stop before joining the A-357, creating holdups on both roads.

The lane restriction will take effect from Monday to Thursday between 5pm and 8pm. On Fridays, as many companies finish at 3pm, there will be no special control.

Motorists have given a cautious welcome to the move that helps reduce a daily delay for the some fifteen thousand workers when they head home. Over 600 companies are based on the technology campus, located in open countryside some ten kilometres west of Malaga city.

"It's true that the traffic is much more fluid. Of all the measures they have tried, this is the one that has

worked the best, but even so you can still spend 15 minutes getting out," said one driver. Others have complained that there are still significant delays on the roundabout at the gate to the park near Campañillas village.

Demands for train link

The head of the Parque Tecnológico, Felipe Romero, praised the move but said it didn't go far enough. "We need more measures like this," he said.

Adrián García, spokesperson for workers' groups in the complex, claimed that, as well as turning the internal exit road into a dual carriageway, the real long-term solution lies in the construction of a local 'Cercanías' rail link from the C-2 Álora line. "The priority has to be the train that's been talked about for years," he explained.

MARCH FOR ANIMAL RIGHTS IN MALAGA

Some two hundred people, many of them with their pets, took to the streets of Malaga last Sunday to demand that the law be toughened to stop domestic animals being abused. The demonstration, organised by the Protectora, Malaga's animal welfare centre, had the support of several other groups. Protesters claimed that animals' rights aren't sufficiently protected but said support for reform was growing.

Police say firm bought property from Mijas council at 15 times below market rate

MIJAS. A Guardia Civil judicial report has claimed that Mijas council sold off property at auction at prices significantly below market rates between 2011 and 2015.

The study puts further pressure on ex-mayor of Mijas, Ángel Nozal, and the municipality's treasurer, who are under investigation for their role in the so-called 'express auction' scandal.

During this period, Mijas was supposedly selling off properties that it had gained control of, after owners did not pay taxes. Allegations suggest that instead of selling them off at real market or even rateable value, officials allowed the property to go quickly at significant discounts, thereby breaking strict rules.

In one case, the report claims that a farm, with a rateable value of over 1.3 million euros, and a real value significantly higher, was given to a company called Inmonautic Alfa Sierra SL for 34,000 euros. In total, nine pieces of real estate were adjudicated to that company with rateable value of almost two million euros for a total of just 130,000 euros, some 15 times less.

Helping residents in five languages

Javier León is the new foreign-department officer at Frigiliana town hall

FRIGILIANA. Javier León is the new foreigners-department officer at Frigiliana town hall. He has been in the job since 1 March this year, after successfully passing the 'oposiciones', or civil service exams in January.

Javier, 48, is already a well-known figure in the town, as he and his wife have lived there since 2012 and own the Axarcá beer company, which has its distribution centre in Frigiliana.

Born in Switzerland to Spanish immigrants, Javier speaks five languages. He puts his multilingualism down to his country of birth. "Switzerland is a mix of languages and cultures. From an early age kids are encouraged to learn the languages spoken in the country and English," he explains.

He adds that children of immigrants in Switzerland must also learn their parents' mother tongue. "It's in case for some reason you have to, or decide to, return to your own country," Javier explains. "Imagine not having any sense of the language or culture if you suddenly have to go back for some reason."

Multilingual

Being able to speak Spanish, English, French, Italian and Portuguese,

Javier is able to help many of the 1,000 foreigners that make up a big part of Frigiliana's 3,000 population. While Britons make up the majority of the foreigners in the local population, there are many other nationalities registered on the 'padrón', or town hall register.

Javier says that the effects of Brexit are already being felt in Frigiliana and he knows of expatriates who are either already trying to sell their properties or are not sure what to do. "Frigiliana is a very small town and the foreign residents know each other. I know that there are people who have decided to leave" he says. "The problem is that there is no information and people can't be in this limbo for long. They need to make decisions."

Information

In fact lack of information is a problem in general for foreigners that move to another country, says Javier and his aim is to make that transition as easy as possible, at least for people who come to Frigiliana. "There is very little information readily available and in other languages," the foreigners' officer says. "People often don't know what they have to do and why things like registering on the 'padrón' are important and what it involves."

Javier describes his new role as, "solving problems for foreigners," and working closely with the other departments in the town hall. Javier is supported by Councillor Carmen Cerezo, who is responsible for foreigners, tourism and culture.

Javier works at the town hall from Monday to Friday, but on Mondays helps out at Frigiliana's health centre as a translator. His current contract is for 12 months, until 28 February 2018. After then it is unclear whether Javier will continue or the job will go to someone else who also passed the oposiciones exams for the job in January.

MALAGA. When Herman and Candelaria Zapp began their journey in Buenos Aires on 25 January 2000 with just 4,000 euros in their pocket, they had planned to travel for just six months, with their final destination being Alaska. They also didn't expect to get very far in their 1928 Graham-Piaggio car which they had bought three months earlier.

However, 17 years later, the Zapps have notched up more than 300,000 thousand miles on the clock and conceived four children along the way. Last week the family added Malaga to their lengthy list of visited destinations.

Herman and Candelaria, and their children, Pampa, Tehue, Paloma and Wallaby, first arrived in the province last Wednesday, where they were hosted by friends in Coin. The following day they visited the city's car museum, (Museo Automovilístico), after discovering the museum also had a Graham-Piaggio from a different year.

The museum's staff were thrilled to have the Zapps there. After photos with the assistants, the family

gave a talk on how they have survived on the road all these years, describing their car as "a tiny home with a huge garden."

Painting pays for epic trip

Herman added that it was thanks to his wife, who has painted

and sold canvases along the way to fund the journey, that the family have been able to reach their target of 70 countries. It was revealed that Candelaria had never previously tried to sell any of her paintings before travelling, but when the couple found themselves

struggling for money in Ecuador, with not even enough funds to fly home, they had no choice but to get creative in order to survive.

The family then signed copies of their hugely successful book, 'Atrapa un sueño', (Catch a Dream), which is already on its eighth edi-

tion, and has also been a huge help in covering the costs of the adventure.

The Zapps are currently travelling around Europe in what is supposedly the final stages of their 17-year trip, before they return home to begin a new adventure.

Children on the way

Herman and Candelaria began their adventure just after they married in 2000, and rather than waiting until they returned home, they had their four children during their epic journey.

Each of the children was named after the place in which they were born. Pampa was born in North California in June 2002, Tehue in Buenos Aires in March 2005, Paloma in Vancouver in November 2007 and Wallaby in Australia in March 2009.

Despite the fact the children have never attended school, they have still received an education and have been examined via an Argentinian online long-distance-learning programme. In fact, Pampa, the eldest, explained that travelling has been the best way to learn about geography, having visited the Himalayas, North Cape in Norway, and the Atacama desert in Chile.

After their trip to Malaga, the children will tour the rest of Spain with their parents, including the Canary Islands. They will then move on to the rest of Europe, before finally heading back to Buenos Aires.



Youth held after three die in cave-fire tragedy

The victims, aged 12, 14 and 21 years, were allegedly trapped in the popular teenage hillside haunt in Almería by a burning sofa at the door

ALMERÍA. The neighbourhood of Los Angeles in Almería was in mourning this week after three young people, aged 12, 14 and 21 years, died trapped by fire in a cave.

The cave, a popular place for teen-

agers to meet, was only three metres deep. Local residents were alerted to the unfolding tragedy when flames were seen shooting from the hillside and an explosion was heard at about 8pm on Monday evening.

Although the exact cause of the fire was still unclear this week, local speculation suggested that a sofa had been ignited at the entrance to the small cavern, preventing the victims from escaping.

Police are investigating four underage youths, and a 17-year-old man is still under arrest as possible instigator of the fire.

ROYAL VISIT TO PICASSO'S GUERNICA

Former King and Queen of Spain, Juan Carlos and Sofia, opened the exhibition marking the 80th anniversary of Pablo Picasso's iconic Guernica on Tuesday. The huge but fragile work, which has been at Madrid's Reina Sofia museum for exactly 25 years, was painted after the bombing of the Basque town of Guernica in the Spanish Civil War. The special exhibition also includes 180 of Picasso's other works.

Regional head of Murcia finally steps down after pressure over investigation

MURCIA. The president of the Murcia region, Pedro Antonio Sánchez, stepped down from his role on Wednesday after a month and a half of pressure. Sánchez, who is also leader of the Partido Popular in Murcia, had faced growing pressure after formal investigations began into his role in an alleged corruption scandal in the town of Puerto Lumbreras, where he was once mayor. Investigators want to know what happened to six million euros of investment money for the town's new auditorium, a building that was never finished.

Despite Sánchez protesting his innocence and enjoying the continued support of his party, it seems that the final straw came this week when it became clear that the local Ciudadanos party would probably support opposition PSOE and Podemos parties in a vote of no confidence in Sánchez in the regional parliament.

Yesterday, anti-corruption investigators added an extra possible offence to the four already on the table.

Mariano Rajoy has finally presented 2017's budget, over half a year late. The political deadlock of 2016 is largely responsible for this delay, as is the fact that Rajoy now only commands a minority government. As a reflection of the prime minister's compromised position, this year's budget is his least controversial to date: nowhere to be seen are the austerity measures that made Rajoy so unpopular throughout his first term and that many feared EU pressure would render necessary again. But the veteran Popular Party leader still has some way to go before he can consider the 2017 budget a done deal.

The belated 2017 spending plan shows that the PP is being positively influenced by its dependence on other parties' votes for passing legislation. Rajoy and Spanish

budget minister Cristóbal Montoro knew, for example, that further austerity measures would never gain approval in parliament - not even with centrist Ciudadanos, the party's closest ally.

Rajoy has also been under considerable pressure to increase welfare spending. The signs are that he's been listening to his many critics - although probably now only because he has no choice but to. He has promised to channel more

funds into helping the unemployed and to fighting child poverty, to lower VAT on theatre and concert tickets (in part reversing a deeply unpopular 2012 increase) and has given civil servants a pay increase of 1%. The latter move will in fact infuriate many Spaniards, even though inflation of about 1.5% will effectively wipe out the raise: civil servants have some of the cushiest, best-paid jobs in the country.

Rajoy's real Everest is Spain's un-

employment problem. His PP government has been creating jobs at its promised rate of about 500,000 a year over the last few years; but because the majority of these are temporary contracts, some just for a day's work, they're hardly worth the paper they're written on.

What's changed this year? Rajoy has reiterated his promise to create a further half a million employment contracts in 2017, but has announced that 250,000 permanent positions will be given to employees in the public sector. He's also pledged a further 8,000 jobs in the police force and in teaching. According to the Ministry of Economy, the aim in 2017 is to get unemployment down to its lowest level since 2008. For such a target to be hit, though, the long term unemployed need to be helped back to work, and exactly how the PP

plans to do that remains vague, as does the amount of extra money they are prepared to set aside for it.

Although no explicit austerity measures feature in the new budget, Rajoy is still under considerable pressure from Brussels to reduce Spain's deficit to 3.1% of GDP this year, down from 4.5% last year. As a result, the PP will not increase overall public spending throughout 2017 - a fact that his leftist opponents are likely to seize upon in the forthcoming weeks, as the proposed budget undergoes parliamentary tweaks and votes.

Indeed, it is Rajoy's enemies in the parliament who pose the biggest obstacle to his passing of legislation, not the EU. Despite his 2017 budget being closer to what his opponents want, the PSOE and Podemos immediately stated their intention to vote against it.

Bank of Spain admits real wages may decrease in 2017 due to inflation

MADRID. In economic-forecast data released this week by the Bank of Spain, officials admitted that salaries in Spain this year were unlikely to keep pace with inflation and urged companies not to react to recent higher inflation figures by increasing wages.

Inflation rose to 3 per cent at the start of 2017, however the bank expects this to fall back to an average of 2.2 per cent over the year. If wage settlements are restrained, this should decrease to 1.6 per cent per year by 2019, officials said. The forecast report also increased projections for Spain's economic growth upwards to 2.8 per cent year on year.

Period to complete annual tax return starts with usual fanfare

MADRID. Wednesday this week marked the day from which people in Spain can start to fill in their tax returns for 2016. With a flurry of publicity, the key dates for the tax-form-completion process were announced.

From 5 April, a tax return can be completed online, but if someone prefers to go in person to hand in a declaration, appointments can be made from 11 May. All forms must be completed and submitted by 30 June. Many people with lower incomes or incomes from just one source are exempt from the form as usual. The well-known PADRE computer programme to calculate returns has been retired and the new 'Renta Web' online platform must now be used.

Costa ready to welcome visitors for a week of sunshine and processions

Good weather forecasts over the Easter week look promising for hotels that are expecting 90 per cent room occupancy this year

MALAGA. There's no other time of year when visitors and foreign residents have their eyes opened as much to the pomp and ceremony of religious tradition in Spain than Semana Santa (Holy Week). Across the country finishing touches are being made

to this year's events.

From Palm Sunday through to Easter Sunday traffic through major towns and cities will be cut off to allow the solemn processions to pass through, sometimes up to seven times a day. The pungent aroma of incense and hot wax, the mournful melody of the trumpets and the spectacle of the swaying 'tronos', icons of tearful virgins and hooded brotherhoods are all part of the unique experience that is Semana Santa.

All small towns and villages have scaled-down versions of the bigger processions. However these still man-

age to demonstrate the strong religious convictions that are present throughout Spain but not always on view.

What will be on view, besides the processions, will be the increased security presence over Easter. As Spain is currently on level four alert for a terrorist attack, many towns and cities have had to bring in more officers to work alongside the Local and National Police and civil protection teams to ensure that everything goes smoothly over the Easter period. Marbella alone will have 250 officers on duty to cope with the influx of visitors to the town and is coordinating with taxis and bus companies to ensure minimum disruption. The police are also operating a campaign to monitor cars and their drivers during the processions.

Hotel owners are expecting a good Semana Santa with around 90 per cent room occupancy, up on last year, providing the weather forecast stays sunny. The weather is a big concern not only the hotels, but also for other tourist businesses such as the restaurants and bars. The beach bars along the coast are in preparation for a bumper Easter as is Estepona council which has rushed to top up the sand on the beaches that were eroded in the recent storms.

Mariano Rajoy's government was smug this week after approving its 2017 state budget which it will push through thanks to the inestimable support of Ciudadanos. And it's good news. Does it make sense for someone who makes 600 euros to pay the same contribution every month as someone whose invoices add up to several hundred thousand? Or for them to have to pay income tax in advance?

Or for them to pay VAT on invoices sent out but not paid?


The government's accounts people and many top economists don't like talking about the subject; they even deny it or criminalise the self-employed worker. The truth is, though, the State itself is fuelling the black economy because for so many it is literally impossible to keep afloat with a system that is incapable of applying fair criteria. Today being self-employed is heroic. As simple as that.

Is it so complicated for the 'autónomos' to pay according to their incomes, especially when they are just starting out? Is it so difficult to establish a benefits system for the recruitment of the first employees?

We see millions of public schemes (training, subsidies for large firms, etc.) and imagine the impotence of all those honest 'autónomos' - who are the majority. All those suits in the tax and social security offices, in the government and the Congreso, who watch the world from their comfortable office chairs, ought to pay a visit to the workshops, bakeries, corner shops and greengrocer's; they ought to experience what it's like to go cold calling or do piecemeal. Perhaps then they would understand the indignation at so much disdain and empty discourse from politicians who only remember them when they want to win their votes or steal their wallets.

Antonio Banderas, starting a new, less hectic stage in his life after the "warning" his heart gave him recently, opens the doors of his new penthouse in Malaga

MALAGA. He welcomes us in a white T-shirt and jeans that he designed himself and Balenciaga trainers, sporting a grey beard ("my age, friend, my age") as demanded by the script of a new film. Nicole (Kempel, his Dutch investment consultant girl-

friend) leaves to go to the supermarket. It's four in the afternoon and Antonio Banderas takes a seat in his spacious living room. The actor's new home in Malaga is at the heart of the cultures that gave life and soul to the city: the Phoenician salting vats, the Moorish Alcazaba, the Roman theatre, the Jewish quarter and the Christian cathedral. Above, at the top of the hill is the Gibralfaro castle. The San Juan church tower almost comes through the window. Opposite is Picasso and his museum. Surveys carried out in February revealed that Banderas is the best known living Andalusian in the world today. There's little doubt about it. In his apartment that is one big tribute to the city, Antonio Banderas appears relaxed. Very much so.

-How do you feel after your fright? [Banderas suffered a minor heart attack in January.]

-I feel fine. What all this has started [he points to his heart, a gesture he repeats several times throughout the interview] is a time for reflection. I know why this happened to me. In

the last few years I've been working on adrenaline, and when I slowed down, it hit me like a train... It happened due to an excess of everything, mainly work, because I don't drink. I did smoke, but I don't anymore. If something good has come out of this it's that I've given up smoking just like that, without needing pills or anything. Last year I would say that my natural state was one of fatigue, I couldn't remember what it was like to rest and when I did, my body got scared and my heart said, that's that. Now I have to think about how I'm going to carry on... My life has not been a normal one.

-And how is Antonio Banderas going to carry on?

-Well, I'm still going to work, but at a slower pace. I'm going to give myself some space, take a break between productions, and above all I'm going to take the step I've been wanting to take for some time and put myself behind the camera, write screenplays, and that will take time. Make a film, for example every one or two years. And you can make great films from

Malaga, from Madrid, from Hollywood or from anywhere. I really feel like telling the stories I've lived through, my stories. I think that will calm me down: being able to say, I'm coming to Malaga or to my house in Marbella and spend several months preparing one thing or another. Of course I'll still keep my commitments, but cutting everything down, not going around as I have until now at full throttle.

That will mean a significant change of attitude...

Yes, of course. A big Hollywood agent I worked with for two years once told me: "You know what the most important word is in Hollywood? Well it's 'no' and that's true in life as well." I haven't learned how to say no, and I have to. You want to please everyone, but that's impossible.

-Do you regret anything you've done so far?

-No, not at all. I carry the good and the bad of my life in the sack on my back and that's what's taught me to live as I am; I can't get away from what I am, because I also come from my

mistakes, it's logical. I'm human.

-At a press conference you said you were foolish...

-You see there's a point of foolishness in things I've done in my life. I set my sights on things that made people say "This guy's crazy - he'll never be able to do that." It's a bit like someone who does dangerous sports - even if they know the technique, the truth is they could kill themselves. I jumped off a cliff one night without knowing whether there were rocks or water below. There was water, but...

-The first interview you ever gave was in SUR. Can you remember?

-I remember that interview as if it were yesterday - perfectly in fact. It was just before I left for Madrid.

-You said then, "I must be mad, I'm going to Madrid with nothing, if it works out I'll stay, if not I'll come home."

-It's true. I got together a few pesetas from my relatives and left for Madrid on 3 August 1980, on the Costa del Sol train. I remember it perfectly.

-And did that kid who said goodbye to his parents and friends that day

think that he would go as far as he did?

No, no, I couldn't have imagined it. It would have been crazy. In the late 70s it was inconceivable that a Spanish actor could make films regularly in Hollywood, rather than just a one-off chance, and have a star in Hollywood Boulevard. The American president [Obama] came to visit me because he thought that was essential to convince the Hispanics that they had to vote for him again. All these things are incredible if you look at them from a child's perspective, because I was just a kid, only 19, when I got on that train with 10,000 pesetas in my pocket.

-And when did you decide, and why, to go to the States?

It was an accident.

You couldn't speak any English.

The first time I went to Los Angeles was when [the Almodóvar film] Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown was nominated for an Oscar. The film had been a hit in the States. There was a party organised by Jane Fonda and even the Hollywood actors were expectant to see those crazy Spaniards who were capable of making films so extraordinarily different to theirs. They wanted to meet us and then the companies wanted to interview us to see who was best at English to work in films over there, but I couldn't speak a word.

-When you were offered the part in The Mambo Kings you must have thought you were a fantastic actor to be picked when you couldn't even speak the language.

-No, no. One thing I noticed was that in Spain we are still naïve in the sense that we don't realise the immense strength we have. There was a great impasse in Spanish culture during the dictatorship when we completely lost all faith in ourselves, especially internationally. People like Dalí and Picasso didn't suffer from this complex, for example, because they were self-confident, but that was lost in our country for many years. I discovered the value of being different, of respecting your origins because that was what gave you your individuality. They saw me as exotic. They weren't used to European Latinos. That was an added value.

-What did Melanie Griffith mean for your professional career?

-In my personal life she meant a lot,

but professionally-speaking practically nothing. She still means a lot today. Since this happened [he points to his heart] she calls me every day and we still have a good relationship, and she adores Nicole.

-And Nicole came into your life like a gift?

-Nicole has given me a lot. She's complete and very different from me, as she doesn't come from the movie world. She was like a glass of cool water in the middle of the desert.

-How's Stella del Carmen, your daughter with Melanie?

-Fine, she's studying film.

-Like your nephew Javier - the Banderas saga continues...

-They're both on the same course at the same university, but I think Stella is more interested in directing.

-Does her grandmother, Tippi Hendren, influence her?

-Of course. And her sister Dakota [daughter of Melanie Griffith and Don Johnson]. They both came to London to see me when I had the heart attack. I'm happy that Stella has experienced Malaga since she was a child. I couldn't go with her but my brother Javier took her around all the streets in Semana Santa so she's experienced all the smells, the colours that are so typical.

-Your film festival speech was the announcement of a longed-for homecoming? Am I right?

-There are projects that don't necessarily have to be done elsewhere and others that need to be done in Malaga, such as one related to theatre.

-To direct a theatre here with your name.

-Well, with my name... that's for others to decide.

-When will you come back for good?

-If I have to go and make a film in Rome or London - where I live now - I'll go. This homecoming doesn't have a timeline. If we have to construct [the theatre] it could take two or three years, and that's when I'll think about leaving London, about whether Stella comes here...

-And would Antonio Banderas like to be mayor of Malaga?

-Not at all! (He laughs.) Me? Why? What would I do messed up in that? I don't want public funding for my theatre project. No that's never entered my head.

-And to buy Malaga football club?

-I haven't got enough money for that - I'd like to.

"Together, we can beat cancer"

Luisandro Moreno Cancer campaigner and fundraiser

After his successful bone marrow transplant, Luisandro wants to encourage others to donate

Five years ago, Luisandro Moreno had everything going for him. A professional model and personal trainer, enjoying life in his native Gibraltar with his family, this 31 year old had everything to live for. And then he was diagnosed with leukaemia.

"In January 2012 I had really bad flu. It was the worst flu ever, and I couldn't seem to get over it. I lost weight and was permanently tired, but I thought if I carried on training and forced myself to do things, I'd get better," he says. "Then my stomach started to swell, so I changed my diet. People told me I should see a doctor, but I didn't want to. I was sure I'd be OK eventually," he says.

In June, Luisandro was due to attend a cousin's wedding but that morning he discovered his toes had swollen up like melons so, under pressure from his family, he did go to the doctor. He was immediately put on a plane to the UK for tests. That was the start of a long and painful personal ordeal, one which has made him determined to help others fight cancer.

Luisandro was diagnosed with myeloid leukaemia. "I didn't really know what leukaemia was. It was only when someone told me the hospital I was going to was the best cancer hospital in England, that I realised. I thought: Oh my God, I've got cancer. I'm going to die."

The chemotherapy sessions he needed made him go temporarily blind from blood clots on the eyes; he was in severe pain because his intestines were swollen, his im-

mune system wasn't working and he had to spend four months in isolation because of an infection. He lost 20 kilos in weight. His temperature kept rising, sometimes to 46°. His doctors were really worried about whether he could survive.

"I could feel death around me. I could see my sister, who had died four years earlier. I could see my Dad, who passed away two years before I became ill. The only thing that kept me going was being able to look at photos of my daughters. I refused to leave them without a

father," he says. "I could hear my own dad telling me, 'You're strong, lad. You can't give up.' Many people might have given up the fight, but not Luisandro. He decided he was going to 'beat the beast,' as he describes it.

"Cancer is like a beast standing on top of you, pushing you down and not letting you get up. I cried every day," he says. "I wanted to know why this was happening to me. I had never taken drugs, never been a drinker, never even smoked. Why? And then I thought, I know



why.

God has given me this so I can help others.

So I can give hope to others!" And to do that, he needed to be strong so there, in the hospital, Luisandro went into training. He ran, did press-ups, cycled, and made sure he ate extra food to build up his strength.

He was also overwhelmed by the support he received from people in Gibraltar. "People I didn't even know were praying for me, sending me messages, fundraising; the support was incredible. When you are so ill, it is really important to know that people are on your side. Now that I have beaten cancer, I

want to give something back to them, to the community, and to cancer sufferers everywhere."

Luisandro survived thanks to a bone marrow transplant from his sister, who proved to be 100 per cent compatible. He deeply regrets never having been able to meet Pablo Ráez, the 20-year-old from Marbella who did so much to encourage people to become bone marrow donors, but who lost his own battle against the disease just a few weeks ago.

"What Pablo did was incredible. He was so brave and did so much to raise awareness about how a bone marrow transplant can save lives," says Luisandro. Sadly, Pablo's transplant (from his father) failed. "I intend to carry on where he left off, to try to get one million people to become bone marrow donors. I will continue passing on his message: together, we can beat cancer," he says. Being the fighter that he is,

however, Luisandro Moreno is not content with 'just' campaigning for bone marrow donors. He is also an active supporter and fundraiser for cancer charities.

So, how is Luisandro now? "I go to the UK every month for checkups and treatment. When you have survived five years you are deemed to be normal, but I still have some medical problems from all the chemotherapy. Sometimes, it can be the chemo that kills you, not the cancer. It is really, really strong and the effects are very long-lasting," he says.

The indomitable spirit which helped him through his own ordeal and pledge to carry on Pablo Ráez's legacy is still very much to the fore. Luisandro has a new tattoo on his arm. It shows the date of his bone marrow transplant, 12 June 2013, and a picture of an archangel stepping on the devil. The significance is clear: beating the beast. Luisandro Moreno has beaten his, and now he is determined to do everything in his power to help others beat theirs.

Last week we were talking about the smallest planet in our solar system, this week it is the turn of the biggest planet, Jupiter. Tonight (7 April) Jupiter will be at opposition i.e directly opposite the Sun and therefore at its closest point to the Earth. If you could look down on the solar system the Sun, Earth and Jupiter would be in a direct line with the Earth in the middle. At opposition Jupiter will rise in the east at sunset in the constellation of Virgo, it will be at its highest point in the sky around midnight and will set in the west at sun-

rise. It will be the brightest object in the night sky after the Moon.

Jupiter is the 5th planet out from the Sun and it is huge, you could fit over 1,300 Earths inside Jupiter. But unlike the Earth, Jupiter is nothing more than a huge ball of gases. It has no rocky core so when we talk about seeing details on the 'surface' of Jupiter we are talking about the upper layers of the cloud belts created by the swirling gases as they travel around the planet. The gases form belts of various shades of brown and orange streaking across the planet parallel to the

equator. And because the planet spins so fast on its axis (a day lasts 10 hours) it is flattened at the poles and bulges at the equator, looking like a squashed tangerine.

Jupiter has at least 62 moons circling around it. Four of the moons, Io, Europa, Ganymede and Callisto, are large enough to be seen through binoculars, appearing as tiny 'stars' at the planet's equator. They orbit very quickly and change their positions night by night. It was by observing these moons that prompted Galileo to state that the Earth was not the centre of the solar system

but instead just a planet in orbit around the Sun.

The most mysterious object on Jupiter is of course the Great Red Spot. The GRS is a swirling area of gas located in the Southern belt that has been observed for over 400 years. It is about 3 times bigger than the earth and is thought to be a storm, but why it is red in colour and why it has remained in the same position for all this time is still a mystery.

'Glow of Aurora' glass art visits Fuengirola

The decorative glass exhibition is part of the Finnish 100 anniversary celebrations

FUENGIROLA. An exhibition promoting the best Finnish glass designers of the last century will be on show in the Casa de la Cultura

in Fuengirola in April.

As part of a series of events to commemorate the centenary of Finland's Declaration of Independence, El Resplandor de la Aurora Boreal - the glow of Aurora - consists mostly of the collection of decorative glass belonging to Professor Hannu Vuori.

The exhibition takes its name from the Aurora Borealis, a natural light display predominantly seen in the Arctic and Antarctic regions.

Exhibits include an array of finely crafted vases, bottles and decorative objects, as well as revolutionary Modernist designs.

The intricate patterns and stripes of the glass art is complex and some of the objects contain many strands of multiple colors, creating the effect of a northern lights display.

The exhibition focuses on the great Finnish designers of the twentieth century, but it also introduces other less known designers.

Hannu Vuori began collecting glass as a school boy and the main pieces of the exhibition include designs by celebrated artists like Timo Sarpaneva, Heikki Orvola and Oiva Toikka.

His interest in glass was raised by several postwar pieces of Finnish glass that his parents owned, but his love affair took several years to fully flourish.

As a student during the late 1960s, he was too poor to be able to afford any major acquisitions, but a stroke of luck, or maybe intuition, instigated his lifelong obsession with decorative glass.

On his way home from university one day, Hannu spotted two unusual pieces of glassware in the window of a small souvenir shop. Although they were expensive, he could not resist the temptation.

The pieces he had purchased were the 'Lancet' and the 'Orchid', by renowned Finnish artist, Timo Sarpaneva.

through the roof during the 1990s and the 'Lancet' became one of the most expensive pieces of modern glass ever sold in auction.

An American decoration journal described the 'Orchid' as "The most beautiful object in the world."

By the time of his graduation in 1968, Hannu's glass collection had begun to grow.

The first pieces he collected were of clear glass, but future additions included the new trend of brightly coloured decorative items.

"I grew up with a new generation of artists and they were experimenting, as were the old masters, with new techniques. Most importantly, they introduced colour and humour into their work," Hannu says.

At this time, colour was only just beginning to find its way into art glass and Hannu became obsessed by the works of the leading glass artists.

He could not comprehend how a simple and cheap material like glass could express so much beauty, and this marked the beginning of a lifelong love affair with modern Finnish glass.

"As a young teacher, I began to have a little more money and for-

tunately my work frequently took me to Helsinki. Here they held yearly exhibitions of unique pieces," he explained.

Since 1979, Hannu has lived outside of Finland, so it was difficult to find new pieces. Whenever he returned to Finland he would try to find something new, but it became increasingly difficult.

Exhibitions of unique pieces became rare because of a major change in the glass scene in Finland.

After being hit by the energy crisis, the Finnish glass industry gradually curtailed its role in sponsoring artists and encouraging the production of distinctive pieces.

Hannu's passion for collecting unique Finnish glass did not stop however, for he began searching for works of the old masters like Kaj Franck, Gunnel Nyman and Valto Kokko.

"When the number of pieces began to grow, my late wife began to

complain, but it did not deter me. A collector is usually incurable," Hannu admits.

Hannu's collection began to grow to such an extent that there was simply no space to accommodate it, so when he moved to Spain in 2007, he had an architect design a special glass exhibition area in his home.

El Resplandor de la Aurora Boreal was first displayed in the Museo del Vidrio y Cristal, Malaga's crystal and glass museum, in 2010.

The decorative glass Exhibition will be held in the Casa de Cultura in Fuengirola from Friday 7 until Wednesday 26 April.

Entrance to the exhibition is free and it can be viewed between 9am and 2pm, and from 5pm until 9pm, Monday to Friday.

The Finnish community are currently enjoying a whole year of cultural events under the banner of 'Finland 100 years on the Costa del Sol of Spain'.

Future events include classical music concerts and a Finnish baseball competition.

The sticky hopbush

A woody, evergreen shrub with insignificant flowers but with shiny green or purple foliage and pretty reddish purple winged seed capsules

Dodonaea is a genus of about 70 species in the family Sapindaceae (soap berries). It is found around the world growing in tropical, semi-tropical and temperate regions and one particular species, *D. viscosa* is recognised as one of the world's most widely dispersed transoceanic plants. Depending on the species, *Dodonaea* can grow up to five metres tall and its wood is extremely tough and durable. In New Zealand *D. viscosa* wood is used to make weapons, walking sticks and axe handles etc. Other countries used the slightly sticky leaves medicinally to stimulate lactation in mothers, treat dysentery, skin problems and rheumatism and as sticking plasters.

The largest numbers of species are found in Australasia where its common name, the hopbush, came from early Australian settlers who used *Dodonaea* as a hop substitute in order to brew beer.

Dodonaea grows rapidly and makes an ideal windbreak or hedge.

The species *D. viscosa* 'Purpurea' is particularly attractive as it has red or deep purple leaves. This variety of the hopbush was discovered in the late 1890s by gardener, Mrs Thomas Wilkins, who came across it by accident growing wild near where she lived in New Zealand. It is believed to be a colour-sport that sometimes naturally occurs in the wild. The colour of the leaves is best when grown in full sun although other species will grow in partial shade.

Insignificant greenish flowers appear in spring however they are followed by beautiful red, winged, seed capsules that stay on the plant for weeks. Propagation is by cuttings taken either in spring or summer. Once established *Dodonaea* is drought resistant and can be used

to stabilise soil in areas which suffer from erosion.

Dodonaea was named after Flemish botanist Rembert Dodoens.

Food festivals and tapas routes

Easter is a good opportunity to try some of the specialities which are only eaten at this time of year

Easter is a great time for food in Andalucía, and the perfect opportunity to sample dishes which, because of Lent, do not include meat; many of them contain cod instead. There are many special cakes and pastries which are only available at this time of year as well, and they are perfect to finish off a meal, or enjoy as a snack on their own. They are made with local ingredients, such as almonds.

Typical Easter gastronomy has gained numerous fans in recent years and as well as the religious processions and other traditions which take place during this week, the Andalusian calendar is filled with culinary events such as those which are being held this weekend in Castro del Río in Cordoba; Padul, in Granada; and Olvera in Cadiz.

In some places in Andalucía, the Easter processions begin this weekend and the gastronomic events are organised to coincide with them. For example Cañete de las Torres, in Cordoba province, is celebrating its third 'Ruta de la Tapa Cofrade'. About 15 bars and restaurants are taking part, and will be serving different tapas of traditional dishes which, with a drink, cost just 2.50 euros each.

Exclusive to Easter

Olvera, which is in Cadiz province but very close to the Serranía de Ronda, is also holding its Ruta Cofrade this weekend, offering different seasonal dishes in many of its bars and restaurants.

This is the second year this tapas route has taken place, and once again many of the dishes are based on cod, prepared in different ways. Many of them will be very traditional, but there is also the chance to try some very creative versions, such as cod with onions and raisins; with leek sauce; in carpaccio or brandade inside a piquillo pepper. Traditionalists need not worry, however: the most classic version, cod fritters, has not been forgotten.

Some of Olvera's restaurants and bars in Olvera are also serving main dishes which are only eaten at this time of year, such as spinach with chickpeas, and different types of stew.

For those with a sweet tooth, there is plenty of choice for dessert including 'huevos nevados', rice pudding and 'torrijas' with honey.

A third tapas route of this type is to be found in the town of Padul in Granada province where the Easter

morrow (Saturday) will focus on cod. Its gastronomic event aims to showcase the benefits of combining this fish with the locally-produced extra virgin olive oil.

Events such as these are always popular with Spanish and foreign visitors, and they are not all necessarily associated with Easter food. For example, the village of Alcalá del Valle, which is in Cadiz province but is very close to the boundary with Malaga, is celebrating its Asparagus Fair this weekend.

The fair kicks off today and continues until Sunday to promote a product which is vital for the local economy. The event includes numerous activities to appeal to people of all ages, including free samples of asparagus throughout the weekend. There will also be an artisan food market, where asparagus and other local products will be on sale, live music and sports events. Several conferences about the importance of asparagus will also be taking place over the next few days.

Spring and wine

Meanwhile in Guadix, in Granada province, the 'Primavera y Vino' (Spring and Wine) festival is taking place this weekend, to promote the finest wines from the 'al-tiplano' area of Granada and the Sierra Nevada, together with other products from the region.

All the wines can be purchased and enjoyed with different tapas made with seasonal products. This year, more than half a dozen wineries from the Guadix area will be taking part in the event.

On the other side of Andalucía, Conil de la Frontera (Cadiz), is celebrating its locally produced vegetables this weekend, with its 'Jornadas Gastronómicas de la Huerta'.

This includes a gastronomic route around about 30 bars and restaurants which will be serving tapas made with local produce for the very reasonable price of 1.50 euros.

activities include free samples of pastry and chocolate this evening.

The 'gañotes' of Ubrique

Today, Friday, is also the day when Ubrique, in Cadiz province, pays tribute to its most famous Lenten sweet, which is called 'gañote'. In the town centre this evening there is a competition to decide which version is best, and after the judging the entries can be enjoyed with a cup of hot chocolate.

Although these 'gañotes' are served in several of the establishments in the town, it is traditional for families to eat them at home. That is partly why the competition, which is called 'La Gañotada de Ubrique', has been organised.

Like other sweets in Andalucía, gañotes are made with simple ingredients which are easy to find, such as extra virgin olive oil, flour, egg, cinnamon, lemon and orange peel and aniseed. The mixture made with these is fried in spiral-shaped portions.

In Castro del Río, in Cordoba, to-

I was recently victim of an attempted robbery at knifepoint when I was closing the door of my karate school. The robber was not obviously too clever and chose the wrong victim, since I am a proficient black belt and karate instructor, so I could react and repel the attack quite easily, immobilising the aggressor. However, during

the struggle, I hit the thief several times, and had to dislocate his wrist for him to drop the knife. Now, to my great surprise, the aggressor has reported me for the damages suffered. I am literally dumb-struck. Could I be sentenced, if I was the victim?

In theory, this is a clear case of self-defence. The aggressor tried to rob you, and you reacted to defend yourself, without having roused him. Nevertheless, in order to be free from responsibility, it is necessary to prove that it was impossible to use any other non-violent mean to repel the aggression, and that the defence was proportional to the attack. In this case, I do not see a great problem, and it would be extremely exceptional that a judge sentenced you.

Many years ago I met a beautiful Spanish woman on holiday and married her. Unfortunately she passed away in 2015 after a long illness. After her demise, I moved back to the U.K., but two months later I missed Spain and all our friends so much, that I came back, since I no longer have any relatives or friends in the U.K. I would like to stay here, but with the Brexit uncertainty I want to obtain Spanish nationality. For how long it is necessary to reside in Spain in order to obtain it?

Generally speaking, obtaining Spanish nationality is not usually a simple procedure, as there exist many requirements that have to be met. However, taking into account that you have been married to a Spanish citizen, the terms to obtain nationality are shorter. Widows or widowers of Spanish citizens, as long as they were not legally or de facto separated, need one year to be eligible to obtain the nationality, therefore you can opt automatically for it.

7 APRIL 1614

The death of El Greco

On 7 April 1614, an artist regarded as the precursor of both Expressionism and Cubism died at the age of 73.

El Greco, born in Crete in 1541, was a painter, sculptor and architect of the Spanish Renaissance whose nickname was a reference to his Greek origin.

His dramatic and expressionistic style caused bewilderment among his contemporaries, but it was to find great appreciation in the twentieth century.

El Greco signed many of his most famous works, like the 'Annunciation' and 'The Virgin of the Immaculate Conception', with his birth name of Doménikos Theotokópoulos.

He trained and became a master painter within his field, before travelling to Venice at the age of 26, although three years later, El Greco moved to Rome, where he executed a series of celebrated works.

He moved to Spain in 1570, setting up his workshop in Toledo,

where he received several major commissions.

El Greco immortalized Toledo in one of the most celebrated landscape scenes in Western art – 'View of Toledo'.

Toledo, known as the 'City of the Three Cultures', for having been influenced by the coexistence of Christians, Muslims and Jews, was the religious capital of Spain during this period.

Surviving rental contracts mention El Greco as the tenant of a complex consisting of three apartments comprising of 24 rooms. It was in these apartments, which also served as his workshop, that he spent the rest of his life.

He is said to have lived in considerable style, entertaining visiting artists and aristocracy with lavish parties, employing musicians and dancers to perform while they dined.

It is not known whether he lived with his Spanish female companion, Jerónima de Las Cuevas, the mother of his only son, Jorge

Manuel, who was born in 1578.

Jorge also became an artist and would assist his father for many years, eventually inheriting the workshop after his father died.

At the beginning of the seventeenth century, El Greco was involved in a protracted legal dispute with the authorities of the Hospital of Charity in Illescas.

This, along with other legal disputes, contributed to the economic difficulties he experienced towards

the end of his life.

In 1608, he received his last major commission for the Hospital of Saint John the Baptist in Toledo.

During the course of the execution of this commission, El Greco fell seriously ill and one month later, on 7 April 1614, he died.

He was buried in the Church of Santo Domingo el Antiguo in Toledo.

El Greco was one of the most well

know artists of his time and he set the groundwork for many future art forms that followed.

His expressiveness influenced numerous nineteenth and twentieth century artists and among his admirers were Cézanne, Manet and Picasso.

According to Picasso, several traits of cubism, such as the materialistic rendering of time, have their analogies in El Greco's work.

In the past couple of years, millions of people in Spain have put on their sports shoes and set off to run for at least an hour a day. In fact, the challenge of a marathon is no longer enough for some. Those demanding 42.195 kilometres hardly count for really keen enthusiasts, who have decided to go even further. Really long distances are in fashion.

“An ultra-distance race covers at least 80 kilometres, or it can be run over several days. That is one of the two main differences between ultra-distance and marathons. The other is that ultra-distance races take place outside cities, in mountains, woods or deserts. That makes them harder and more technical, because there are areas where the paths can barely be seen,” says Ryan Sandes, a South African who is one of the best ultra runners in the world and last year

The most extreme form of running

Running more than 80 kilometres in mountains, forests or deserts is common in ultra-distance racing, a sport which is becoming increasingly popular. Ryan Sandes, a world-renowned expert, explains how to cope with its challenges

published Trail Blazer, a book about his life as a distance runner.

So, how can an ordinary person, who isn't an elite athlete by any means, be able to race for six days in temperatures of up to 40 degrees? And how can anyone's legs run 160

kilometres on just one day of a competition, which takes place at more than 2,000 metres above sea level? This challenge may sound exciting to some, but it has to be taken extremely seriously. Anyone who dares to take on an ultra-distance race is

risking their life. This is not a game.

“My book doesn't aim to show people how to win an ultra-marathon. The idea is that people who love running, or who dream of doing something like this, take on the challenge, no matter how complex it may be, but it has to be done with respect and humility,” says Ryan.

His parents divorced, something which was very unusual in his country, when Ryan was just 16 and he had already been diagnosed with a spinal syndrome which made it impossible for him to play rugby, South Africa's number one sport. This made him a rebel. He loved the nightlife and drinking, and took illegal substances. He used to get home in the early hours of the morning, until one day, nine years ago, he sat down, thought hard about what he was doing and decided to take up running. “It's another form of entertainment,

but it's very much healthier,” he says.

In 2008, Ryan Sandes won the Sahara desert race and for him, that was when it all began.

“To tackle an ultra-distance race you have to run for between 13 and 25 hours a week, minimum, depending on the phase of training you're in. Some races are short and high-intensity, and last for about 90 minutes. Others are longer and can take up to eight hours. I also do complete strength and mobility training to keep my body healthy and enable my legs to cope with what they are going to have to do,” he says.

With regard to food, he says it is best not to become a slave to it: “I'm not very strict about my diet. I just try to eat healthily. I don't eat processed products. But you have to be happy with what you're doing, including what you eat. I listen to my body and let it guide me, but always

with no excesses," he explains.

In a race the mind plays an essential role. A run involves hours of effort and you need a great deal of character and a blind faith in yourself not to give up. "There are some really difficult moments when my body tells me to stop, but my mind relieves me of that pressure and I am able to work harder. You have to stay calm during the moments of weakness, and there are always times like that, and you have to be positive. Between one kilometre and the next you can go from feeling invincible to thinking of giving up altogether," he says.


Ryan's techniques

In Trail Blazer Ryan explains in great detail the different techniques for maintaining high physical and emotional energy, and how to overcome nausea, dizziness and dehydration. He also reveals small secrets which

can make all the difference, such as knowing how to urinate without stopping, or using shoes which are a size or two bigger than usual, for when your feet swell. Knowing the terrain in advance, dividing it up in your mind and letting yourself be guided by instinct are other tricks.

"I've been lucky enough to run in the Gobi Desert, the Amazon, Madagascar, Chile, Egypt, Nepal and Hong Kong, and in all those places I have learned something new. I visualise the race day before it starts and in my mind I start to think about the good and bad experiences I am going to have. I also plan the race as a form of mini-challenge. For example, if I have to run 100 kilometres, I think of it as a series of ten-kilo-

metre races. Ten challenges, in which I remind myself that the final 30 per cent of the route will be the time I need the most energy. And the most important thing is that I enjoy each and every metre I run. It doesn't matter what position I'm in, in the race. Winning isn't important. You just have to let yourself go; this is a unique experience."

Once a run is over, it is as important to recover properly as it is to prepare beforehand. "My advice is to forget about doing any sort of training for a couple of weeks, eat a lot and have a good time with family and friends. It is really important to relax. That's the best way to free up your body and mind before you start thinking about the next ultra-distance challenge," he says.

Setting full sail towards personal achievement

Yolanda Preciados returned to Estepona this week to talk about crossing the Atlantic after recovering from cancer of the uterus

ESTEPONA. If just two years ago anyone had told Yolanda Preciados that she would sail across the Atlantic Ocean, she wouldn't have believed them. However last autumn, after several training sessions in Estepona, Yolanda, who was born in Navarra but now lives in Mijas, took part in the Pelayo Challenge, an adventure organised by National Geographic for women who have beaten cancer.

On this occasion, it turned the five selected applicants into sailors, and they crossed the ocean from Te-

nerife to the island of Martinique.

Ten years after Yolanda was diagnosed with cancer of the uterus, she says this had been "the best experience of my life, after having my son". The challenge was to make the crossing in 15 days, and in the end the women did it in 13.

"There were some very intense moments. We laughed a lot, but we cried sometimes as well. It was like a type of astral cleansing," she says.

Earlier this week Yolanda went back to the centre where she had taken her first sailing lessons for this challenge, South Ole Sails in Estepona Port, but this time it was to talk to local sailing enthusiasts about her experience.

"The training was hard but that was because none of us knew anything about anything. The team here had to be really patient with me, especially, because I was awful at it. Bit by bit I started to get the hang of it, but by then we were al-

ready on our way!" she explained.

Yolanda had never changed a sail or taken orders in nautical terms before but finally, under the instruction of Olympic sailors Yago López and Diego Fructuoso, she learned what she needed to know. She said the challenge had also been a type of therapy. "We spent long hours on our own, and I thought about my life during that time, but I made the most of the situation. The hours I spent talking to my companions helped, but even so there were some very intense moments," she explained.

The principal objective of these Pelayo Challenge expeditions is to bring hope. Yolanda explained that by completing the challenge, they were trying to show people with cancer that things can always be better in the future. "We want to show people that today they might

be feeling very bad, but tomorrow they might be climbing the Kilimanjaro [as another five cancer survivors did for the Pelayo challenge in 2015] or sailing the Atlantic," she said.

Separation from her son

Another handicap which Yolanda

had to overcome on this adventure was to be apart from her son and unable to communicate with him for nearly a month. She recalled one day when the crew were having a really bad time, because part of the sails had broken, and their families became very worried about them.

"He was very frightened, and he phoned me. He didn't care how much the call would cost. It was very emotional," she said.

"He asked me why I had to do this, because he was already very proud of me, and that he was worried something awful would happen," said Yolanda.

Her son was there at the meeting, and she was right. Just from the way he looked at his mother as she talked, you could see how proud he is of her. That's another challenge overcome, then.

BYE BYE BAMBI



It is not easy to change people's tastes. How often do we hear, 'I can't get on with stuff like liver and kidneys', or 'Sweet and sour flavours turn me off'? A nation's tastes are even more solidly embedded. Or are they? The British have always been thought of as being very conservative in their eating habits, and anything but experimental. So it comes as a surprise to learn that they are eating twice as much venison as they did a few years ago. Indeed, in a recent survey, 17% had eaten deer meat in the last six months.

Most deer that end up on the table are reared on Scottish farms, although the wild population is also a pool of regular supply. Even so, this is not enough, and with demand increasing 10

per cent annually, Poland, New Zealand and Spain are countries that supply the difference.

But the biggest surprise is that to anyone who ever saw the Disney film 'Bambi' all those years ago the mere idea of eating deer should be repellent. Rather like eating your own dog. Nevertheless, and against all predictions, deer meat is gaining ground over the traditional cuts of beef, lamb and pork. One reason may be the health benefits, as game meat has less fat than other types, in venison's case less than chicken breast without skin.

In Scotland the deer usually end their days in slaughterhouse, or as targets for professional sharpshooters who pick them off on the glens. In America there are so many wild deer that there is no need to breed them on farms. Once the season opens, hundreds of thousands of eager hunters turn out with their muzzle-loaders, bows and arrows, crossbows and modern rifles, to begin the slaughter. More than six million deer die this way every year, with another one and a half million killed on the roads. However much they may have loved little Bambi once upon a time, her film star status has been exchanged for a place on many family's tables.

Easter week begins in traditional fishy style

Vélez-Málaga will be promoting its traditional Easter dish of 'ajobacalao,' or cod with garlic this Saturday

VÉLEZ-MÁLAGA. Ajobacalao is a traditional Vélez-Málaga recipe and is a thick paste made with cod, garlic, extra virgin olive oil, bread and paprika. It is traditionally eaten with bread and washed down with the local sweet wine throughout Holy Week.

The dish used to be given to the men who had carried floats during the lengthy Holy Week processions

through the town, but this tradition has died out over the years. Nowadays, it is common to find ajobacalao being sold in bakeries, greengrocers and other shops selling local products in the area in the lead-up to Easter.

Saturday's event will take place in Plaza San Fernando in the old town from 12pm.

A competition will be held on the day with hopeful contestants competing to make the best ajobacalao, which will be chosen by a panel of judges at the end of the day. Just one prize will be up for grabs and will go to the ajobacalao with the most votes from the judges. Visitors will also have the opportunity to sample the dish.

New York rules in the kitchen

Eleven Madison Park, owned by Daniel Humm, is selected as the best restaurant in the world with the Roca brothers' El Celler in third place

MADRID. The dream of a young Swiss boy came true in Melbourne on Wednesday when the first half of the list of the 100 best restaurants in the world was published.

Daniel Humm's New York restaurant, Eleven Madison Park, headed the list followed by Osteria Francescana in Italy and El Celler de Can Roca in Gerona, Spain.

Spanish restaurants took three of the top ten places in this year's edition of the list published in the 'Restaurant' magazine.

Daniel Humm, (Strengelbach, 1976), is the chef of the moment, a professional with a solid vocation and iron determination which has taken him from a small Swiss town (with less than 5,000 inhabitants) to the Big Apple and the kitchen of Eleven Madison Park. Humm quit school at 14 years of age because he already knew he wanted to be a chef and at 24 he achieved his first Michelin star. In 2006 he arrived at Eleven Madison Park, first as head chef and since 2010, as owner.

Eleven Madison Park has scaled the list to the first place, a position which had been occupied in 2013 and 2015 by El Celler de Can Roca, who received the bronze medal this

time and the consolation prize: the business which treats its clients best.

"We have never been third before. We have been in the top five for nine years," explained Josep Roca, who was left in charge of El Celler while his brothers Joan and Jordi were attending the Australian gala.

Among the top ten are two Spanish restaurants, the Asador Etxebarri (Axpe, Vizcaya), managed by Victor Arguinzoniz in sixth place;

Mugaritz, of Andoni Luis Aduriz, in San Sebastián, ninth place. Lower down the list are: Tickets (Barcelona), owned by Albert Adrià (25th); The Arzak, by Juan Mari Arzak and Elena Arzak (30th), and the Azurmendi (Larrabetzu, Vizcaya) by Eneko Atxa (38th). Another prize-winning Spanish establishment was 'Disfrutar' in Barcelona which took the prize for the restaurant with the best prospects.

The Contemporary Art Centre (CAC) hosts first Spanish exhibition by the critically-acclaimed Scottish painter

MALAGA. The central space of the CAC currently resembles an unusual type of cinema foyer, after the museum installed 166 alternative film posters, painted by illustrious artist Peter Doig, for its newest exhibition, Studiofilmclub.

Each of the paintings at the exhibition, which is being curated by Fernando Francés, was originally created for the film club that the artist established in 2003, which shares its title with that of the exhibition.

The idea behind the film club, which still operates from an old rum


distillery on the island of Trinidad, where he was raised as a child and has returned to live and work as an adult, is to provide Trinidad audiences with the opportunity to see and discuss films that they were not able to access previously. When the film Orfeu Negro was due to be shown, Doig explains that he decided to recycle a painting he had started some time earlier, creating a depiction of a human figure reflected in water, to advertise the screening. From then on, he painted an alternative poster for every film that was screened by the Studiofilmclub.

It appears that all of the posters are based on or have been influenced by the movie they advertise. However, Doig has stated that "it's not that literal", explaining that instead "there's a lot of fiction in my paintings—they are not drawn from my own experience, but more from imaginary spaces and experiences. Being

authentic or realistic has never been an issue for me."

The curator described Doig's work as "a mixture of pop culture and art history," and "a combination of romanticism and sinister appeal."

The exhibition will be on display until 25 June.







However, Joan Plaza's men united for one final push, squeezing the lines and defending for their lives.







MARBELLA. Marbella's Mayor, José Bernal and the town's councillor for Tourism, Javier Porcuna have met with Jo Bergsvand in an attempt to endorse the town's training facilities and encourage professional, foreign footballers to train in Marbella.

The meeting comes after the provincial government of Malaga announced that this winter approximately 4,800 footballers trained and played matches in sports grounds around the province this winter. They revealed that the expenditure of the footballers, in addition to the money spent by the loyal fans that followed them, raised an estimated 6.5 million for the province.

Enrique Pérez, from the Marbella Football Centre, one of the proposed potential training locations, was also in attendance at the meeting.

Javier Porcuna explained that there are already teams that are based in other parts of Spain but are looking to relocate to Marbella on account of its numerous assets such as its climate and wide array of hotels.

Proof of the economic advantages of hosting footballers and their fans also come from Football Impact, who have managed the

majority of the clubs that come to train on the Costa del Sol. The company points out that, collectively, footballers spend up to 46,000 nights in hotels and rented accommodation around the province. The income received from this is then compounded by the thousands of fans that also pay to watch the matches and spend a few days on the coast.

What's next for Ronaldo?

The winger has domineered the game for years but can he last much longer?

Cristiano Ronaldo will still continue to jump out at us from the pages of glossy magazines and grace us with his social media presence but I fear this is the final straight for one of the most dominant footballers on the planet.

For a decade he has been super-human, performing remarkable feats on the football field and astounding us with what can be achieved with dedication, imagination and natural talent.

The stats are still impressive, he will be Real Madrid's leading scorer for the eighth year in a row and he should lead them to their first title in five years, maybe even another Champions League success.

In the summer though he has a big decision to make, does he continue to don the number seven shirt of the Spanish giants or does he spend his autumn years spreading the gospel in one of the developing football nations?

He's still a top class talent but I would argue that his "wow factor" at the very highest level has diminished. His body may be immaculately chiselled and he works on his boyish looks but the fact is that he is 32 years of age and he's played flat out for a decade and a half.

He no longer has the turbo charge, the step-overs are kept in the closet and defenders aren't so terrified when he gets onto the ball these days. He still has presence, he seems to levitate when leaping and his shots fizzle but he is having to reinvent his game to suit his age.

"CR7" is a boyish image, all about exuberance and extravagance, what he won't want to do is reinvent the brand. People will point to the likes of Ryan Giggs and argue that he continued well into his fourth decade but the difference is that he was happy to have a manager pick and choose the games that he starred in, I can't see Cristiano allowing that.

Ronaldo could cite Zlatan Ibrahimovic who continues to shine above all others but his game was never about speed and chicanery.

The contract at Real Madrid runs until 2021 when he will be 36. At that age he will still have his usefulness but let's face it, it's not about usefulness with him, it is all about being the centre of attention.

Crazy salaries have been paid to those willing to head to China and subscribe to their footballing revolution, few have been justified. Cristiano Ronaldo would be worth every penny of the investment as

they would get a superstar concentrating his final few years to an emerging footballing market. David Beckham did it in the USA, Ronaldo could follow him over the Atlantic to the MLS but maybe he deserves his own part of the planet

football to dominate? He's great for the Spanish game, an absolute pleasure to commentate on as you have to prepare for the unexpected, but that unexpected is occurring slightly less these days.

A heady mix of Cohen, Lorca and Andalucía

Keith James describes Andalucía as his "second home" and will be performing a series of four concerts here this month

MALAGA. British poet, music composer and performer Keith James is back in his beloved "second home" of Andalucía to give a series of concerts dedicated to the late Leonard Cohen.

A well-known character already in towns such as Cómpeeta, where he took part in the 2016 Art Walk, Keith will be back on 12 April before going onto perform in Canillas de Albaída, Jete (Granada) and Cajiz.

Keith, 62, has been coming to Andalucía since 2006 when he visited the Alpujarras region to research and study the legacy and poetry of Lorca. More recently he has become part of the artistic scene in the Cómpeeta area, having been introduced by the artist John Barrett who has also studied Lorca and produced a series of paintings based on his poetry.

"I love many aspects of Andalucía. I'm really drawn to the fact that the area is very multicultural, particularly in the art field. Many people from all over Europe have made this

area rich, diverse and very open-minded in many areas of self-expression. It is a relief from much of the closed-mindedness of the UK," says Keith. He confesses, though, that while he likes the sun, "it can be too hot for me across the high summer."

Keith started off his career as a sound technician at the BBC Maida Vale and went on to work for more than a decade as a record producer,

"I love many aspects of Andalucía. I'm drawn to the fact that the area is multicultural, particularly in the art field"

working with many British musicians and writers.

Realising he preferred performing live himself, in 2001 Keith began a UK-wide tour based entirely on his love of the songwriter, Nick Drake. Keith says, "Nick's music had never been heard live by today's music audience as he died in 1974, so these concerts soon became a huge success." Over the last 15 years, Keith has performed in the UK (including Glastonbury), Ireland, Holland, Spain, Italy and France.

Keith's influences include the poetry of Federico García Lorca, Pablo Neruda, Dylan Thomas and the late singer-songwriter, Leonard Cohen.

He says of his choice of the poem, Always, by Neruda: "The prose has such beauty and rhythm; it immediately felt like a song. It is also daringly romantic in a way that perhaps I find it difficult to be within my own writing as I often write in a less direct way with a great deal more metaphor and not in such a bare-hearted way."

Keith is about to release a new album of poetry to music including work by William Blake and Federico García Lorca as well as some of his own work. He is also currently compiling a volume of his own poetry along with what he describes as "some sporadic work on a rather surreal and somewhat comedic novel".

For this tour of Andalucía, Keith will be performing the songs of the late Leonard Cohen. He talks passionately about his great musical heroes, saying that his music "challenges us to listen more carefully, speak more thoughtfully, think more deeply and recognise our own fragility."

The performances will include songs such as; Famous Blue Raincoat, Sisters of Mercy, Suzanne and Hallelujah, as well as songs from the album You Want it Darker released only ten days before the artist's death and produced by his Son, Adam. Poems by Lorca that Keith has set to music will also be included in the sets.
