Terrorists aimed to carry out a bigger massacre in Barcelona

A march against terrorism is planned for this weekend as questions are asked about how to avoid future attacks

After last week's terror attacks in Catalonia events unfolded rapidly, with the authorities trying to piece together a picture of how youngsters from a quiet market town were able to cause such devasta-

tion. An explosion and a car crash ruined the terrorists' plans which had initially been designed to cause much greater loss of life and destruction with massive bombs in tourist areas of Barcelona. **P2&3**

Terrorists had planned much larger-scale attacks in Catalonia

A road accident prevented a vehicle rampage attack through crowds in Cambrils at the same time as the Barcelona massacre

BARCELONA/MADRID. Investigations into the terror attacks that killed 15 and left more than 100 injured in Catalonia last week have revealed that the scenario could have been much worse.

Eight suspected members of the terrorist cell behind the attacks in

Barcelona -where crowds were mown down in the tourist-packed Las Ramblas area- and Cambrils -where six were injured and a woman killed- are dead, while four men were arrested by police and appeared in court for questioning this week.

During the interrogation the court learned that the terrorists had planned

to explode bombs at important tourist spots in the city.

A series of accidents thwarted their plans, however, and the attacks that finally took place were in fact the terrorists' plan C.


The young men suspected of carrying out the attacks had been indoctrinated in just months by an imam

believed to be behind the attacks, Abdelbaki Es Satty, who was based in the town of Ripoll where several of the suspects lived. The group met at an abandoned building in Riudecanyes, where half-burned passports were found on the remains of a bonfire this week.

It was not until after the attack in Barcelona on Thursday last week, however, that police linked an explosion the previous night at a house in Alcanar, in the province of Tarragona, with the terrorists. The house, which the group occupied as squatters, was being used as an explosives laboratory to make the bombs the terrorists were planning to use in what could have been the most horrific

chain of terror attacks in Europe in recent years.

Two people died in the explosion, the imam and Youssef Aalla, while a third man, Mohamed Houli Chemlal, was injured. Houli Chemlal is one of the four survivors who revealed more details of the plans in court.

After the explosion, the group turned to a plan B which involved two simultaneous terror rampages using rented vans in Las Ramblas in Barcelona and on the seafront in Cambrils on Thursday last week.

The first of the vans reached its destination and ploughed into pedestrians killing 13 and injuring many more of numerous nationalities. This van was driven by Younes Abouyaaqoub, who was not tracked down until Monday when, wearing a fake explosive belt, he was shot dead by police.

Accident

The second van, driven by Mohamed Hichamy, was involved in an accident on the AP-7 near Cambrils. Hichamy fled the scene on foot and joined his companions in Riudecanyes.

This led to their third plan. Hichamy and four others, armed with knives and an axe that they had bought in a shop that evening, and wearing fake explosive belts, travelled to Cambrils in an Audi A3. The car's owner, Mohamed Aalla, has since been arrested and released on bail.

Once at the seafront the five drove

into pedestrians and crashed into a police car. They injured six and stabbed one woman causing fatal injuries, before being shot dead by police.

Grief

Thousands of people, headed by King Felipe, came together to express their grief last Friday following the terror attacks. The crowds paid tribute to the victims with a minute's silence followed by two minutes of applause and cries of "No tinc por" - "I'm not afraid" in Catalan.

The demonstration in the Plaza de Catalunya in Barcelona was also

attended by Spain's prime minister Mariano Rajoy, deputy prime minister, Soraya Sáenz de Santamaría, and leaders of the country's main political parties. They stood alongside the president of the Catalanian government, Carles Puigdemont, his ministers and the mayor of Barcelona, Ada Colau.

Similar gatherings took place in Madrid and throughout Spain. A minute's silence was held outside town halls along the Costa del Sol.

Thousands are expected to turn out for a march against terrorism this Saturday in Barcelona.

Costa tourists say terrorism doesn't intimidate them

Visitors said this week that they felt at no extra risk following the recent terrorist attacks in Catalonia

TORREMOLINOS. The recent terrorist attacks in Barcelona and Cambrils last week have outraged the world. The attacks happened during the height of the summer season when thousands of tourists were holidaying in Spain.

Amazingly, just 24 hours later, the people returned to the Las Ramblas boulevard, as if unperturbed by the previous day's atrocities. They were obviously still in shock and disturbed by the whole affair, but they were determined to show the so-called Islamic State that they would not be beaten.

The same attitude could be found on the Costa del Sol, where many visiting tourists said they felt at no extra risk following the latest incidents in Catalonia.

Ashleigh, a former British soldier, was visiting Torremolinos with his wife and two young children for the first time. He claims that the recent attacks, both here and in Britain, have not deterred him at all.

"We can't let it change us"

"The attacks in Manchester brought it to our doorstep, but this is happening all over Europe and we can't let this change the way we live our lives. The only thing we do not consider now is taking a holiday in a Muslim country like Tunisia or Turkey," Ashleigh told SUR in English.

His wife, Zoey, was not quite as confident and she admitted that if

they were due to come to Spain after the attacks had taken place, she would have been a little more worried, although it would not have stopped her from coming.

"You can't let it scare you too much, you cannot just stay indoors, but it is worrying, especially when you have young children," Zoey said.

Mary and Fergus from Cheshire were also defiant in their stand against terrorism and they were adamant they would not let it destroy their holiday.

"We been coming here for many years now and it hasn't changed anything. Of course, you have to be aware of the situation, but you need to do this wherever you are today," Mary explained.

Wary of large events

Peter and Lynn Beasley, from South Wales, were on holiday with their grandchildren in Benalmádena when the terrorists struck last week.

"This has definitely made us more alert and we would think twice about going to a large event that is accessible to vehicles, but it won't stop us coming to Spain, because these attacks can happen anywhere," Peter said.

However, Ana and Diego García, from Cordoba, were quite concerned at the possibility of more attacks on Spanish tourist areas.

"We need to be very careful now, because we do not know where these people are and what they intend to do next. We have not had any attacks recently, but this really brings the problem closer to home," Diego declared.

In general, the tourists on the Costa del Sol seem to be going about their business as usual, determined not to let the terrorists win.

One of the Islamic terrorists who threatened Spain is the son of a Malaga woman



MADRID. Security forces have identified one of the terrorists who appeared in a video praising the Catalonia attacks and threatening Spain as Yassin Ahram Pérez, the son of a Malaga woman. Ahram Pérez speaks Spanish in the video released by the so-called Islamic State, saying that "Al-Andalus will be what it was, land of the Caliphate" and praising the

work of the Barcelona attackers whom he describes as "brothers".

Ahrem, who went to Syria in 2014 at the age of 38, is the son of Tomasa Pérez Mollejas, a woman born in Malaga but who grew up and went to school in Pozoblanco (Cordoba) where her family came from.

She converted to Islam at the age of 19 when she married Abdelah Ahram, who is now believed to be in

prison in Tangier, accused of terrorism. It is thought that Tomasa went to Syria with all her six children in 2014.

Malaga airport's Terminal 2 to be completely remodelled at a cost of 8.4 million euros

MALAGA. Few passengers at Malaga airport can have failed to notice that although Terminals Two and Three are adjacent and their check-in areas share the same space, they are very different in appearance.

The airports company Aena has now announced that T-2, which was built 26 years ago, is to be completely remodelled at a cost of 8.4 million euros, to bring it up to the same standard as its more recent neighbour, T-3, which opened in 2010.

In addition to repainting the whole building, the flooring, false

ceilings, public lavatories, heating and air conditioning systems are to be replaced and the fire detection system is to be modernised.

In the case of the heating and

cooling system, the ten heat pumps and six cold air pumps in the roof area between T-1 and T-2 are almost at the end of their ten-year useable life. As it is becoming increasingly difficult to find replacement parts for them because of their age, they are to be renewed completely.

The state of the public lavatories in T-2 have also been a frequent cause of complaint by passengers, especially in the client satisfaction surveys which are carried out from time to time by the airport author-

ity. Many people complained that they looked 'old and in bad condition'. In the staff lavatories the situation was even worse because of unpleasant smells from badly installed pipes. The plans for the remodelling of the terminal include the addition of windows for the staff lavatories, to improve ventilation.

The contract has now been put out to tender and companies have until 15 September to apply, but the works are expected to take 20 months to complete so the reformed terminal will not be finished until late 2019 or early 2020.


The works will be carried out in stages, and some may be done at night to avoid as much inconvenience to travellers and staff as possible. Aena says it is impossible to close the terminal while the remodelling is taking place because of the number of passengers who use Malaga airport. In July, two million people passed through the airport and 2017 is expected to be another record-breaking year.

In addition to this major investment in T-2, Aena is also to spend four million euros on improving the parking areas, especially those used by car rental companies and airport staff. This should be completed by early 2019.

Diocese says finishing and protecting the cathedral will cost 11.4 million euros

MALAGA. Diocesan officials have drawn up plans to finish Malaga cathedral, the construction of which was never fully completed, remedy existing structural problems and carry out improvements. The plan, which has been presented to the Junta de Andalucía, calculates the cost of these works to be around 11.4 million euros although the final total could be several million more. The document explains which works are needed urgently in order to protect and preserve the historic building.

Boulders put in place after beachgoers ignore no parking signs near protected dunes

Marbella town hall has resorted to installing a physical barrier after drivers continued to park in the protected area near Cabopino beach

MARBELLA. It may seem primitive, but Marbella town hall this Tuesday moved to install large boulders in order to prevent cars from entering a restricted-access area close to the protected Artola dunes at Cabopino, to the east of the resort.

With greater numbers flocking to the beach area during the summer season, the available parking spaces have quickly filled to capacity

and drivers have ignored no parking signs and left their cars in areas reserved only for authorised vehicles.

The ProDunas association, dedicated to the protection of the dunes, has filed three separate complaints to the environmental branch of the Guardia Civil (Seprona) and to Marbella town hall. On Monday they argued that rather than improving, the situation around the dunes had been getting much worse.

A statement said: "They have put up temporary barriers and fences but they are completely insufficient. What we need here is something much more substantial and to start fining those who are knowingly breaking the law."

Following this, the town hall, through its Sustainability depart-

ment, commissioned diggers to move in large boulders, placing them around the perimeter of the restricted area.

While this measure is certainly more substantial, whether it becomes permanent is dependent on its degree of success.

Police have stepped up surveillance in the area in recent months and have

stopped drivers from parking on both the roundabout at the access to Cabop-

ino from the motorway and on the approach road to the car park.

Policing from the skies of Marbella

The local police force will be the first in Spain to use paramotors to tackle crime and help with rescue operations

MARBELLA. Marbella's first paramotor police patrol unit was presented on Wednesday as part of the town's aims to crack down on town planning violations and illegal dumping.

The idea was originally floated last year, however there was initial resistance from Malaga airport bosses over a possible danger to aircraft. These differences have since been cleared up and the Local Police are now able to, in addition to the aforementioned duties, patrol beaches at busy times of year, oversee traffic problems and look for missing people.

These officers will be able to assess situations from between 150 and 300 metres above ground and

participate in rescue operations.

The first in Spain

This unit is the first of its kind in Spain and will be fully operational

at the start of September. It consists of two motors, purchased by the council at the end of June at a cost of 6,500 euros, and two trained pilots.

Ojén starts DNA testing dog dirt to catch offenders

MARBELLA. Ojén town hall has now put into effect the final phase of its battle against dog dirt by initiating DNA testing.

Tests will be carried out at various points around the town to identify and fine the culprits.

"With this measure we aim to

educate residents on the need to pick up after their animals for hygiene and cleanliness reasons," said the town's mayor José Antonio Gómez.

Fines range from 60 euros to 15,000 depending on the severity of the cases and if the owners are repeat offenders.

Marbella introduces IT system to speed up planning permits

The new tool, which means procedures will be paperless, is to be used first to process objections filed against the PGOU adaptation

MARBELLA. The municipal Town Planning Department has introduced a new IT tool that will offer greater access to information for users as well as promising to halve waiting time for planning permission.

The department, currently run by councillor Isabel Pérez, has received numerous complaints about the delays in the approval of building permits and licences.

The annulment of the 2010 PGOU (town development plan) overwhelmed the department with extra work at a time when the con-

struction sector was starting to pick up after the crisis, a situation that the town hall admitted had slowed down procedures.

Pérez explained on Tuesday that the new system would allow users to access "from their own computer all the information about their case permitted by law".

There will be a scanning service available, however, to users who still want to submit in their appli-

cations in paper format.

PGOU modifications

The system will be used first to register objections and questions regarding the initial version of the adaptation of the 1986 PGOU, which the town had to revert to after the 2010 plan was overturned, to comply with the Andalusian planning law known as the LOUA.

This document is due to be published in a matter of days, said the councillor, when a two-month consultation period begins. The information, and means of registering a response to it, will be available online and at the municipal offices.

"All these measures seek transparency and accessibility for residents with regard to planning documents," said Pérez at a press conference that was in all probability her last as head of Planning before the no confidence vote brings in a new mayor next week.

Mayor announces salary rise and new Trapiche project before no confidence vote

MARBELLA. With just days to go before his likely eviction from the mayor's office with the PP's vote of no confidence, Marbella mayor José Bernal has announced a number of measures his team has been working on "so that others [the incoming local government] don't take the credit where it's not due", he said. Several projects have been revealed including a scheme to totally remodel Avenida del Trapiche, the main road through the Miraflores neighbourhood. Bernal urged the new local government to go ahead with the plans, as these have the approval of local residents.

Another measure announced this week by the mayor was that all council workers will receive a one per cent pay rise.

Access to be improved on road connecting Casares to the A-7

The works, which have a budget of more than 600,000 euros, could get under way in November and are expected to last six months

CASARES. The Malaga provincial authority has put improvement works to the MA-8300 road which connects Casares and the A-7 out to tender with a budget of 602,827 euros.

Works to the 140-metre stretch closest to the coastal dual carriage-

way are expected to take six months to complete and look set to get under way in November.

Provincial councillor for Public Works and Infrastructure, Francisco Oblaré, said last Friday: "Because of urban development in this area in recent times there are now various entrances to housing areas which affect traffic flow and compromise road safety."

At present there are three accesses which flow onto the MA-8300 at this point - those going to the Bahía de Casares and Paraiso de la Bahía urbanisations, and another connecting the nearby industrial estate. The construction of a further area of housing is also planned.

New roundabouts

The planned improvements will see the construction of two new roundabouts, one of which will connect to the future development, and making the road two lanes wide in each direction to improve traffic flow and allow for an area for vehicles to change direction.

Plans are also in place for a pedestrian footbridge and stretches of pavement which will help to connect the two existing urbanisations for those on foot.

Horse charity shop moves in Alhaurín

:: **SUR.** The ARCH horse and donkey rescue charity is moving its charity shop to bigger premises. The new shop, due to open on Friday 1 September, is located in the same

street as the previous premises in Alhaurín el Grande, Avenida Gerald Brenan, but 50 metres closer to the Cruz de la Misión roundabout.

Town hall fined for using digger near ruins

:: **M. PÉREZ.** Marbella town hall will have to pay a fine of 4,000 euros after the Culture department sent in a digger to carry out clearing work on a plot of land next to the Vega del Mar Basilica archaeological site in San Pedro in March.

The digger, which entered without permission from the regional authorities, then became stuck and required another vehicle to enter to set it free.

The whole process not only left a huge hole in the ground, but also unearthed several ruins.

New tourist office to open inside bus station

:: **SUR.** A new tourist information centre has been given the green light in Marbella's bus station to welcome visitors to the town.

An agreement has been reached between the town hall and the concession holder of the bus station for the next three years.

Once open, the total number of tourist offices will rise to five. The new centre will complement those already in the town at the La Fontanilla roundabout, at Plaza de los Naranjos, in Puerto Banús and San Pedro Alcántara.

Search for solutions after surge in illegal street vendors in Costa resorts angers other traders

A police report shows that the sale of fake branded goods and other items is an organised network, as legal business owners say local politicians need to do more to stamp it out

COSTA DEL SOL. Owners of shops and market stalls have said they are fed up with the amount of illegal street vendors selling goods, mostly fake branded items, in the Costa's seaside resorts.

Rosa María González, president of the Benalmádena business and traders association, has said that she is receiving daily complaints from members who "have to put up with the sale of fake products right on their doorstep and nobody does anything".

She added that there are some areas, such as the Puerto Deportivo marina in the town, where "it's difficult to walk", referring to the large sheets that the illegal traders spread out on the pavement.

While the presence of people selling goods on the street to tourists is nothing new, this year numbers

have noticeably increased.

The president of the Torremolinos business and traders association, Juan Vallejo, said: "The answer isn't to arrest a few of the vendors a day, as they just return or others appear. We need to find better alternatives."

He recalled that last year at a meeting of the local council and the

sellers, some of whom are illegal immigrants, it was agreed to find a space for them to set up a small market to sell their goods, but, says Vallejo, "The town hall didn't carry out its promise."

Setting up dedicated zones where the illegal traders can operate is one of the solutions put forward to the growing problem. However critics

point out that this would mean the sellers giving up one of their more lucrative sources of income, the sale of copies of luxury branded goods. In addition they would have to register as self-employed and pay social security.

Police overstretched

Police in the coastal resorts claim that they have limited resources to deal effectively with the problem, as the local population doubles during the tourist season and their resources are stretched.

When officers go to make their arrests, they find that vendors flee the scene, either leaving their goods or hiding them on the beaches, making it impossible to link what is being sold to a particular person. They also say that increasingly more of the sellers are officially resident in Spain, making it harder for them to deport offenders, who mostly come from west Africa.

Local Police in Benalmádena have carried out a study of how the groups operate which has uncovered that the sellers are highly organised with lookouts and getaway cars.

The local mayor, Victor Navas, is asking for a change in the law to allow him to recruit more people in summer to address the problem.

HERE AND THERE

August rain forecast across Spain

MALAGA

:: I. L. The Spanish met office says that rain could fall almost anywhere across mainland Spain this weekend and early next week, especially from Sunday. A pocket of cold air at high altitude will bring considerable instability, with heavy showers and storms. Temperatures will also drop significantly. Although forecasters can't be sure, they believe central and southern parts of the country will be wettest on Sunday and into next week.

Mijas to extend main multi-storey car park

MIJAS

:: I. G. Mijas council has put out to tender a contract to draw up a plan to extend the main multi-storey car park in the centre of Mijas Pueblo. The large car park, known as Parking Virgen de la Peña, is heavily used and since the square above was pedestrianised residents are having trouble finding local parking spaces.

Mijas Pueblo has a notorious parking problem and the council has also identified five other pieces of land to convert into car parks.



MALAGA. A traffic accident which occurred in Torremolinos earlier this summer resulted in three more people losing their lives on roads in Malaga province. The total number who have died in accidents of this type in the first half of this year has now risen to 22, something which is causing considerable concern at the General Traffic Department (DGT).

Following the accident, a Guardia Civil officer was held responsible and was arrested after testing positive for alcohol and drug consumption. The authorities want to find a solution to drink/drug driving, and they are also concerned about cyclists: Trinidad Hernández thinks they should have to take a test to make sure they understand traffic laws and are competent on two wheels.

-There have been some very serious traffic accidents so far this year, including the one in June in which three people died. Are things worse than usual this year?

-In 2016 five more people were killed on the roads than in previous years, although there has been an improvement in the figures. I prefer to look

at the statistics at the end of the year, but it is true that so far in 2017 there has been a noticeable increase in fatalities in traffic accidents. Eleven more people have died than at this time last year, and the accident in Torremolinos brought the number to 22. It is also worth pointing out that of all those who have been killed, ten were in motorbike accidents and five were run over.

-What are the main reasons for all these accidents?

-With regard to the motorbikes, there are a great many of them in Malaga province because of the climate. In fact, we have seen that there has been a lot more traffic in general this year. However, people's behaviour behind the wheel also has a great deal to do with it. You only have to look at the figures to see how often alcohol and drugs are a factor in accidents, but reckless behaviour also plays a part, such as driving at excessive speeds. People don't stick to the rules, no matter how many checks we put in force. I dread to think what would happen if we didn't have any checks.

-Talking about alcohol and drugs, how many drivers are caught after consuming them?

-There have been fewer drink-drivers in recent years. Not as many people drive when they have been drinking now. For example, when we carry out specific campaigns, only two per cent of drivers test positive. It still surprises me, though, how many people take drugs and then drive. In 2013 we started to test for drugs whenever an accident occurred, but then a couple of years ago we decided to do that

as a general rule and that is how we discovered the extent of the problem. For example, I remember one campaign when Guardia Civil officers carried out checks at midday on a weekday, and of the 12 tests they did, seven of them were positive.

-Is there a certain social permissiveness about drugs and driving?

-No, I don't think so. I was astounded that the Guardia Civil officer proved positive for cocaine after the accident in Torremolinos. We usually find two different profiles of people who prove positive for drug consumption. One is somebody who habitually uses substances such as marijuana or hashish, and the other is somebody who takes drugs like methamphetamines and cocaine.

-Do you think people are really aware of the danger of driving under the effect of drugs?

-I believe so, because out of the 800,000 drivers who are registered in this province, the number of offenders is minimal. People in general are aware of the problem, but there are still a few who continue to take drugs and drive even when they have lost points or their licences have been withdrawn. That type of person usually reoffends. Although it is a small group, you have to find ways of stopping them, so we are currently considering what to do. Drugs are our main challenge now, and we are investing a great deal of time and resources in checking drivers. Although we obviously can't forget other types of offence, we are leaders in Europe regarding regulations for this type of case and stopping people driving af-

ter consuming drugs.

-There seem to have been an alarming number of cases where cyclists have been hit by drivers who have been drinking or have taken drugs.

-There are a lot of accidents involving cyclists. As I said earlier, there are more cars on the roads now but cycling has also become more popular, not just as a sport but also as a means of transport. That increases the risk.

Drivers on inter-urban roads often fail to give cyclists the obligatory metre and half's distance, and they often drive too fast. Cyclists are very vulnerable. Drivers have to share the roads with them and respect the rules. But that doesn't only apply to someone who is driving a vehicle. Cyclists also have to know and comply with traffic laws. They can't lose points from a licence, because they don't

have one, but they can be fined. I wonder if it would be a good idea to have a specific licence for cyclists, or at least some sort of test to make sure they have the correct knowledge to be able to use urban and inter-urban roads.

-Referring to fines, which ones are the most commonly issued?

-Fines for speeding, because they are a deterrent. That's why the number of people caught speeding has dropped.

-Where are the black spots in Malaga province?

-Those are not being published at present because we are studying the concept of black spots again. Some roads are very dangerous, though, like the one from San Pedro to Ronda, the Campillos road, the Axarquía and the Serranía de Ronda. However, the worst accidents tend to occur on motorways, like the one in Torremolinos, because speeds are much higher and the consequences more serious.

-How are the cameras which detect cars with no ITV or insurance doing? Are many fines being issued?

-Fines aren't always issued, because it is something we deal with in specific campaigns. If we opened that tap we would never stop, because there are so many offenders! A great many cases are being detected, and with these cameras we also control the use of mobile phones and seat belts. At present, though, we are at a stage where we inform drivers that we know about them, but we aren't fining them.

-Which campaigns are being carried out at present?

-Alcohol, drugs and speeding are con-

tinual, but we are currently doing a special campaign about cyclists.

-In summer there are always more traffic jams. Can you identify the reasons for them?

-The worst places are the exit towards the university, the Technology Park and the courts, after the false tunnel at the Carlos Haya hospital, and the exit to Arroyo de la Miel. At Arroyo it is an infrastructure problem, but at the university, for example, the traffic jams happen at certain times of day, mainly in the mornings. In summer there are often delays on the A-7 by the Plaza Mayor shopping centre, and even at Las Pedrizas. There are also incidents where cars overheat and cause big problems. These are all inconvenient for drivers, but are not as serious as accidents.

-As the head of the Traffic Department in Malaga, what are your main concerns?

-Victims of traffic accidents. Together with the head of the Guardia Civil, we monitor every fatal accident which happens and whether they occurred because we did something wrong or because of circumstances. Accidents will always happen but if everybody complied with the rules, the consequences would be minimal. In the accident in Torremolinos, for example, if the passengers in the taxi had been wearing seat belts, things would have been different.

-How many licence points do people in Malaga lose each year?

-From January to May this year 9,437 points have been lost. Most - 6,674 - were for speeding, but 1,410 were for drink driving.

Firefighters put to test with two Costa forest blazes at same time

In all, over 120 fought against the fires in the hills of Benahavís, which was started by a cigarette end, and Mijas, where a burning car was the cause, during a busy week for local crews

COSTA DEL SOL. Firefighting teams on the Costa were put to the test last weekend with two forest fires stretching resources on Sunday afternoon.

In the hills behind Benahavís, Infoca, the specialist forest fire team, were alerted at around midday to a blaze on the hillside alongside the main A-397 road linking San Pedro Alcántara and Ronda.

Emergency teams, including eleven aircraft, 48 forest fire experts and reinforcements from Marbella and Estepona fought the flames, which destroyed 30 hectares and closed the main road for a time.

Nobody was evacuated but the incident was only finally declared as over on Wednesday evening. Investigators say a discarded cigarette end caused the fire.

Meanwhile in Mijas, a car fire

by the side of the road on Sunday afternoon spread to neighbouring scrubland and trees, causing another emergency by the Buena Vista estate in the El Higuero area, near the A-7 motorway.

Thirteen aircraft and 78 firefighters were involved, drawing from Mijas, Benalmádena, Fuenigrola and Torremolinos. By 8pm the blaze was under control.

Smaller fires

Other, smaller rural fires broke out in other parts of Malaga province over the last few days.

On Tuesday a fire started outside Archidona at about 7pm but

the Infoca forest fire experts said that luckily it had only affected scrubland and had not reached the pine trees.

In Benaolán, near Ronda, another vehicle fire was blamed for the spread of flames into the countryside.

Two more cars burst into flames on roads in the area this week, in Villanueva del Trabuco and Nerja, incidents which experts blamed on the high temperatures and possible poor maintenance.

So far this year, fire has destroyed 75,000 hectares of forest and scrubland in Spain, the highest amount in the last five years.

Police warn firms of thieves posing as telecoms workers

:: **ÁLVARO FRÍAS.** Police have warned business owners to be on the lookout for thieves posing as telephone company workers coming to inspect their properties.

Officers have noticed a rise in

crimes where false inspectors visit premises to check out and spy on the type of security arrangements. They say the criminals visit with proper uniforms of the telecoms companies and false identities.

According to the police reports, the visitors then wait about two weeks, the typical time it takes for security cameras to delete images, before returning to burgle the premises.

Man killed by car on A-7 outside Estepona

ESTEPONA

:: **SUR.** A 60-year-old man was killed at about 6am on Wednesday morning while walking along the A-7 motorway in the dark. The accident happened at kilometre 151, just west of Estepona town. It is not known why the man, who was not wearing any reflectors, was on the road. The driver tested negative for alcohol and police said a 40-year-old man, presumed to be also the driver had been treated for shock.

Three arrests over sexual abuse

MALAGA

:: **J.C.** Three suspects have been held over separate alleged incidents of sexual abuse on the Costa over the last week and a half.

A Spanish national was held in a Malaga nightclub while another was detained for touching a victim in a lift in her block of flats, also in Malaga. In Puerto Banús, a 58-year-old Moroccan was held over an alleged incident on board one of the boats moored there.

Lucía's full autopsy supports train-death theory but cannot say if she walked so far alone

MALAGA. The full post mortem on the body of Lucía Vivar has revealed few extra clues about how she died by the railway line between Pizarra and Álora on 27 July.

Three-year-old Lucía had gone missing the previous evening while playing during a family meal at a bar by Pizarra station. After a

huge overnight hunt, her body was found by the tracks the next morning some four kilometres away.

The full autopsy confirmed earlier analysis that the toddler died from a heavy bang to the head, presumably from a part of an early morning train. There were also small wounds on her legs and oil marks, according to the document, but nothing on her hands or face. There was no sign of male DNA either.

Sources close to the investigation believe this supports their theory of how she died, however, if she was able to walk so far alone along the tracks hasn't been proved. CCTV images made public this week show Lucia wandering off from Pizarra station on her own.

18-year-old arrested after beach robberies

TORRE DEL MAR

Police arrested an 18-year-old man in Torre del Mar last Monday following a call from a beachgoer reporting that their belongings had been stolen from the western part of the town's beach.

The man, who is from Úbeda, was intercepted by officers and members of the public who prevented him from cycling along the promenade near the Colonia beach bar, towards Caleta. He was later taken to the town's na-

tional police station.

Objects found inside a rucksack he was carrying included jewellery, four mobile phones, money, car keys, sunglasses and items of clothing.

The man was later identified by a witness who had seen him taking things from people's bags on the beach.

Mayor of Vélez-Málaga, Antonio Moreno Ferrer, praised the police officers' rapid response as well as the early identification of the culprit and said that they had "guaranteed the safety of members of the public" and "returned the stolen belongings" to their rightful owners.

Demolition starts on British couple's Almayate home despite call for help

Vélez-Málaga town hall is complying with a court order that has shattered Gill and Bob Ward's Andalusian retirement dream

VÉLEZ-MÁLAGA. Bulldozers moved in on Monday to start the demolition of the home of a British couple in Almayate, Vélez-Málaga.

Despite the local and international media attention the case has received, the support of SOHA (Save Our Homes Axarquía) and a series of meetings with architects, the mayor and solicitors, the couple have lost their fight against the demolition order.

Gill and Bob Ward, a retired couple from Cornwall, bought the property that was part of an old farmhouse in 2004 and, as it was "a ruin", as Gill told SUR in English in July, they sought planning permission from Vélez-Málaga town hall to rebuild it.

No problem

Some time into the project, the original façade, which had to be retained to comply with the licence, collapsed, or so they were told by the architect, who assured them that it wouldn't be a problem. The

architect subsequently resigned from the project. However, the work was completed and the Wards moved into the property.

A series of court appearances ensued, one of which led to Gill being advised by her solicitor to plead guilty to a criminal offence of "knowingly building illegally without the correct licence", she explained.

Having heard nothing for two

years after presenting a new permit to the court, the couple assumed that all was well and continued to live in the property until they received a letter from Vélez-Málaga town hall on 5 July this year advising them that the house would be demolished on 17 July.

On that occasion the house was

saved by a court order temporarily denying the demolition workers access to the property.

However, it later transpired that the house did not only fail to comply with the building licence but that it was also on "non-urbanisable" land and a further letter was sent from the court saying that if the house wasn't pulled down then the town hall and mayor would face legal action.

Help from SOHA

"The couple were unable to go for AFO and if they had come to us much earlier we may have been able to do more to help," Phillip Smalley, president of SOHA told SUR in English on Tuesday.

AFO refers to "asimilado fuera de ordenación" - a semi-legal status given to some houses built on land not designated for construction.

Smalley added that another house on the same land, belonging to a Spanish citizen, was also pulled down earlier this month.

Gill and Bob are currently staying in a friend's flat in Torre del Mar and looking for somewhere affordable to live. "We don't have a house in England. Our life is here in Spain," the couple told SUR in English in July.

The couple's daughter-in-law, Emma Baker, who lives in Torrox and who has been acting as their spokesperson told SUR this week, "We're going to get in touch with the British Consulate in Spain to see what kind of help they can offer us and if the Spanish justice system hasn't listened to us we will approach the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg."





Over 35,000 visitors expected at twelfth Festival of Three Cultures

ing also included a spectacular firework display on the Plaza del Ingenio. Around 20 minutes of fireworks synchronised to music were watched by thousands of residents and visitors alike. The spectacle was also shown on a giant screen from the Antigua Casa de los Condes de

Frigiliana.

Film showings, conferences, workshops, children's activities, a Medieval market, theatre and live music make up the activities during the four days of the festival.

The famous tapas route is one of the highlights of the festival, with twenty local establishments taking part. Organisers expect that more than 25,000 tapas will be served over the four-day celebration and a T-shirt will be given to those who complete the route.

Two stages - a smaller one located in the Antigua Casa del Aperero, and the main stage on the Plaza de las Tres Culturas - saw a performance by the musician Jorge Pardo who opened the festival on Thursday and Ethnos Atramo and Balkan Paradise Orchestra will perform tonight, Friday. Siria en Mí and Barmer Boys form Saturday's lineup and closing this year's festival will be Spanish singer, Estrella Morente. Around 35,000 people are expected to attend the festival over the four days, exceeding previous records.

Dog found swimming 800 metres from shore by father and son out in their boat



"We're 21st century slaves," say protesting hotel room cleaners

'Las Kellys' of Costa housekeeping claim that hoteliers are deliberately outsourcing jobs to agencies to keep salaries lower than the legal minimum

MALAGA. They go by a curious name but their complaints are se-

rious. Workers responsible for cleaning hotel bedrooms along the Costa del Sol demonstrated in Malaga last weekend against what they say are their poor working conditions.

The staff go by the name 'Kellys Union'; 'kelly' is a common nickname for cleaning staff, after 'que li', a contraction of the Spanish phrase 'los que limpian' (those that clean).

Following a rise in a protest movement nationally, local Costa

staff have got together to draw attention to hoteliers who, they claim, outsource cleaning jobs to agencies and so avoid having to pay a series of benefits and a minimum wage for the sector, as employees are not counted as full hotel staff. "We are 21st century slaves," they say.

The CC OO trade union has said it is going to report 42 hotels along the coast for "illegally" avoiding providing staff with the working conditions they are entitled to.

Mijas on verge of getting back its land at polemic racecourse

MIJAS. The town hall in Mijas will take back control within the next two months of a key piece of municipal land alongside the area's racecourse. This is a step towards managing the whole racecourse complex again, after recent controversy.

The land in question is 35 hectares that surrounds the horse racing track. Here there is an athletics track and several businesses, including a hotel. An error in a planning document had given ownership of this land to a public-private partnership known as Recursos Turísticos, in which the

town hall was a shareholder.

Recursos Turísticos is currently in liquidation and councillors want to know what happened to the 1.8 million euros in annual rent that the council was having to pay to that company in order to keep using the land, which, they say, belonged to Mijas in the first place.

A police investigation is also currently underway into how the company got into financial difficulty.

"We've managed to legally recover a piece of land worth 30 million euros for everyone in Mijas to enjoy," said the council.

Mijas mayor hails 200 million euros of UK investment in the area, 'despite Brexit'

MIJAS. Councillors in Mijas announced this week that the municipality will receive almost 200 million euros in investment in new property from the United King-

dom over the next ten years.

This vote of confidence from Britain despite Brexit, shows, according to local mayor, Juan Carlos Maldonado, that international companies feel secure investing in the area.

"This ruling group has ensured that British companies have the confidence to spend their money in our municipality," he said. He went on to say that the planned property developments consolidated the residential tourism sector in the area. "The number of planning licences in the municipality is growing," he added.

Government insists no cause for alarm after tiger mosquitos detected

The viruses they can transmit are not present in Gibraltar but can be imported by travellers so the public health authority has issued an information sheet for guidance

GIBRALTAR. The public health authority and environmental agency have confirmed that the so-called tiger mosquito, *aedes albopictus*, has been detected in Gibraltar, but say there is no cause for alarm because the viral diseases which can be transmitted by these mosquitos, such as Zika, Dengue and Chikungunya, are not present.

In January last year the authorities in Gibraltar were advised that this type of mosquito had been found in Algeciras and Malaga and since then they have been monitor the situation, with the help World Health Organisation experts, who visited Gibraltar and gave advice on setting traps and monitoring locations.

In June, it was announced that after nine months of intensive surveillance, the tiger mosquito had not been found in Gibraltar. That changed on Wednesday, when it was

confirmed that it had been detected in the urban area for the first time.

The tiger mosquito is not native to Gibraltar and has not been previously found here. It is a domestic species which is common in other countries. This daytime mosquito, which aggressively bites humans, breeds in water in urban areas (water barrels, blocked drains, rainwater gulleys, etc).

Although the viruses it can carry are not present in Gibraltar, they can be imported by travellers returning from an overseas country. The Gibraltar public health authority has published a Factsheet for Travellers, with guidelines for people to follow before travelling, while they are abroad or if they suffer symptoms within three weeks after their return.

Junior chess festival comes to an end



Juana Rivas comes out of hiding as police continue to look for her children

The Granada woman still refuses to give them to their Italian father, who she accuses of domestic abuse, and officers must wait until 1 September for a warrant to search home

GRANADA. Juana Rivas, the Granada woman who was wanted from late July for ignoring a court order to hand over her children to their father, came out of hiding on Tues-

day and voluntarily appeared in court.

She told the judge that she was keeping her children, aged 11 and three, in hiding for their safety. Rivas accuses their Italian father of domestic violence although he has a court order asking for their return.

The judge released her pending further investigations.

Meanwhile Guardia Civil officers continue to look for the children, although a search warrant for Rivas' home outside Granada can't be issued until 1 September, as the civil courts are on their August break.

Family shock after mother has head crushed in faulty hospital lift and dies just after giving birth

SEVILLE. The family of a 25-year-old woman who was crushed to death in a freak accident in a hospital lift is taking legal action against the hospital and the maintenance company.

Rocío Cortés had just given birth to her third child by caesarean in the Virgen de Valme hospital in Seville last Sunday and was being transferred by bed to the ward when the lift started moving before the doors closed, trapping her head.

The family, in a state of shock, said that they were determined to find the person "responsible". The lift had only just passed its last inspection on 12 August.

The Junta de Andalucía's regional minister for Health, Marina Álvarez, said that the accident was "quick, unusual and tragic" and announced a full investigation.

Rocío was from the Dos Hermanas area of Seville and had two other children. Her new-born baby girl wasn't with her at the time and sources said it was due to be operated on for a heart condition.

Tentative agreement between Aena and unions over strikes

The airport authority has accepted union demands over staff and salaries but the final decision lies with the Ministry of Finance

MADRID. Efforts are being made by the Spanish airport operator Aena to meet the demands of airport workers' unions and avoid the series of 25 strikes which are due to begin on 15 September and continue until the end of the year.

After a meeting this week between the CC OO, UGT and USO unions, Aena president José Manuel Vargas and Ángel Luis Arias (CEO of the air traffic control company Enaire), the two companies issued a statement saying that they agreed in principle with the unions over staffing levels and salaries, but as this is a public service, the decision lies with the Ministry of Finance, even though Aena and Enaire are self-financing and do not rely on government funding.

Although no figures were given with regard to extra staff, the workers are asking for 450 new posts from Aena and 250 from Enaire. The companies also believe it would be fair to

increase salaries in accordance with results, which are positive at present thanks to the growth in air traffic and good management. Again, no figures were given but the unions are demanding a salary increase which would compensate for the loss in spending power which they say they have suffered since 2010.

In response, Íñigo de la Serna, the Minister of Public Works and Transport, pointed out that any sa-

lary increase would have to be approved in advance because airport staff count as public employees and there cannot be major salary differences between sectors.

The next meeting to resolve the conflict is due to take place on 29 August. The planned strike dates are 15, 17, 22, 24 and 29 September; 1, 6, 11, 15, 27, 30 and 31 October; 3 and 5 November; 1, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 December.

Property sales in Marbella continued to increase in the first quarter of this year

Over 1,000 properties changed hands between January and March 2017, one of the highest levels in the country

MARBELLA. There has always been a saying in the property industry which has remained true over the years: what happens in Marbella will happen in the rest of Spain. The Costa del Sol has proven to be a reliable indicator of the recovery of the residential property market.

In the first quarter of this year, property sales in Marbella remained at a similar level as the same period in 2016, with more than 1,000 properties sold in three months, 67 more than last year.

In Spain as a whole, property sales rose by 19.3 per cent in June to 44,135, the highest level since February 2011. In Marbella, there has been gradual but steady growth since 2013, and it is now one of the places with the highest number of property transac-

tions, in line with Madrid, Barcelona, Seville and Malaga.

Due to Marbella's town planning problems there is little new construction in the municipality, so the majority of sales were of existing properties.

Although more properties are sold in Marbella than anywhere else in the province apart from Malaga, there is now a strong contender for that leading position: in Estepona, which is becoming increasingly popular, 946 properties were sold in the first quarter of this year, compared to 476 in the same period in 2016.

Last Thursday afternoon, Barcelona and the Catalan coastal town of Cambrils were hit by terrorist vehicle attacks that killed 15 people and injured over 100, fifteen of them gravely. These tragic events leave us to speculate about the combined impact of the terror and recent anti-tourism attacks in Barcelona on the city's tourist industry, and on Spain's as a whole.

Even before last Thursday, Barcelona's reputation as a cosmopolitan city that could be enjoyed without risk had taken a hit. In July, anti-tourism protesters attacked a tour bus as it arrived at the city's Nou Camp football stadium, slashing its tyres and scrawling "tourism kills neighbourhoods" in Catalan along the

vehicle's side. In other related incidents, bikes intended for tourist rental had been destroyed.

If the anti-tourism attacks were making potential visitors think twice about a trip to Barcelona, far greater cause for caution was provided by the events of last week. In an editorial it ran after the Las

Ramblas attack, in which pedestrians were mown down by a van weaving from side to side down the packed boulevard, the Spanish daily El País said that it was clear why the terrorists had chosen high-season Barcelona as their target: it is a city, said the paper, "that represents, like no other, a

spirit of open space, democracy and plurality".

Yet Barcelona's reputation as a city in which those lovely "open spaces" could be enjoyed without risk had suffered another hit, this one much more severe than that inflicted by anti-tourism activists. On Friday, after another vehicle assault in the Catalan seaside town of Cambrils left one dead and several injured, stocks in Spanish companies related to tourism dropped, with airline IAG, hotel group Melià and airport firm Aena losing 2% of their worth. Executives in the region's tourist sector - which catered for just over 17 million visitors last year - must have been dismayed by international headlines such as this one, which appeared in the UK's Telegraph newspaper: "Is

Barcelona Safe And Can I Cancel My Trip?"

Spain is one of the world's tourism heavyweights, though, and will no doubt be able to withstand the damage recently suffered by one of its most popular cities. In fact, it's on track for a record-breaking year, with the number of foreign visitors expected to hit around 84 million in 2017. It is to be hoped that it doesn't suffer a substantial dip in tourism levels as a result of the attacks in Barcelona and Cambrils, just as France, Turkey and Belgium saw visitor numbers plummet in 2016 due to terrorism. The latest ITB World Travel Trends Report called those countries "the big losers" of last year; now, it's up to the world's tourists to make sure Spain doesn't make that list for 2017.

It should be noted that these magnificent trees can be protected for a manageable amount of money. Having discussed it with an Arbolista the first charge is €50 then usually four visits a year to maintain them.

As we have been informed by the powers that be, there is an investment of approximately €375,000 upgrading areas of Elviria which are more or less unused and unseen. For example the children's playpark, which, without any cover from the summer sunshine, temperatures are often above 30 degrees which makes the parks unusable from mid-June to mid-September. Mindless planning.

Isn't it just common sense to invest a small amount to preserve the existing beautiful trees that give such an impressive image of this very special village? Once they are gone they will never be replaced.

Is anybody listening out there, or is it just that nobody cares about social responsibilities and conservation anymore.

They call themselves Las Kellys, an ingenious and customised abbreviation of "Las Que Limpian", in other words The Women who Clean. Hotel chambermaids started to join forces several months ago, tired of terrible conditions that include cleaning between 20 and 30 rooms a day in exchange for tiny salaries of no more than 700 euros a month. Their backs are suffering after so many years of making beds every day. For years they've had knee and wrist problems, bent backs and premature osteoarthritis, but above all what hurts is their self-respect when they read that you can't complain in the tourism sector, that you have to smile at

even the rudest of guests because the customer is always right. But that self pity doesn't last long; no longer than it takes them to realise that the politicians, entrepreneurs and journalists who celebrate record figures summer after summer, ignore the reverse side of the gold coin that is tourism on the Costa del Sol. And so they protest, and they have every right to do so. Because hidden behind those record figures of the industry that turns the wheels of this province's economy is job instability and an unequal and unfair - and perhaps soon illegal - sharing out of the pie.

The union Comisiones Obreras (CCOO) is preparing to report more than 40 hotels in the province of

Malaga to the employment inspectors for subcontracting their cleaning services out to firms that fail to comply with the workers' agreement that governs the hospitality sector and guarantees a decent wage. This system results in cleaners earning half of what they should be. A recent sentence handed down by the Andalusian High Court obliged one of these multiservice subcontractors to pay a hotel chambermaid the salary indicated in the workers' agreement. The ruling puts both these companies and the hotel groups who fail to demand that the agreement is adhered to in a predicament.

Recently some of the most important businesses in the sector publicly spoke out against the hoteliers who outsource their cleaning services to save thousands of euros by cutting salaries. They at least realise that the real defence of tourism lies in putting a stop to the degradation of those without whom the industry would collapse.

I have lived in a rented apartment for two years. At the beginning, every time I met the owner, he asked about the condition of the property, if I felt at ease here, and I only thought that this was simply good manners. However, my relation with him now is quite bad, since he does not stop bothering me and watching

what I do in the apartment. On one occasion he came to see me and tried to enter the property, but I almost had to slam the door in his face. Recently, there has been important damage caused to the kitchen pipes, and he wants to take advantage of this to enter the property and check its condition. Can I refuse?

The owner of a rented property, unless he has an authorisation issued by the courts with duly justified reasons, or the tenant's permission, is not entitled to enter the property. However, if there is serious damage or a necessary repair, he can indeed enter in order to check the veracity of the damage and proceed to repair it. Obviously, he is entitled to verify the specific place where the damage is, not the whole apartment.

I am tax resident in Spain, and last May I submitted my in-

come tax return, but I forgot to include an important amount of expenses, which I incurred when I carried out improvements to my house, as the company that provided the materials had not given me the invoices. For this reason, I have paid much more than I should. I consider that, just as I would have had to pay the difference if I had paid less than the correct amount, now that I have overpaid, I should be entitled to get the reimbursement of the difference. Do I have the right to claim the money paid in excess?

Of course you are entitled to receive the difference. There is the possibility of asking for the correction of the mistake, even if it was you who made it. It is necessary to apply for it in writing and you have a term of five years. The tax administration will reimburse the amount paid in excess, plus the interest.

WHAT HAPPENED TODAY?

25 AUGUST 1707

The birth of Spain's shortest-reigning monarch

Luis Felipe de Borbón y Saboya, Luis I, born 25 August 1707, was the King of Spain from 14 January until 31 August 1724.

At birth he was the heir apparent, or first in line of succession, but he was not given the traditional title of Prince of Asturias until 1709. Born in the Palacio del Buen Retiro in Madrid during the War of the Spanish Succession - a conflict that arose out of the disputed succession to the throne of Spain - Luis was the eldest son of the reigning king, Felipe V.

King Felipe, the first Bourbon king of Spain, succeeded the throne following the death of the childless Carlos II, the last of the Spanish Habsburgs, one of the principal sovereign dynasties of Europe.

During the eighteenth century the Bourbon rulers of Spain took their direction from the more powerful Bourbons of France.

As heir to the vast Spanish empire, and also to a new dynasty following his father's second marriage, it was decided that Luis should marry as soon as possible. This was accomplished when he married Louise Élisabeth d'Orléans on 20 January 1722. She was only 12; he was 15.

Louise was the daughter of the Duke of Orléans, a cousin of Luis' father who was also the regent of France.

Louis was just 17 years of age when he succeeded the throne following his father's abdication in 1724. The reason for the abdication remains unclear, although

it is said that the king's mental instability was behind his decision. It is more possible that King Felipe V abdicated to avoid another war of succession, but his decision was complicated by the Treaty of Utrecht, which forbade a union of the Spanish and French crowns.

However, this was not to cause too much of a problem and there was no subsequent successional

war, because Luis I only ruled for seven months, before his death in 1724.

He was crowned King of Spain on 14 January 1724 and ruled for a short period between the time his father Felipe V abdicated in his favour, and his death from smallpox in Madrid on 31 August of the same year.

Felipe was forced to return to

the Spanish throne, as his younger son, the future Ferdinand VI, was too young to accept the role, and he reigned until his own death in 1746.

Luis was buried alongside several previous Spanish kings and queens in the royal crypt of the El Escorial monastery, also known as the 'Panteón de los Reyes'.

Although his reign was one of the shortest in history, the sum of his father's two reigns, 45 years and 21 days, is the longest in modern Spanish history.

The bee magnet

Globally, bees are on the decline. This pretty plant with abundant flowers produces high quality pollen and nectar bees need to survive

Phacelia tanacetifolia, commonly called the Scorpion flower, Blue Tansy, Lacey Phacelia or Fiddleneck, is a hardy annual native to the south west regions of the US and Mexico. It is a member of the Boraginaceae family and is one of the top 20 nectar producing plants. Not only does it provide high quality pollen and nectar for the endangered honey-

bee, it also is a food source for bumble bees and hover flies. Hover flies (syrphids) are voracious feeders and will eat aphids and small caterpillars, helping to reduce the numbers of garden pests.

The Scorpion flower is best treated as an annual and sown

early in the spring. The seed needs complete darkness and cool temperatures to germinate. It is a fast grower and will be in flower from mid spring, providing masses of delicately scented, soft blue or lavender flowers throughout the summer and into the

autumn. The flowers have a drooping 'tail' which is possibly the origin of the common name Scorpion (or Fiddleneck) flower. The leaves are a soft grey-green and are fern-like, a characteristic much appreciated by flower arrangers, as are the long-lasting blooms.

Its loose growth habit makes it an ideal cottage garden plant or for creating a wildlife garden but it is also grown extensively in Europe in crop rotations to provide green manure or mulch and to help suppress weeds.

To flower abundantly it needs long periods of sunshine and will not bloom at all in shade. Although not completely drought-resistant it easily adapts to different climates and soil conditions and, if left to its own devices, will self seed.

Bees love it, the pollen provides protein for egg producing and the nectar gives carbohydrates for energy. *Phacelia* is so good at providing both that it is best to time flowering so that it does not fall at the same time as fruit or vegetables flowering nearby, the bees will ignore everything else and head for it instead.

GARDENING HINTS FOR AUGUST

Wisteria pruning

According to text books, Wisteria needs cutting back at least twice a year, once near the end of summer and again in winter; although in my experience it needs to be trimmed approximately every two weeks through the summer to prevent it from grabbing everything it can reach. Wisteria in full bloom is wonderful - Malaga's own Jardín Botánico La Concepción has a magnificent specimen - but it is very hard work. The pruning carried out at this time of year

is important as it removes a lot of the whippy growth, allowing light and air to get in and help ripen the wood carrying the all-important flower buds. The technique is to shorten every long tendril to between four and five buds, trying to keep to a framework if you have an established plant. The winter pruning then takes this back to just two buds, creating a spur from which the flowers will cascade in all their perfumed glory in the spring.

A trip into the past

From September 1st to 3rd, this village in the Sierra Norte of Seville province goes back seven centuries to the Middle Ages



How to get there Alanís.

To reach Alanís, head for the Sierra Norte area of Seville along the A-455, which is accessed from the A-4. In total, the village is 240 kilometres from Malaga.

In the Sierra Norte area of Seville province, one of the most important events of the summer is about to take place: the Mediaeval Festival, in the village of Alanís.

In early September every year, Alanís seems to have stepped back several centuries in time, to the Middle Ages. This festival, which is now in its 14th year, is one of the most popular in the region and local people work hard to make it a huge success.

Most of the activities take place in the historic centre of the village, which is also known as Alanís de la Sierra. It boasts some lovely 14th century architecture, which makes it the perfect venue for a festival of this type.

However, Alanís also has a 14th century castle in the highest part of the village, and some of the festival events will take place there. Beside the castle stands the San Juan chapel, an interesting Mudejar building which was constructed around the same time as the fortress.

The whole village and the castle will have a distinctively mediaeval ambience during this festival: visitors can expect some surprises, such as lanterns instead of street lighting and the presence of 'bandits'. Many local people dress up in costumes similar to those from the Middle Ages, giving the event a very authentic atmosphere.

There will also be a large mediaeval market, with stalls selling different products and foods which are associated with that period.

The festival is organised every year by the local council, and this year they have been planning an extensive programme of activities to suit all ages and tastes.

From Friday 1st to Sunday 3rd September there will be con-

certs, theatre performances, and street parades with some very unusual characters, including court jesters and friars, who will interact with the visitors.

This year there will also be several new features, including a mobile app which has been created especially for the Mediaeval Festival and can be downloaded. It contains useful information about the event and also about the village in general. The information is also available on the web page www.mediaeval.alanis.es.

This Mediaeval Festival is the perfect opportunity to explore this delightful village in Andalucía; Alanís is situated on the boundary with the province of Badajoz, in the Sierra Norte natural park in Seville.

Planetary transits

Following the excitement of last Monday's American eclipse, someone asked me, "Is the Earth the only planet in the Solar System that can enjoy an eclipse of the Sun?"

All of the planets, except for Mercury and Venus have moons. Mars has two tiny potato-shaped moons called Phobos and Deimos while the outer planets have dozens of moons each. On Earth we are in a unique position in that our moon, whilst being 400 times smaller than the Sun, just happens to be 400 times closer and so the two appear as practically the same size. During an eclipse, the moon just manages to cover

the whole face of the Sun and so we are able to see the Sun's atmosphere (corona) in clear detail. If the moon was 10% further away, as it will be in about a billion years' time, then it would appear too small to completely cover the sun's disc, and we would never experience a total solar eclipse. The apparent size difference between the Sun and the moon is so narrow that on occasions during an eclipse if the moon is at its most distant point from the Earth (apogee) then it appears too small to completely cover the Sun and we see an annular eclipse with a ring of sunlight surrounding the moon (pictured).

During a lunar eclipse, from the moon the Earth appears much bigger than the Sun and therefore blocks it out completely leaving a ring of light refracted through our atmosphere around the Earth.

If you were able to get above the dense clouds on Venus then you would, on occasions, be able to see a transit of Mercury when the tiny planet crosses the face of the Sun. But Mercury would appear as no more than a tiny black dot against the Sun.

Observers on Mars would be able to witness a transit of Mercury, Venus and the Earth but its two moons are too small to cover the Sun and so they would also appear as small dots.

Jupiter and Saturn both have moons large enough to cover the Sun and on occasions the shadows of these moons can be seen cast onto the upper cloud belts of the planets. At these distances the Sun's size would appear greatly decreased and the eclipse would probably blot out the whole of the Sun.

An observer on distant Pluto would see the Sun as nothing more than a very bright star. Pluto's largest satellite, Charon, appears about four times larger than our moon so a solar eclipse from Pluto would be more like a lunar occultation of a star from Earth, an event where the moon covers the star.

MARBELLA. Marbella 4 Days Walking is gearing up for its annual sponsored walk weekend. Founded in 2011, M4DW started with 658 participants and has grown to be an important event bringing visitors to Marbella during the low season.

More than 1,000 people have already registered for the seventh edition of M4DW, which takes place from 12 until 15 October. Around 80 per cent of the participants come from outside Spain, many of whom are serious hikers who participate each year.

The two routes of 20 and 30 kilo-

metres will begin at 8.30 and 9.30am each day. Walkers will pass through the town centre, Puerto Banús and the Via Verde.

Participants can choose the number of days they wish to walk and those who participate on all four days will receive a medal at a ceremony to be held on the Sunday.

There will also be a special route of 6km for children on Saturday 15 and Sunday 16 October.

When registering, walkers can choose to donate to the Cudeca Hospice in Benalmádena or the Triple A dog rescue centre in Marbella, and M4DW will add one euro to every five euros donated.

This year will be the first time that the event will raise funds for Cudeca.

Hans Wohl, founder of M4DW, said that he believes it is important to help organisations that are dedicated to improving the quality of life on the Costa del Sol.

RONDA. Ronda is getting ready for its world-famous Feria de Pedro Romero, which takes place from Monday 28 August until Sunday 3 September.

The highlight of the fair is the traditional 'corrida Goyesca', a bullfight attended by people dressed in eighteenth-century costume.

The annual bullfight is now in its sixth decade and this is an event when the young ladies of Ronda shine as 'Damas Goyescas', arriving for the bullfight in beautiful horse-drawn carriages. The bullfights are split over three days: the juniors on Friday evening, the top names of bullfighting on Saturday evening and mounted bullfighting on Sunday afternoon.

This fair, which is held in the historic centre of Ronda, is unique in the fact that it is the only one in Spain not dedicated to a saint, but instead to Pedro Romero, the most inspirational matador of all time.

The fair stems from the relationship between Romero and two other immensely influential people connected to Ronda: Spanish painter, Francisco de la Goya and the twentieth century's most celebrated matador, Antonio Ordóñez.

The first 'corrida Goyesca' was held in 1954 on the occasion of the bicentenary of the birth of Pedro Romero. It became known to the world by the romantic writers of that time, primarily Hemingway.



RECIPE

A thirst-quenching tea drink

This refreshing cold drink, based loosely on the traditional Indian Chai, can be prepared in an infinite number of ways, replacing the coconut milk with evaporated milk, soya or almond milk, cream or yoghurt or replacing the ginger with a variety of herbs or spices.

INGREDIENTS

170ml good quality oolong tea, brewed and chilled
2 teaspoons of ginger and turmeric syrup (see method)
60g coconut milk
lots of crushed ice
Slivers of raw ginger for decoration

Syrup:

Water and sugar in equal quantities
1 teaspoon ground turmeric
Peeled root ginger to taste, cut into thin slivers.

METHOD

Syrup

To make the syrup, boil the sugar, water and ginger slices until the liquid has thickened and quan-



tity has reduced to about half. Add turmeric and leave to cool. Strain the mixture and leave to cool before placing in the fridge.

Before serving

Mix the chilled, brewed oolong

tea with two teaspoons of syrup and the coconut milk. Just before serving, fill a glass with crushed ice and pour the syrup and tea mixture over. Decorate the drink with slices of raw ginger.

A MODEST INVESTOR



Four calls in two days. 'Hola, do you know someone called Alain (garbled second name)?' 'No; why?' 'He's a Frenchman who is looking for restaurants to invest in.'

Turns out that this conman goes around restaurants telling everyone he is a possible investor or buyer. If there is interest, he of course has to test the cuisine, and he has expensive tastes. By my count he has so far persuaded about 28 top local restaurants to give him a free meal. Current whereabouts unknown...

Londoner Paul Campbell, once on the board of Pizza Express PLC, now runs his own investment company, Hill Capital Partners, and no longer goes out looking for restaurants to invest in. These days they find him. Starting eight years ago he now fields some of the best. When he invested in the grilled meat-orientated Hawksmoor it had

Paul Campbell partners five Vinotecas in London as well as Tortilla, The Alchemist, Gusto and Hickory's

just one branch. Now it has six and bills 47 million euros annually and plans to launch in New York. The first time he approached the owners of Vinoteca, a wine-focused group offering 300 varieties at reasonable prices, he got the cold shoulder. But a year later when they were thinking of expanding he got the call. Campbell now partners five Vinotecas in the capital as well as Tortilla, The Alchemist, Gusto and Hickory's.

What persuades Campbell to invest? He prefers restaurants that generally offer traditional food with modern touches, and where wine is a significant feature of the eating experience. Investing early is a priority, so he can influence ongoing development and contribute his general business experience, bearing in mind that many restaurants are set up by chefs. Control of costs, adaptation to new customer requirements, and outside business relationships, are among the key endeavours.

A modest man who does not need to impress anyone, Campbell receives regular invitations to invest without having to look for them any more.

A golden age of health tourism in Marbella

The sector generates over 330 million euros a year in Malaga province

The patient is collected by car from Malaga airport early in the morning, and taken to a clinic in a luxury residential complex. There, accompanied by relatives, he or she may have physiotherapy after a recent operation, or undergo minor surgery which does not entail a long stay in hospital. For many foreigners, this is how their 'holiday' in Marbella begins. This is health tourism, something which is gaining importance in the sector and contributing greatly to local development. It has, however, evolved from the traditional concept and now even oncology, traumatology or fertility treatments are available. It is a market which is experiencing unprecedented growth.

The Costa del Sol is already one of the most popular destinations in Spain and the climate, easy access

Demand for health workers expected to rise by 40 per cent

The demand for health workers who can speak other languages has greatly increased in the health tourism sector on the Costa del Sol, rising by about 20 per cent in five years, according to a report by Adecco, which also forecasts a volume of growth of up to 40 per cent this year.

People with at least three years' experience in this type of work are especially in demand, particularly specialists in fertility treatments, odontology and traumatology and plastic surgeons. From a social point of view, professionals from abroad, or who are second generation immigrants, are especially welcome because their knowledge of other languages and cultures is a benefit when dealing with patients from other countries. As a result, the model of the medical profession looks set to change in forthcoming years.

by land, sea and air and a focus on luxury make the Marbella area perfect for health tourism. Numerous private clinics are now promoting their exclusive services abroad, and the response is helping to generate year-round tourism and attract patients from all over the world.

➤ the OECD (Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development), health tourism generates revenue of 75 billion euros a year around the world. In 2012, Dr Miguel Such was involved in creating the Malaga Health foundation, to promote the medical skills of a large group of health professionals in Malaga province.

International health tourism is not nearly as well-known in the rest of Spain, so Marbella has lost no time in making a name for itself as a favourite destination for foreign patients. "All the private hospitals now have a department which works exclusively to attract patients from abroad," says Dr Such, "and health tourists spend up to ten times more than holidaymakers."

Luxury clinics

The Hospital HC Marbella is a clinic which has been focusing on foreign patients for a number of years. It is located in Puerto Banús, one of Marbella's most luxurious areas. It only has 12 rooms, and offers exclusive attention to every type of client.

"People feel as if they are staying in a hotel, rather than a hospital," explains Patricia Jiménez, the head of Communication. Relatives are looked after as well: the HC Marbella has agreements with top class hotels to ensure that patients' families can also stay somewhere which is ideal to relax. "Our greatest asset, though, is our renowned team of very highly qualified professionals," Jiménez says.

The famous Dr Hernán Cortés



Funes is one of that team. He is the head of the Oncology Unit, where the facilities are state-of-the-art thanks to an international advisory committee.

Another of the clinics in Marbella is the Hospital Quirón, where the number of consultations increases by about 45 per cent in the summer months. The Quirón business group is the biggest medical supplier in Spain and it attends to 20,000 foreign patients a year; it has agreements with over 570 international insurers. It even has a separate wing

for foreign patients.

Most of the patients come from the UK, the Netherlands and Finland. One of the clinic's star treatments, an in vitro fertility programme, costs about 10,500 euros.

The Premium Clinic, meanwhile, is right in the centre of Marbella and is well-known internationally. Its patients mainly come for urological treatments, thanks to the 'green laser' it uses to treat prostate conditions.

"About 30 per cent of requests for information are from foreigners,"

says Judith López Cantalapiedra, the director. One important factor is knowing what equipment will be needed for the foreign market. A year ago this clinic started offering an innovative hair implant treatment which is used in countries such as Turkey. "We are in regular contact with our counterparts in other countries and they advise us about what to offer," she says.

Fertility treatment

Spain is one of the countries which provides the most fertility treatments

and Marbella has become a favourite destination for patients in search of this type of procedure, which can cost around 7,000 euros.

The Ceram Hospital, which opened over 20 years ago, is now renowned for its work in this field. Tatiana Benito, the CEO, says the first thing foreign patients want is to be able to speak in their own language. "It makes them feel safer, and here we speak more than ten languages," she explains.

Most of the patients come from the UK, Arab countries, Italy and Germany. "Here, we can carry out legal fertility treatments which are not possible in some other countries," says Tatiana. The Ceram likes to get to know its patients before they arrive for treatment. "We have contact with them beforehand so we all feel we know each other, and that helps the relationship," she explains.

The Ceram Hospital also has agreements with Dutch clinics and the British health system, after the controversial cutbacks in the sector in those countries. "Patients come here because the treatments are much more expensive at home. They like the idea of having a holiday at the same time," she says.

Health tourists also have other requirements, often depending on their situation and the number of relatives who come with them. They are given assistance in designing a tailor-made stay. "Some people want to be within easy reach of the airport, or they want to stay somewhere with nice views in a hotel with a swimming pool that

their children will enjoy," adds Tatiana. She believes demand for health tourism has grown enormously. "There are more clinics now so we have greater competition, but it hasn't affected us. The number of patients overall must have multiplied," she explains.

Although health tourism in Marbella tends to be associated with luxury, patients like to know about prices before making a decision.

"People consider the cost of the flights, the treatment and the accommodation, but they also take into the account the probability of our treatments being effective. When they are here, they can see for themselves that our services and our staff are unique," says Tatiana.

One five-star establishment in Marbella is legendary. For over 45 years the Buchinger Wilhelmi clinic has been offering a complete range of weight loss and de-stress treatments. It also offers therapies which are greatly in demand among celebrities who come to Marbella every year. The Buchinger's classic 21-day fasting diet can cost over 30,900 euros. It requires a stay of around one month, so the client has time to adapt completely to the regime, which includes 16 individual days when no solid food is ingested whatsoever.

A stay at this clinic focuses not



only on physical health but also on the soul and spirit, whose "real needs" "tend to make an appearance during the fasting process", say sources at the clinic.

To help clients de-stress, no mobile phones can be used in the clinic or on walks or excursions. Patients are expected to sleep at the clinic every night, unless they have prior consent from the doctor or head nurse. Doctors at the clinic advise people to keep a diary, and do a lot of reading during their stay.

Lack of support

The private clinics in Marbella believe they should have more institutional support to raise awareness of this type of tourism, including in the European Union. The aim, of course, is to attract more patients. "If this sector is to grow, we need political support," says Miguel Such. "Not even the Junta de Andalucía has shown much interest in this project so far; they don't yet have the right mentality."

In general, the health tourism sector in Marbella believes there needs to be more cooperation between the clinics themselves and a considerable increase in the types of medical treatment that can be offered. Together with institutional support, the future of this tourism sector would indeed look healthy.

Twelve-year-old José Manuel Camino Carrasco is looking forward to a new chance at life after a double lung transplant at the Reina Sofía hospital in Cordoba

MÁLAGA. He had forgotten what swimming in the sea felt like, and the pleasure of popping round to the local shop, and even playing with his friends or his sister. The cystic fibrosis gradually blocked his lungs, and he has spent the past three years in a wheelchair, with bottles of oxygen attached to it. Now, however, a double lung transplant carried out at the Reina Sofía hospital in Cordoba has given 12-year-old José Manuel Camino Carrasco, who lives with his family in the Cortijo Alto area of Malaga, the hope of a normal life.

"When I came home from hospital the first thing I did was go out and buy the bread, and then I played with my friends and my sister," he said. These would be normal activities for most children of his age, but not for José Manuel because he was so ill.

"He was just fading away; cystic fibrosis is a genetic degenerative disease, and it was destroying his lungs and respiratory system," said José Manuel's father, Francisco Camino.

Marina Álvarez, the Junta de Andalucía's Minister of Health, provided information about the organ donations that have taken place in the region this year, at a press conference in Seville earlier this week.

José Manuel and his family were invited to attend and to talk about their experience. Although he said he felt "a bit shy about being with such important people", the youngster said he felt very well. So well, in fact, that "I can't believe it."

organ transplants were carried out in the first seven months of this year in Malaga province: 101 kidney, 36 liver and three pancreas.

133

people were on the waiting list on 31 July: 97 for a kidney, 28 for a liver and eight for a pancreas.

He explained that the two and a half years he had to wait for the operation had seemed endless, and he was happy and excited at the possibility of leading a normal life, with no wheelchair or oxygen. He was especially enthusiastic about swimming in the sea, because he had forgotten what it felt like, and being able to go out with his friends. He said the time he had to spend in hospital after the transplant was hard to endure: "It felt as if the walls were closing in on me," he explained.

Manuel Alonso, the coordinator of transplants in Andalucía, also attended the presentation, with Dr Ángel Salvatierra, the head of the Thoracic Surgery unit at the Reina Sofía hospital, who carried out the transplant. José Manuel said he remembered him "through the effects of the anaesthetic."

After waiting two and a half years for a transplant, a donor was finally found for José Manuel. "On 27 June they told us there was a possible donor. We went to Cordoba and they did the tests; he went into the operating theatre at 9 o'clock and they finished the operation at 3 o'clock the next morning. After eight days in intensive care they moved him

onto the ward, and he was allowed to come home last Thursday," explained Francisco.

José Manuel was born with this degenerative disease. When he was just two days old he needed surgery for intestinal obstruction and the doctors already suspected that he had cystic fibrosis. Genetic tests showed that his parents are carriers and the illness appeared in José Manuel, affecting his respiratory and digestive systems.

"His lungs had reached their limit. He had been in a wheelchair and using oxygen for three years," said Francisco. Even so, he achieved excellent school reports and will shortly be moving up to secondary school. José Manuel wants to be a doctor: "Like my family they have helped me so much," he said.

This operation has given the 12-year-old "a chance of life". Francisco, who has been out of work since a local solar panel factory closed down (his wife, María José, also lost her job because she couldn't combine her work with her son's treatments) said the donation was "the best possible act of solidarity" and he encourages other families to "give others the chance to live".

More transplants

According to the figures, the regional hospital in Malaga carried out 140 organ transplants between January and June this year, nearly five per cent more than in the same period of 2016. Of the operations, 101 were of kidneys, 36 liver and three pancreas. The number of liver transplants has already increased by 44 per cent.

The 252 donations in Andalucía have enabled 563 transplants to be carried out, but on 31 July this year 133 people were still on the waiting list for an organ transplant in Malaga province.

Wear goggles

If you regularly swim in the pool, protect your eyes from the chlorine with goggles, as too much exposure to chlorine can irritate the eyes leaving them blurry and red. If your eyes are sore,

try an eye rinse or saline eye drops from the chemist to relieve them.

Something in your eye

Be careful of sand and small objects getting into your eye and follow the right steps to remove them. It is easy for sand or small objects to get into your eye when you're enjoying swimming and spending time on the beach. If this happens try not to rub your eyes as this could scratch the cornea. Do not rinse your eyes with running water; the eye will water to flush out the object naturally. If it is still painful and you

think the object is still in your eye, go to your nearest opticians who will try to locate and remove the object. If this does not help you, the optometrist will refer you to the specialist in the nearest hospital, who will take out the object and prescribe an ointment to heal any damage.

Tattoos are normally considered fun and artistic, but a recent initiative for women who have had breast cancer is showing that they can also serve a very important purpose.

Fuengirola council has just announced that a local tattoo studio, Rolling Tattoo, has joined a nation-

wide solidarity scheme and is offering two free tattoos every month for women who have undergone a mastectomy and therefore lost their nipple and aureola through surgery.

Javier Jiménez, the owner of the business, says that Rolling Tattoo joined the initiative in March this year; the studio is the first in Fuen-

MALAGA. Club owner Sheikh Al-Thani will have his man after all. With the new season kicking off last weekend, Malaga's preparations had taken another setback on Saturday when club owner Sheikh Abdullah Al-Thani pulled the plug on a transfer move for defensive midfielder Esteban Rolón.

Al-Thani personally led the negotiations for the 22-year-old who plays for Argentinian second tier side Argentinos Juniors after vetoing a move for former Manchester City man Javi Garcia, contradicting his head coach Michel in a public put-down on Twitter.

However, the saga took a twist when the deal for his would-be replacement, which would have cost 3.5 million euros, was called off by

the owner who tweeted: "I've been working for more than one month to finish everything but there is no

solution. This is why I cancelled the deal because we were wasting time for nothing, I hope you understand."

Malaga express an interest in 'Gabigol'

Malaga's search for a new forward has brought them to Inter Milan's Gabriel Barbosa. The Italian side fought off fierce competition for his signature only last summer, completing the transfer for close to 30 million euros. However, three managers later and he is finding his game time limited.

The Blue and Whites are interested in a loan deal but as a non-EU player (LaLiga squads can have a maximum of three) and a lack of Champions League football on offer, it is understood that Malaga are behind the likes of Sporting Lisbon and Benfica.

It was understood that Rolón had been pencilled in for a medical two weeks ago ahead of signing a six-year deal, but that the sheikh decided to cancel the deal after negotiations, which had been ongoing for 21 days, seemed to be going nowhere.

The stumbling block, it appears, was the division of the transfer fee with Rolón himself owning a 15 per cent share. However, he has since given that up in order to push through a move that will be "a new challenge" for him.

Rolón is expected in Malaga today to complete a medical before signing the deal and being presented in the number five shirt.

The midfielder, who is yet to represent his country at any level, is perhaps not the high-profile number six the club had been pushing to recruit after Ignacio Camacho joined German side Wolfsburg earlier this summer.

Emanuel Cecchini has been signed from Banfield but is viewed as a long-term replacement for Pablo Fornals who joined Villarreal. Until now, the injury prone Zdravko Kuzmanovic, who has made his loan from Basel permanent, has been the only recognised holding midfielder in the squad.

Al-Thani under fire

As a result of the protracted saga, Al-Thani has attracted criticism from both fans and Michel himself for interfering in transfer matters.

Michel, speaking in his press conference to preview the Eibar clash, said: "I prefer not to do business on social media. My job is to pick the team and I hope no one will interfere in that."

Al-Thani, in turn, deflected attention back on sporting director Francesc Arnau, telling him to sign the striker the team needed.



Charles comes back to haunt Malaga

MALAGA. The new campaign got off to a poor start for Malaga on Monday night as Eibar rocked La Rosaleda with a solitary goal from Charles against his former club.

The Blue and Whites' return to LaLiga action started in lively fashion, though. Within a minute, striker Borja Bastón broke through one-on-one with Eibar keeper Dmitrovic only to be called offside. Just a minute later, Charles, who left Malaga on a free transfer this summer, had the ball in the back of the net, but saw the goal disallowed for handball, picking up a yellow card for his

troubles.

Both sides found rhythm hard to come by in the first half: Eibar were forced to sit deep at times as Malaga's Juanpi played the ball around the centre of the park nicely. In fact, he almost put the hosts ahead as his curling shot in the ninth minute went just wide of the post. Malaga continued to probe the Eibar back four, and once again it was the Venezuelan Juanpi whose half-volley went straight into the arms of the opposition goalkeeper.

The momentum began to swing in the second half. Malaga looked lethargic and sloppy in possession, and the visitors were first to every ball. Eibar began to cause problems to the home side with a series of well-placed crosses. Their persistence paid off in the 56th minute when Charles turned in a cross from the left by Cote with a headed effort which was out the reach of Malaga's new goalkeeper Roberto, giving the visitors a narrow lead.

Change of shape

Michel was quick to react and less than ten minutes later made his first change bringing winger Jony on for centre half Diego González, reverting to a back four after his experiment seemingly backfired.

Despite the change, Malaga continued to look uncomfortable on the ball and several defensive errors led to a series of half chances for Eibar.

The introduction of Jony was particularly disappointing; he got himself into good positions on the left flank on several occasions, but each chance ended in weak, misplaced crosses which either failed to beat the first defender, or landed straight in the path of Dmitrovic who collected each cross with ease.

Michel introduced En-Nesyri and Ontiveros but his attempts to clinch a point were fruitless. Eibar pressure continued way into the last ten minutes of the game and there were few signs of a Malaga equaliser.

The home crowd had a glimmer of hope when Jony went down in the penalty area after what looked like a push in the back in the 89th minute, but all shouts for a penalty were ignored by referee David Medié Jiménez, making his top flight debut. Frustration rang through the stadium as the final whistle went, but the lacklustre performance from the home side deserved nothing more.

With just days left of the summer window, the Malaga hierarchy will have their work cut out to improve the squad which, based on Monday's performance, looks threadbare.

The loss means that Malaga will go into their next game in joint 15th place. There is work to be done but Michel's side will look to put points on the board in their upcoming fixture against LaLiga new boys Girona on Saturday night.



An early lead for Froome as La Vuelta gets under way

The annual cycling race will arrive in Andalucía next week with stops in Antequera, Coín and Motril

MALAGA. La Vuelta a España, Spain's answer to the Tour de France, kicked off on Saturday in the French city of Nîmes with the inaugural team time trial circling the city - a route lasting 13.7 kilometres.

Australian rider Rohan Dennis saw BMC across the finish line, earning his first ever red jersey.

The 203.4km stage two began on Sunday once again in Nîmes and finished in Gruissan on the south coast of France. The stage was won by Belgian Yves Lampaert, who became the first Belgian rider to lead in general classification since Philippe Gilbert in 2010.

It wasn't until stage three that the tour passed onto Spanish soil, before a hill climb into Andorra.

Through the week, the tour

passed through Catalonia and down Spain's east coast, taking in popular tourist destination Benicàssim on Wednesday.

Racing will continue daily until Sunday ahead of a rest day in Alicante on Monday.

By Wednesday, riders will be in Andalucía with stage 11 finishing at the Calar Alto observatory in Almería province.

The following day's hill stage

runs from Motril to the dolmens in Antequera while Coín will host the start of stage 13 towards Tomares on 1 September.

Chris Froome and team Sky had a successful start to Spain's 72nd Vuelta with the Briton maintaining the red jersey after stage six from Vilarreal to Sagunta, despite stage victory for Lotto Soudal's Tomasz Marczyński. Froome remains the early favourite.

The 2018 edition will kick off from Malaga city

MADRID. The starting city for the Vuelta will move from the south of France to the south of Spain for its next edition when Malaga hosts the start of the race which will run from 25 August to 16 September 2018.

The director of the annual multi-stage bicycle race, Javier Guillén, announced the news on Saturday in Nîmes, just before the current edition got under way, in the presence of Malaga mayor Francisco de la Torre and provincial chief Elias Bendodo.

This will be the third time that the provincial capital has witnessed the start of the Vuelta, following events in 2000 and 2006. Other towns in the province have also had this honour: Fuengirola (1972 and 1975), Estepona (1976) and Puerto Banús (2015). However, in total Malaga has welcomed the startline for a stage on 16 occasions.

Guillén was able to confirm that the first stage in 2018 would be a time trial, as was the case in Nîmes, but couldn't say whether it would be an individual or team event.

thousands of professional athletes, and plenty of fun runners, who use the race to raise funds for chosen charities.

The race starts from the town's municipal sports stadium at 10am and the runners will follow a route that takes them down to the coast, back through the town centre and on to the finish line back at the sports complex.

The tennis and padel tournaments begin on Thursday 21 and continue until Sunday 1 October.

There will also be various participatory events aimed at the children and these will include a 50-metre slide, which will be installed in the Virgen del Carmen municipal swimming pool, among other watersports.

The enrolment period is now open and anyone wishing to participate in any of the activities can register online, or at the Palacio San Miguel.
