# Dublin man gets 22 years for his role in fatal Mijas shooting

A jury found  
James Quinn  
guilty in the Gary  
Hutch murder trial  
last week

The Malaga provincial court has sen-  
tenced James Quinn to 22 years in  
prison for his role in the murder of  
fellow Irish national, Gary Hutch,  
in Mijas Costa in September 2015.

The 35-year-old was found guilty  
last Friday for his role in Hutch's  
killing, although the jury did not  
consider that evidence provided in  
court proved that he was the gun-

man. Instead the sentence states  
that the defendant was a "necessary  
participant" in the murder, waiting  
in the getaway car while the uni-  
dentified killer shot Hutch at least  
15 times inside a residential devel-  
opment. He was also found guilty  
of illegal possession of firearms.

Quinn's lawyer is expected to ap-  
peal the sentence. **P14**

# Junta asks government for help after mass arrival of migrants

Nearly 1,700 migrants arrived in Cadiz and Malaga provinces last weekend by boat and the region lacks resources to deal with them

**MALAGA.** The Junta de Andalucía has requested assistance from the government to deal with nearly 1,700 migrants who arrived by boat in the region last weekend.

"We're finding it difficult to handle them all," said a spokesman for the Police Union, referring to the 1,396 people who were intercepted on the Alborán Sea and the Strait of Gibraltar and another 254 who were rescued and taken to different Andalusian ports.

The Junta, police, Red Cross and

other NGOs were all involved in attending to the migrants, 500 of whom are now sleeping in sports centres in Jerez, Cadiz and Tarifa because there is nowhere else for them. The police stations are under considerable strain because every migrant has to be taken for document checks and processing.

The vice-president of the Junta, Manuel Jiménez Barrios, said the Spanish government needs to step in because Andalucía doesn't have the resources "to give these people the help they need".

The Junta's minister for Equality and Social Policy, María José Sánchez Rubio, also called on the government to help, saying this should be a matter for the State to deal with. "This should not be the responsibility of a town or a region; it has to be a matter for the country," she said.

This mass influx of migrants coincided with the arrival of the Aquar-

ius refugee ship in Valencia, after the Spanish government agreed to allow it to come here when other countries were refusing, so obviously comparisons are being made.

The president of the Junta de Andalucía, Susana Díaz, praised the new Spanish prime minister's action in accepting the Aquarius, but said she thought it was "dangerous" to use immigration as a political weapon and that the onus was on Brussels to produce measures and a clear policy regarding what is happening in the Mediterranean.

The president of the PP-A party, Juanma Moreno, accused the government of ignoring Andalucía where, he said, the equivalent of "two Aquarius ships" had arrived within a few hours. He also complained that the migrants whose boats were intercepted in the Strait of Gibraltar were not able to be given the same levels of attention as those who arrived in Valencia port on Sunday.

The general coordinators of Podemos Andalucía and Izquierda Unida, Teresa Rodríguez and Antonio Maíllo, also asked the European Union not to "look away" and to modify their migration policies to guarantee the rights of people who arrive in these conditions. And not all of them arrive. A boat carrying 43 migrants also sank in the Alborán Sea on Saturday.

# Protests likely if 'La Manada' group, accused of rape, are released on bail after court decision

**MADRID.** Women's right groups have said they will organise protests if the five men who were accused of the rape of a woman during Pamplona's San Fermín bull-running festival in July 2016 are released on bail. The men, known as 'La Manada', or The Pack, after the nickname they gave themselves, had been found guilty in April of the lesser crime of sexual assault but had then appealed the decision.

Now judges in Pamplona, Navarra, have ruled that they can be released on 6,000 euros bail each while the appeal is being processed. The statutory two years to hold a low-risk accused person without a definitive sentence is nearing its end on July.

Details of the latest decision should formally be announced today (Friday 22 June). It was reached by a vote of two to one of the presiding judges and is expected to say that there is no risk that the five will attempt to flee or reoffend. The case has had a very high profile in the media.

# MIGRANTS RESCUED BY THE SHIP 'AQUARIUS' ARRIVE IN SPAIN

The 630 migrants who were rescued by the Aquarius in the Mediterranean recently are now safely in Spain. They arrived in Valencia on Sunday in three boats, including the Aquarius, and the world's press was there to meet them together with health professionals, interpreters and Red Cross volunteers. Spanish prime minister Pedro Sánchez agreed to take the migrants in after a stalemate in which Italy and Malta refused. They will receive free health care and will be able to apply for asylum.

# Last-minute agreement means no strike in the hospitality sector

The deal will remain in force for five years, the longest period so far, and includes a salary increase and equal conditions for the 'Kellys'

**MALAGA.** The tourism sector in Malaga breathed a huge sigh of relief when agreement was reached in the early hours of Tuesday morning which meant that there would not, after all, be a strike by hotel staff and bar and restaurant workers during the peak summer season.

The agreement will also bring an end to the discrimination suffered by the so-called 'Kellys', hotel room cleaners, who are outsourced and earn much less than colleagues who work directly for the hotels. Some of them are expected to do the same amount of work for half the amount of pay. It has now been decided that cleaners who are employed from outside the company must benefit from the same salary and conditions as those contracted directly.

The two sides came to an agreement after eight hours of negotia-

tions which were described as "intense".

Other key points are a 13 per cent salary increase over a five-year period for the 80,000 employees in the sector, shifts to be decided two weeks in advance, and training possibilities with a view to advancement. The agreement will also remain in force for five years before being reviewed.

The president of the Aehcos hotel association on the Costa del Sol, Luis Callejón Suñé, is very pleased that the words 'Kellys' and 'strike' will no

longer be heard. "This is a landmark agreement; it will bring peace, and progress in work flexibility and training. We have set an example in Spain," he said.

Meanwhile the president of the companies which form part of the Mahos association, Javier Frutos, congratulated all involved for overcoming their differences and calling off the strike which would have had such a negative effect on tourism. Now that the spectre of the strike is no longer hanging over it, the sector is looking forward to a great summer.

# New online system for complaints about airlines

**MALAGA.** The busiest time of year for travel is about to start and this is when flight cancellations and delays are more likely. When this happens, people are usually entitled to make a claim against the airline but many fail to do so because they are going on holiday and can't spare the time.

To make it easier, the national air safety agency (AESA) has now put an online form on its website so people can lodge any complaints and also track the progress of their claim. The website is [www.seguridadaerea.gob.es](http://www.seguridadaerea.gob.es), and there is a section for complaining about cancelled or delayed flights, being denied permission to board, access

for passengers with mobility difficulties etc.

AESA also points out that if a passenger is denied boarding, or their flight is cancelled or seriously delayed, they could be entitled to compensation of between 250 and 600 euros, depending on the distance of the flight, although the amount can be reduced by 50 per cent if the airline offered alternative transport or makes up the time lost.

Passengers who arrive over three hours late at their destination may be entitled to the same compensation as for cancellation, unless the airline can prove that it was due to an extraordinary circumstance.

# Authorities remove 15 tonnes of jellyfish from shores, but warn that swarms are unpredictable

The plague began on the eastern Costa del Sol on Saturday and spread west as far as Benalmádena on Sunday

**MALAGA.** The Costa del Sol's first weekend of real summer weather coincided with the arrival of an enormous swarm of jellyfish. Thousands of stinging *Pelagia Noctiluca* washed up onto beaches along the Costa del Sol, from Nerja all the way to Benalmádena.

The appearance of jellyfish on the shores of this province is not rare nor isolated. According to the director of the Malaga Oceanographic Institute, Jorge Baro, large groups of jellyfish have been appearing on the surrounding coasts "for years", though the invertebrates are normally small in size.

Town councils hoisted yellow flags on the affected beaches along the Axarquía coastline on Saturday, to warn visitors, while the beach-cleaning services used tractors and boats to remove the jellyfish from the beaches and the bathing water. Between Saturday and Wednesday, authorities had moved over 15 tonnes of jellyfish from the shores.

nes of jellyfish from the shores. Infomedusa, an app set up by the provincial authority in 2013, keeps bathers informed in real time of the situation.

Jesús Bellido, a specialist from the Aula del Mar environmental organisation and coordinator of Infor-

medusa says that there is no "single explanation" for the infestation, but highlights the fact that abundant rain during recent months plus the strong and changing winds have attracted the jellyfish toward the shores. The reduction in numbers



of sea turtles, the jellyfish's natural predator is also thought to contribute to the increase.

Baro adds that this infestation should be treated as a "natural process", which may have been accelerated by global warming. "We hope that this is the end of this particular episode, but it is difficult to predict."

As well as preventing sunbathers from enjoying the sea, the presence of the swarms of jellyfish over the weekend has had an impact upon the local fishing industry. In some parts on the eastern coast, boats captured more jellyfish than fish in their fishing nets.

Despite the fact that some areas of the Axarquía coast were off limits on Saturday, by the end of the weekend beaches were once more flooded with swimmers and sunbathers. Fina Osoria, a visitor to the crowded Misericordia beach in Malaga on Sunday said, "The water is very cold anyway, so no one is complaining about jellyfish".

However, in the case that a bather is stung by a jellyfish, the Aula del Mar recommends that they inform a lifeguard or another member of beach personnel, who will advise them on the best way to proceed. If this is not possible, the bather should wash their sting with water from the sea and remove any remaining jellyfish tentacles from their person using a card or some tweezers. Ice may help with pain and antiseptic solution will disinfect the wound.

# New foreign resident's office in centre of Torremolinos aims to help expats integrate

**TORREMOLINOS.** Torremolinos town hall has installed a new Foreign Residents Department in the town centre. Although the office, which also houses the tourist and culture departments, was opened 18 months ago, the foreign resident's department has only recently been inaugurated.

The new offices in Plaza de Andalucía, which are open between 9am and 1.30pm, will provide help and support to expats dealing with the important aspects of living in Spain. Currently, the service is available in just English and Spanish, but they will soon be able to attend enquiries in French, Italian and German.

Since taking over in 2015, the PSOE council has instigated numerous changes to the town and one of

its priorities has been the expat community. The town hall has acknowledged the importance of this new office and has promised to bring it in line with the services offered by other towns in the province.

Aida Blanes, councillor for foreign residents, is overseeing the new office, along with the assistance of María José Carmona Márquez, the informative administrator of the department.

"The project is in the early stages, but we hope to soon offer a full and

efficient service. We have many ideas, but we hope people will tell us what they need, because we are here to serve them," María José explained to SUR in English.

The department is considering a number of possible initiatives to help expats integrate. These include information in English on the town hall's website and an English language news and information programme on Torremolinos Television.

Foreign residents can also volun-

teer to help create an extensive service. The department has plans to organise English speakers to help students with their studies, or with interpreter services at police stations and local health centres.

"Most residents have many questions when they arrive in a new country, like opening a bank account, the health system and registering their children at a local school. We will also offer residents information concerning local taxes, laws and anything necessary for

those who live here permanently," María José said.

Although the padrón is still dealt with in the town hall, the new office will advise local expats about the benefits of registering correctly, something the British must consider before March 2019, María José pointed out.

"We know that some of our foreign residents might be worried about Brexit. The only advice we can give with any certainty is that they must have a legal residents permit and be registered on the census; that way they will be able to continue living here worry free," she declared.

Residents from the EU who are already on the padrón in Torremolinos no longer need to re-register every five years, as the town hall has implemented a new monitoring system. However, those from outside of Europe must re-register every two years.

"Aside from the Brexit question, the padrón is extremely important for the town hall, seeing as its annual budget is based on these figures. Obviously the higher our budget the better services we can offer our residents, María José explained.

She also pointed out the padrón does not offer an accurate figure, as there are still many expats who have not registered. According to the January 2018 census poll, more than 150 nationalities live in Torremolinos and they make up 25 percent of the population. After the 1,860 Moroccan residents, the British are the second largest community in the town, with 1,665 people registered.

Judge shelves alleged Marbella rape case

# ‘Professional’ debtors in almost every community

Four out of every ten property owners in a residential complex owe community fees with no excuse for not paying

Property administrators are calling for the law to be changed to combat the debt problem, which affects 40 per cent of communities in Malaga

**MALAGA.** Debts owed to communities of owners in the province have gone down for the third year running and now total 57.8 million euros, the lowest figure since 2012. The improvement in the economic situation has contributed to this reduction, but is not entirely responsible; not only do most families have more resources to pay the charges now, but more properties have also been sold, which means the vendor has normally had to pay any outstanding debts on their property before completion of the sale. Even so, in four out of ten communities of owners in the province, some members are not up-to-date with the payments, according to the

million euros is the amount of money owed to communities of owners in the province at the end of 2017. This is 2.6 million lower than a year beforehand and the lowest figure since 2012. The worst year was 2014, with debts of 76 million euros.

► **Types of debtor.** People who choose not to pay but have no reason represent 42%, while 23% are those who cannot pay for financial reasons. Bank debt continues to drop and is now 19%, while absent debtors (owners who have died or cannot be located) comprise 12%.

► **The geographical situation.** About 47 per cent of the debt has arisen on the western Costa del Sol, followed by the eastern coast (24%) and Malaga city (22%). The remainder applies to other places in the province.

latest study by the College of Property Administrators of Malaga.

With regard to the type of debtor, the banks still feature highly although their debt is continuing to fall and is now 19 per cent of the total, about 11 million euros. In this context, the greatest debtors are the voluntary, or professional type, in other words people who choose not to pay despite there being no logical justification for it. These account for 42 per cent, compared with the 23 per cent who don’t pay because their financial situation means they can’t afford to.

“There are professional debtors, and they are the ones who create conflict in the communities of owners,” says the president of the College, Fernando Pastor.

There is another type of debtor as well: the owner who lives elsewhere (12 per cent), a profile which is especially prevalent on the Costa del Sol where owners who lived in other provinces or abroad have died and whose heirs are unknown. In fact, the College of Property Administrators has signed an agreement with a legal firm that specialises in searching for the heirs to empty properties.

With regard to second homes, it is interesting to note that 47 per cent of the money owed is for this type of property on the western Costa del Sol, while on the eastern side it is 24 per cent and in Malaga city, 22 per cent.

Additional tools

Fernando Pastor is calling for more legal instruments to facilitate the payments. The General Council of Colleges of Property Administrators of Spain has proposed that the Law of Horizontal Property be reformed to include, among other measures, surcharges above the legal interest rate on the money for the time an owner fails to pay, obliging purchasers of a property to pay any monies outstanding from the past four years and making purchasers demand a certificate from the vendor to prove that all debts with the community have been settled.

# Spain cracks down on Gibraltar "residency"

The Spanish tax authorities have taken huge steps over recent years to crack down on tax evasion and increase tax revenue. They implemented a number of new measures and adopted new IT tools to make it easier to find those who are not following the Spanish tax rules correctly, and to analyse the tax affairs of wealthy individuals with interests in Spain.

Besides looking for those who failed to declare all their income, including overseas income and assets, they are also focused on false residency claims – i.e. those who live in Spain but claim residence in a low taxation territory like Gibraltar or Andorra to avoid paying higher taxes in Spain.

The Andalusian tax agency is having success with their investigations. On 20<sup>th</sup> May, Spanish newspaper ABC reported that "the tax agency is tightening the net on Gibraltar" and recouped €20 million as a result.

The ABC article describes how it is fairly common for foreign nationals to live in luxury residences in the Costa del Sol but are registered as residents in "el Peñón" (the Rock).

Being tax resident in Gibraltar means they do not pay Spanish income or wealth tax. It also alleges they hide property ownership behind "complex corporate structures" to avoid paying notional rental income tax as non-residents and property transfer tax when they sell it.

The article reports that "every year, the Spanish tax authorities are prevented from collecting more than one billion euros, as a consequence of the colony's tax regime, which encourages the creation of offshore companies" (quotes are translations as the ABC article was originally published in Spanish).

Prior to 2013 these "free riders" (to quote the article) could use this system with little or no consequence. But then the Spanish tax authorities began to tighten the net on these Gibraltar residents enjoying a tax-free life in both jurisdictions.

Jorge Ramírez, special delegate of the Tax Agency in Andalucía, told ABC: "A tracking system was used to gather real and documentary evidence, and we found some

Gibraltarians whose core interests were actually focused entirely in Spain".

The investigations had to look at the global income of people with assets in different countries. However the hard work paid off, as "the tax enquiries of the residents with fictitious tax status in Gibraltar has now lead to the regularisation of the status of more than 160 taxpayers".

The Tax Agency found that, since these individuals had been tax resident in Spain, they owed €20 million in tax in total, or an average of €125,000 individually. In most cases, the debts were payable immediately. Some are also being investigated in courts in Málaga and Cádiz.

The authorities are also looking at those who live in Spain but work in Gibraltar. Prior to 2014 93% of them failed to declare this income on their Spanish tax returns. But the authorities began collecting evidence of their Gibraltar earnings and today 75% make voluntary disclosures.

The Spanish tax residence rules

You are resident for tax purposes in Spain if any of the following apply:

- 1) You spend more than 183 days a year in Spain cumulatively, (whether you formally register or not). In principle, temporary absences can be ignored unless you can prove you are habitually resident elsewhere for 183 days.
- 2) Your "centre of economic interests" is in Spain – if you earn more income or have more assets here than in any other single country, Spain is deemed the centre of economic activity.
- 3) Your "centre of vital interests" is in Spain – if your spouse/dependent minor children live here you are presumed Spanish resident, even if you spend less than 183 days here (unless you can prove otherwise).

It is more important than ever to take professional advice on your financial planning. If you spend time in more than one country or live in one country and have assets in another, it may be hard to determine where your taxes are due – but getting it wrong could prove

costly. From September 2018 the number of countries Spain receives automatic exchange of information under the Common Reporting Standard from increases from 49 to 102. Gibraltar began passing on financial information from September 2017, following the CRS rules.

# Marbella's foreign residents continue to prop up the town's falling birth rate

**MARBELLA.** In 2017, recorded population growth in the province of Malaga was highest within the municipalities of Marbella and Malaga. The number of registered residents in the Marbella area increased by 6,000 to 147,000. Of the new population, 5,000 are from mothers who come from outside Spain, which has meant that Marbella has experienced a far less pronounced fall in birth rate than in the rest of the province and in the country as a whole.

According to data from the National Institute of Statistics, the decrease in birth rate in the prov-

ince of Malaga last year was over six per cent. On the Costa del Sol, it was one per cent lower, as the number of recorded births at the Costa del Sol Hospital fell from 2,720 to 2,568 between 2016 and 2017.

However, the proportion of foreign mother giving birth at the

hospital has reached 37%. The largest group of foreign mothers continues to be those of Moroccan origin, followed by those from Latin American countries.

In private health clinics, this percentage is even higher. At QuirónSalud in Marbella, 50% of new mothers are of foreign origin,

according to head of Gynaecology, Francisco Jesús González. Here, alongside those of Moroccan and Latin American heritage, a large number of the new parents are from eastern Europe and the United Arab Emirates.

Though the Costa del Sol Hospital registered a one per cent in-

of those cases correspond to foreign mothers. This percentage has once more begun to grow.

crease in birth rate in 2016, this is considered to be an anomaly against the countrywide decline. The fall in the number of births is equally prominent at QuirónSalud, which recorded 496 births in 2016 and 442 in 2017. "Between January and May of this year we saw an average of 1.22 births per day, which we believe is an appropriate figure considering the drop in birth rates in the rest of the country," says Francisco Jesús González.

Marbella has experienced a decrease in birth rates for almost a decade and, like in the rest of Spain, the trend shows no signs of stopping, despite the increasing number of children born to foreign mothers in the area.

# More interviews held in long-running Triple A investigation

The well-known Marbella charity denies wrongdoing and has run as normal since allegations of fraud and malpractice were made against it in 2016

**MARBELLA.** It has been hanging over the high-profile and popular Triple A animal rescue charity in Marbella for over two years, but the ongoing legal investigation into a wide-range of possible irregularities in its running hasn't prevented the organisation from maintaining its care programme for abandoned animals, its close relationship with Marbella town hall or its fundraising activities.

On Monday, four of members of Triple A were called before an investigating judge to be formally interviewed over their part in managing the charity in 2016.

Two years ago Marbella was shocked when the Guardia Civil's environmental division, Seprona, raided the animal shelter run by the charity on the Ojén road. Four senior members were arrested, but subsequently released, and another 14

were placed under investigation.

Now, sources say, the long-running and complex investigation has reached a phase that is looking spe-

cifically at any possible financial irregularities and follows the delivery of a Guardia Civil report on the accounts of Triple A and paperwork

around the adoption programme of animals in other countries.

As well as the four members of Triple A, the two former employees who originally made the complaint against Triple A were also called for interview by the judge.

The Triple A organisation has strenuously denied wrongdoing since the allegations surfaced and members of the association and members of the public who donate have rallied around it ensuring it continues to carry out its work.

The charity has had the support of Marbella town hall, both under the previous three-way coalition and the PP administration that replaced it last year. The council recently agreed to renew its agreement and give 30,000 euros a year to support the charity's work in collecting stray and unwanted animals from the town's streets and trying to find new homes for them.

## Mayor of Marbella announces that local taxes, including IBI, will fall in 2019

**MARBELLA.** The mayor of Marbella, Ángeles Muñoz, has announced that municipal taxes, including the IBI, and local council fees will be lowered in 2019. It is expected that, despite the reductions, the council will see an increase in income next year.

The PP mayor made the announcement in the 'State of the Town' council meeting held on Thursday morning. Muñoz gave a positive assessment of her leadership in the nine months since she took over from the three-way coalition led by the PSOE party.

Among the initiatives announced by the mayor was the reduction in local taxation that will be offset with increased income from EU development funds, some 15 million euros, and further grants of 10 million euros. Both will be added into the 2019 budget which the mayor plans to approve as early as possible.

The mayor added that ongoing challenges for the council include ensuring public money lost in past corruption scandals is returned and the waiting time for planning applications is reduced.



## FLAG KISSING CEREMONY IN MARBELLA

Around 700 people took part in a flag-kissing ceremony last Sunday in Marbella organised so that members of the public who wished to could express their loyalty to Spain and the national flag. The event was held on the town's Alameda and was organised with the help of the Spanish Legion.

## New gastro-market ready to open

:: **CHARO MÁRQUEZ.** The new San Luis gastro-market in Estepona will open next week, town hall sources have said. It had been planned to open as early as Christmas last year but the need to carry out more repairs on the building, the town's previous main market hall, meant that the opening had to be delayed twice. Extra reinforcement work has meant that the budget to recondition the building rose from 600,000 euros to 1.6 million. Some 75 new jobs are expected to be created.

## Town to save 20% with low-energy bulbs

## Puigdemont stops the use of the 'Pig Demont' trade mark and logo

A Marbella businessman has been told he cannot use them for his online food business but he insists any resemblance is coincidental

**MARBELLA.** A company in Marbella has been told by the Spanish Patents and Trademarks Office it may not use the trademark 'Pig Demont', with its logo of a pig wearing spectacles and with abundant dark hair which bears a striking resemblance to Carle Puigdemont, the former president of the Generalitat of Catalonia.

The company, which sells Andalusian foods online, was reported by Puigdemont's lawyer, Jaume Alonso-Cuevillas, who said both the name and the caricature were offensive and that they had not been given permission to use them.

The Patents and Trademarks Office decided the use of the

name and logo was against the law, public order and good custom, because it alludes in an offensive manner to a former president of an autonomous community and part of society could object to it.

The business owner, Alberto López, says he has received insults and threats since the case appeared in the media and is upset by what has happened. He is appealing against the suspension of use of the brand name and logo.

He denies the claim that he has copied the image and name of Carle Puigdemont, although he admits that "there obviously is a similarity," but insisted that he has never said it was meant to be the Catalan ex-president.

According to López, the pig's name comes from the French 'du mont', meaning 'of the mountain'. "Puigdemont doesn't have the monopoly on that type of hairstyle; the logo isn't meant to be him. If he thinks a caricature of a pig looks like him, that's his problem more than mine," he said.

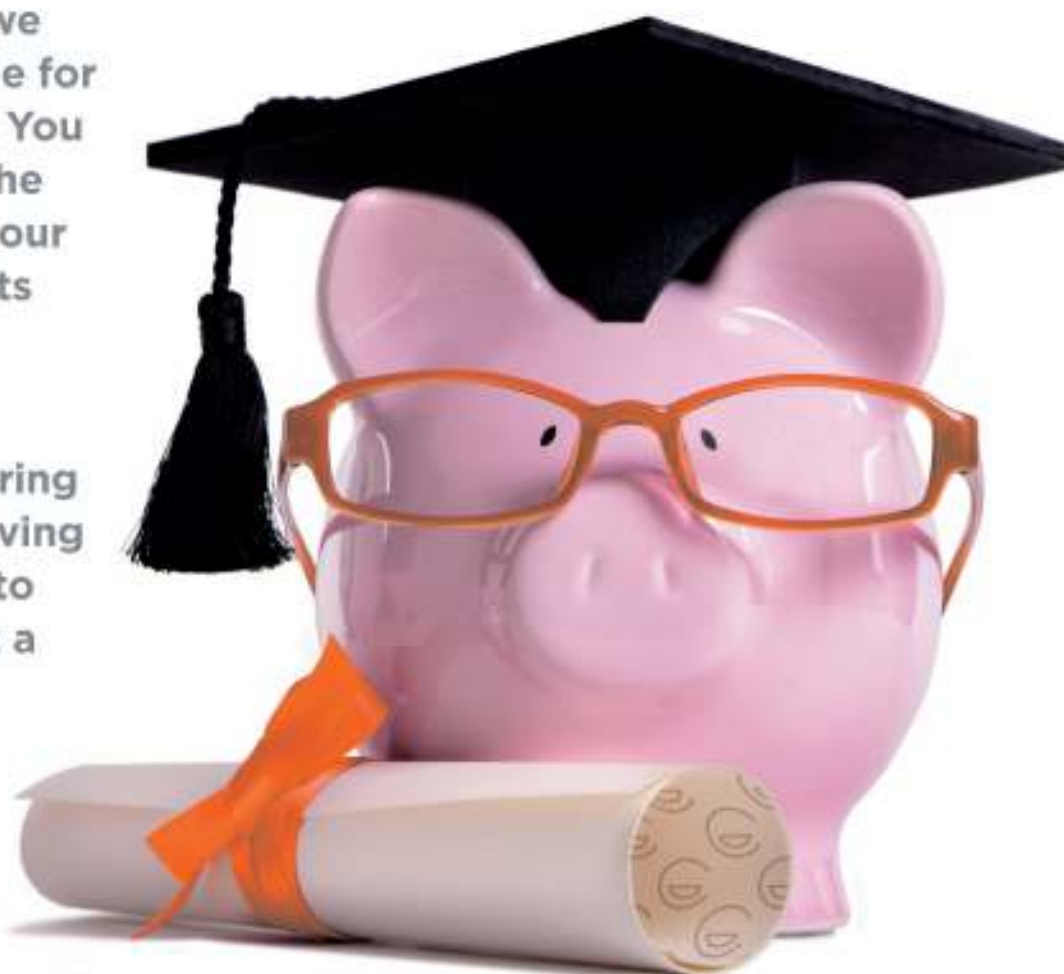

# James Quinn gets 22 years for his part in gunning down of Gary Hutch

The jury said it had not been proven he fired the shots in 2015 but confirmed that he was "a necessary participant"

**MÁLAGA.** The provincial court has sentenced James Quinn to 22 years for his part in the murder of fellow Irish national, Gary Hutch. Quinn's lawyer is expected to appeal.

Quinn was found guilty by jury for his role in Hutch's killing, however they did not consider it proven that he was the one who carried out the killing himself nor that he benefited from it financially and was part of an organised gang, as the prosecution had alleged.

The court's ruling explained that it had been proven that on the morning of 24 September 2015, Quinn, in conjunction with another person who has still not been identified and after being asked by another unknown person to end the life of the victim and in a premeditated plan, travelled with this aim and with the other person in a BMW X-3 to the home of Gary Hutch, in the Miraflores area of Mijas Costa.

Once there, while James Quinn kept watch inside the car, his unidentified accomplice went inside the development with two guns and waited for the victim in the car park, according to the sentence.

When a few moments later Hutch approached his vehicle, the attacker surprised him and started to shoot at him. Although at first the victim could escape along the pathway back into the development, the attacker chased after him, firing over 15 shots.

A key piece of evidence that linked Quinn to being at or near the

scene of the crime was DNA found on a baseball cap in the getaway car.

In the trial, Quinn had also been accused of being the gunman, but the prosecutor had offered the jury an alternative scenario that he had merely been in the getaway car as a "necessary participant".

Quinn has always denied his involvement, saying in court that he was in bed with a hangover and a prostitute when the killing occurred. He was also found guilty of holding an illegal firearm and ordered to pay 90,000 euros to the victim's family.

The group's first holiday development opened 35 years ago.



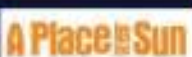

# Business Bootcamp connects international students with Malaga entrepreneurs

Dutch business students are partnering with local business owners in a mutually beneficial relationship that yields both practical and economic benefits

**MALAGA.** Dutch couple and business partners Joost Jong and Joyce van Ombergen-Jong first moved to Spain in 2008, intending to teach their native language to the locals. After the financial crisis hit, their plans changed and eventually they set up JongLeren.es, which helps (mainly) Dutch students to find internships in the Malaga area.

One branch of the JongLeren.es company is Malaga Business Bootcamp (MBB), a two-week programme in which groups of young Dutch students are tasked with helping Malaga businesses to develop and thrive whilst taking an intensive Spanish language course. About 150 students take part in the boot camp every year.

Last Friday saw the final presentations from the most recent iteration of MBB, wherein the groups laid their business plans out in detail and discussed the real impacts they had

made upon local establishments.

One group, paired with Apartamentos Cervantes' bike rental shop, created an attention-grabbing new logo for their client, along with a frequently asked questions sheet with translations between Spanish and English, to aid communication between the shop's owner and his many

foreign clients.

Another bike rental company, QQ Bikes, were presented with a slick new Instagram profile and advice on how to access the Dutch market more effectively.

Many of the local business owners attended the presentations, which took place at the Malaga business

school, which is based in the Tabacalera, and praised the students for their help. It was soon made clear that this programme is not simply to improve the Dutch students' CV; it creates a mutually beneficial relationship. "We live in Malaga and we want to contribute to it," says Joyce during an interview with SUR in

English. "Business owners get so much out of [the programme], an Instagram account, a new logo. Advice that they would normally have to pay for."

Over the past ten years, the couple have built up a strong network of local business contacts, so finding people for the students to work with is no challenge. Often, they needn't even ask, claims Joost: "We have a slowly growing list of entrepreneurs that want to participate."

The couple agree that the city of Malaga in particular is fertile ground for new business. "It's growing and it's innovative," explains Joyce. "There are lots of co-working spaces and startups in the area, whose leaders want to talk to students and pick their brains. They are young minds with new perspectives."

The MBB programme doesn't simply teach practical business skills, it allows European students to live away from home, cook for themselves and learn about a different culture. "There is less stress and expectation here than in Holland," says Joost. The couple estimate that about 80 per cent of the boot camp students return to Malaga within two years, be it for work or for holidays. "Students connect with the area."

The next step for the ever-expanding JongLeren.es is larger international participation. Though their student base is majority Dutch, MBB is conducted in English and is open to both students and non-students, worldwide. In fact, one participant at Friday's presentations was from Malaga itself.

# The balloon that flew from Malaga to Rabat

Little Ayla and her father released the balloon from Rincón de la Victoria and five months later received an email confirming its arrival in Rabat, Morocco

It was the grandmother of young Ayla, nearly two years old, who gave her granddaughter a balloon filled with helium last King's Day, one of many that are typically sold at fairs. The balloon had a drawing of Chase on it, the leading police dog in the popular Paw Patrol, one of the little girl's favourite cartoons. A few days later, when the balloon was starting to deflate, her father, Sandro Pizarro,

decided to carry out an experiment: "I was wondering how far the balloon would travel if we let it go, like when you throw a message in a bottle in the sea," he told SUR. He got to work and improvised a note: "We are experimenting as to how far the balloon will travel, if you find it please email us. Thank you," he wrote. "We covered the note in plastic and taped it onto the balloon. Then we let the balloon go from our balcony," explained the journalist and camera operator from Rincón de la Victoria.

Five months later, when the family had completely forgotten the whole episode, Sandro received an unexpected message via email with an attachment containing a photo of the balloon, complete with a note. The sender was a stranger who said that Chase has arrived in Morocco. The balloon had crossed the Strait of Gibraltar and had flown all the way to Sidi Allal Bahraoui, a city close to Rabat, a journey of over 400 kilometres. "It was a great surprise be-

cause a lot of time had passed since we'd released the balloon. We didn't think that anyone was going to reply," Sandro admitted. The balloon had arrived in Morocco twelve days after it was released in Malaga, Sandro worked out after exchanging a few emails with the recipient. As far as he knows, the person who origi-

nally found the balloon doesn't speak Spanish nor has an email address, and asked for help from the person who eventually sent the email. "It seems that the person who found the globe looked for a friend who could write in Spanish and who had an email address to reply to us," Sandro said. "I explained it to my daugh-

ter. She remembered the balloon but she is so small that I don't know if she has understood what happened. In any case it's a curious incident that I'll remind her about when she's a bit older," he said, smiling.

## Not the first time

Although it seems like an impossible journey for a balloon, the truth is that this isn't the first time that this has happened. There are registered cases in other parts of the world of balloons that have crossed oceans and even entire continents.

According to previous observations, these balloons tend to travel on their side and climb several kilometres into the sky before bursting due to atmospheric pressure. A few years ago, a German scientist developed software to simulate where a balloon would end up if released for children. According to his study, a helium balloon in optimal conditions can cover a distance of up to 3,000 kilometres.

## Luxury operator Ritz-Carlton includes Malaga as a stopover on its new cruise routes

**MALAGA.** Using a photo of Ronda's famous gorge, a luxury travel operator has included the Costa del Sol area in its new cruise brochure. The Ritz-Carlton Yacht Collection has recently been launched and Malaga features as one the Mediterranean ports to be used as a stopover from 2020.

The company has commissioned a special high-specification vessel 190 metres long that will take 298 passengers. Eventually it hopes to have three in its fleet.

A spokesperson for Ritz-Carlton said, "With several different itineraries, guests have the option of reserving consecutive routes without repeating ports so they can explore many more destinations and discover the culture in each port."

## Judge orders seizure of Invader street art

The colourful mosaics that appeared unexpectedly on buildings in Malaga cannot now be destroyed once taken down

**MALAGA.** A judge investigating the supposed damage to historical buildings because of eye-catching street art by French artist Invader has ordered them to be seized as evidence in a possible court case.

A year ago 29 artworks made up of mosaic pieces were put up overnight on buildings and walls around the centre of Malaga without permission. They were designed to look like icons from a Space Invaders game and the well-known artist has his works on buildings in 75 cities worldwide.

Although no official announcement was made as to why they were put up, locals believed it was linked to a planned exhibition by Invader at the city's CAC contemporary art gallery. However official permission had not been given and 15 were put up on listed buildings.

Following complaints, including from the Diocese of Malaga, after seeing a colourful Invader mosaic shaped like a girl in a red flamenco dress appear on the side of the Bishop's Palace, police were called in. Both the artist and the curator at CAC are under investigation.

While inquiries continue the judge has now told the owners of buildings where the mosaics appeared without their prior knowledge, who in parallel had been ordered to take them down at their own cost by the city council, not to throw the pieces away in case they are needed as part of a future court case.

## New mega cranes to sail into Malaga port today

## Work on new hotel tower to 'start in 2020'

:: JUAN SOTO. Malaga city council has given its provisional approval to changes to the town plan that will allow for the construction of a new tower housing a five-

star hotel in the port. The town hall cabinet approved a modification that allows a building 150 metres high and totalling 45,000 square metres to be built. Some opposition councillors are expected to object to the building next to the cruise terminal, so, if finally approved, work may not start until 2020 at the earliest.





# British investment in Andalucía focuses on construction, property and innovation

UK businesses have invested more than 250 million euros in Andalucía in the last five years

**MALAGA.** The UK is the European country that invests most in Spain (13.1% of direct foreign investment) and second in the world after the United States. In the last 25 years, Britain has invested 50 billion euros in this country.

These were some of the figures revealed this week at the presentation of the third edition of the Barometer on Climate and Outlook of British Investment in Spain carried out by the British Chamber of Commerce (BCC) in collaboration with Analistas Financieros Internacionales (AFI - International Financial Analysts).

On a regional level, the detailed study revealed that Andalucía is still one of British investors' favourite Spanish regions after the recovery from the financial crisis. In the last five years firms from the UK have invested more than 250 million euros in this region, more than 10% of all direct foreign investment.

The results of the study were summarised by AFI partner José Manuel Amor. He explained that British firms, in the case of Andalucía, are concentrated in the property and construction sectors with an investment flow of more than 100 million euros in the last five years. This contrasts with the trend in the rest of Spain where the investment in these sectors has fallen slightly.

British investment in Andalucía maintains around 13,000 jobs, according to the report's figures from the end of 2015.

Amor said that Andalucía still has some way to go to catch up with the investment made by British firms

in Madrid, Catalonia or the Basque Country.

Contrary to some predictions, British firms' commitment to investing in Spain has strengthened since the referendum in which the UK voted to leave the European Union.

The investment flow in 2017 was more than 3.1 billion euros, above the historical average (2.8 billion).

According to the expert from AFI, with these investment flows, "more employment will depend on British investors in Spain". The report calculates that more than 183,000 jobs in Spain are directly generated by British investment in this country.

The study also gauged the views and plans of the British firms with regard to their investments in Spain.

In 2017 their perception of Spain as an ideal location for investment improved slightly. Quality of life, supplier costs and financing conditions are the areas that were given the highest marks. Lower marks went to the country's investment in I+D+i, an area where British firms call for a greater commitment and effort on the part of the authorities.

Nevertheless 70% of firms that took part in the survey, said they plan to increase their investment in Spain (17% more than last year). The majority said they would be doing this in the short term (less than a year). Not one of the firms surveyed said that it would stop investing in this country.

## Close ties

The healthy commercial relations between the UK and Spain demonstrated by the report were confirmed in Malaga on Monday by Tim Hemmings, the Deputy Head of Mission at the British Embassy.

He pointed out that the relationship between the two nations goes back centuries and that now more than 58,000 Britons are registered as living in the province of Malaga.

"British investors have always been attracted by Malaga, by its culture, sport, climate and gastronomy," he said.

On the subject of Brexit, Hemmings expressed his hopes that the governments of the UK and Spain will strengthen their business relations.

"We are determined to achieve a trade deal that is as free as possible between Great Britain and the European Union," said Hemmings, who insisted on the need to maintain close financial ties.

The event, attended by the British Consul for Andalucía, Charmaine Arbouin, and the mayor of Torremolinos, José Ortiz, among other officials, ended with a discussion on the views of British firms in Spain regarding the current situation.

Taking part were Arturo Díaz, Executive Director Residential Spain at Savills Aguirre Newman; Salvador Arenere, executive at Intu Costa del Sol; and Marc Sanderson, Director of International Economic Development at Malaga city hall.

Arenere pointed out that the British shopping centre giant Intu planned to invest 3 billion euros in centres in Spain in the coming years. The future commercial and leisure centre in Torremolinos, he said, is set to become the firm's star project in Spain.

All three participants agreed that Spain ought to lighten its complex administrative procedures, and stressed the advantages of the Costa del Sol as a place for investment, due to its climate, quality of life, lower costs, good connections and technology park.

QUID  
PRO QUO



Just three weeks into his premiership, Pedro Sánchez is already experiencing the fruitlessly “quid-pro-quo” nature of modern Spanish politics. And unsurprisingly, his first headache is being caused by the fraught issue of regional financing - something that also troubled his predecessor, deposed Popular Party (PP) leader Mariano Rajoy.

In his first question-and-answer session in congress on Wednesday, Sánchez was criticised by an MP from Compromís, a leftist Valencia group, for backtracking on an earlier promise to address imbalances in Spain’s regional spending structures; Joan Baldovi said that, as it stands, the new Spanish government is “subsidising richer regions” just as Rajoy’s PP did.

Any MPs wanting the new Spanish prime minister to do something about this shouldn’t hold their breath, because re-

gional financing is one of many issues over which Sánchez has barely any room for manoeuvre. He is obliged to make sounds about addressing spending imbalances to retain the support of smaller parties on which his minority administration relies. But the elections due next spring in Andalucía, where the Socialists’ have one of their strongest support bases, severely restrict Sánchez’s options. Andalucía is one of the biggest beneficiaries of the present financing setup, so if the PSOE alters it, it risks losing the region’s support.

Regional funding was a thorn in Rajoy’s side, too. It was only by allocating extra cash to the Basque region that the former PP leader secured the Basque Nationalist Party (PNV)’s support for his 2018 budget; before that, the PNV had been withholding its votes because of Rajoy’s imposition of direct rule over Catalonia.

The Basques finally said “yes” to a spending plan that allocates their region around 540 million euros in subsidies, thereby enabling the 2018 budget to progress to the PP-controlled upper chamber. And how did the PNV say thanks to Rajoy for their generous budget allowance this year? By voting against him in the no-confidence vote tabled by Sánchez!

Indeed, it was precisely because Sánchez promised to keep Rajoy’s Basque-friendly budget if he became prime minister (even though his own party voted against it) that he won the PNV’s support for the no-confidence motion.

The absurdly delayed 2018 budget is likely to cause Sánchez’s next big headache. Outraged by the PNV’s Brutus-style tactics, the PP-dominated upper chamber is said to be considering amendments to the spending plan that reduce the Basques’ financial benefits. If that happens, the budget will be returned to the lower house for another vote.

Sánchez will then have to try and pass the new spending plan by selling it to his own minority government, which opposed it in the first place, and securing the votes of a party that suddenly has less money to play with than it first thought. Shouldn’t be too difficult, then.

Urdangarin chooses a jail  
with only female inmates

The King’s brother-in-law started his sentence on Monday

**MELCHOR SAÍZ-PARDO BRIEVA (ÁVILA).** The brother-in-law of the King, Iñaki Urdangarin, entered prison on Monday morning to begin his five-year - and-10-month jail sentence for fraud, embezzlement and tax

crimes. Last week Urdangarin saw his appeal chances run out in a Supreme Court ruling and has chosen, as is his right, a prison in Ávila (Castilla y León) from a shortlist. The jail is remarkable in that Urdangarin, who is married to King Felipe’s sister, Cristina de Borbón, will be the only male inmate, in his own wing. There are 95 other prisoners, all female, in other wings at the under-occupied centre.

# Trump receives royals and promises he'll come to Spain

Felipe VI told the American president that Europe is worried about the trade tariffs he has imposed on some goods

**WASHINGTON.** King Felipe and Queen Letizia have paid their first official visit to Washington DC since Donald Trump became US president.

Arriving at a rainy White House on Tuesday, they were welcomed by the President and First Lady, Melania Trump, ahead of a meeting in the Oval Office.

Speaking about the friendship between Spain and the US, Trump said, "Our relationship has been extraordinary over the years and especially so at the moment."

"Excellent relations in trade, military matters and almost everything else possible," he continued.

King Felipe told the president about the five-day visit he and his wife had been making to America, which began last week in New Orleans and San Antonio, two cities with a Spanish heritage that are celebrating their tercentenary. The King highlighted the shared history and "above all, the democratic values that we share".

A clear fan of Spain, Trump, who was also asked to visit by former prime minister, Mariano Rajoy, re-

peated his interest in visiting in the future as president. "We were there not so long ago and we loved it. The people are very special and it's a very beautiful country."

Trump avoided any mention of the Catalan independence question in Spain, unlike previously.

In his meeting with Trump, King

Felipe shared the concern of Spain's allies in the EU over the trade tariffs recently imposed on European steel and aluminium by the American administration, amid fears that the tariffs could be extended to more types of products. But he did not mention the president's controversial immigration policy.

## New government to go ahead with moving General Franco's remains

SUR

**MADRID.** The new PSOE Socialist government of Pedro Sánchez has lost no time in fulfilling its pledge to remove the remains of the former dictator General Franco from his ceremonial burial place in the mountains near Madrid.

The new prime minister confirmed that they will push for legislation before the next election in 2020 to exhume the dictator from

the Valle de los Caídos (Valley of the Fallen) and turn the large site into a neutral memorial to victims of both the Republican and Nationalist sides in the Spanish Civil War.

The complex was designed by Franco himself and includes the unmarked graves of some 34,000 victims from the 1936-39 conflict.

In the last Socialist government of José Luis Rodríguez Zapatero, steps were taken to start the proc-

ess, under Historical Memory laws, to return Franco's remains to his family, however the later conservative PP government had blocked the move, citing the "opening of old wounds". Sánchez has denied this will happen, saying the removal will be part of a healing process in a modern democratic state.

## Favourites emerge in race to take over as PP's new leader

Former deputy prime minister and ex-Defence secretary appear to have the best chance

**MADRID.** Seven candidates had put themselves forward to lead the Partido Popular (PP) party nationally when nominations closed at 2pm on Wednesday.

Delegates will choose at a special conference on 20 and 21 July who will take over following the resignation of Mariano Rajoy after recently being ousted as prime minister. However before the conference convenes, all party members will vote on either their majority choice or the top two candidates, in a complicated voting system.

Three candidates are already emerging as favourites. Former deputy prime minister, Soraya Sáenz de Santamaría, and former party general secretary and minister for Defence, María Dolores de Cospe-

Summer rental of  
private villas to  
groups of tourists

In response to your front page article from the June 15th to 21st edition about summer properties rentals: We live in Benalmádena Pueblo which is a beautiful Spanish village.

Our villa is in a very quiet residential 'urbanisation' consisting of families with children, retired and working couples of Spanish and other European nationalities.

We have lived here in this small cul-de-sac for the past 18 years, but, as always, things change and two years ago both the neighbouring villas have been sold to new owners.

The new owners of both the neighbouring villas use them for summer rentals and each villa can accommodate up to 8 to 10 adults, so now every seven days there is a change of occupancy.

The paying guests are either a large family group with small children or a large group of adults, so one week it is like living next to Mijas Aquapark, and the next is like living next to a disco/night club until the very early hours of the morning.

We cannot use our garden because of the noise in the day-

time; we cannot sleep because of the unruly drunken behaviour, both of which would not be tolerated by any hotel on the Costa. So why should this type of behaviour be acceptable on a previously quiet residential 'urbanisation'?

The village already has numerous motels, hotels and dedicated holiday apartments.

We have approached the property management company and spoken with the owners, but little has changed. We are told that if the situation gets too bad, contact the police!

We have had numerous conversations with the offending guests; this normally ends up with a lot of abuse and foul language. We have reported this to the 'urbanisation' administration office.

It is not just my family who are affected by these greedy property owners who are trying to make a fast euro; all the people in the surrounding villas are affected by the noise and disruption.

We did not buy our property to live in a holiday resort, and people thinking of buying into the Spanish lifestyle should be made aware of what they could be walking into.

## Equal footing

Speaking to soprano and human rights activist Barbara Hendricks last week prior to her concert at the Nerja Cave festival was both uplifting and depressing. On one hand, her positive attitude and confidence that citizen activism is making the world a fairer place are inspiring and have you itching to get up and join the next protest march that passes. On the other, it hammers home just how recent it was that black slaves were fighting for freedom and women were campaigning for their own individual voice instead of being

a possession of their husbands.

A look at the daily news reminds us that Barbara's generation hasn't been able to solve everything and that younger activists will need to continue the struggle for equality and human rights.

But, as Barbara says, we have to look around us and see all the good that is being done, the love and respect that rarely make the news.

We can also look around us and see hundreds of migrants getting off boats at the end of a long journey, relieved to be on dry land, but still unsure of what that land

has in store for them.

What they do know is that they have landed in the European Union, which Barbara so enthusiastically describes as an exciting adventure, the world's only union of nations based on human rights and peace. The Breainers could have used her help in their campaign two years ago.

At the moment though, what is uniting the world is football. Some of the planet's greatest sportsmen, black and white, rich and not so rich, all equal for 90 minutes, chasing after the same ball, following the same rules, in a competition for men, coached by men and refereed by men.

In 1921 the English FA banned women from playing football on its clubs' grounds as it was "quite unsuitable" for females. The ban was not lifted until 1971.

# The golden girls (and boys) of Almuñécar

Una Vida Buena is an association dedicated to setting up an alternative for its members as they age

Frances Gillard and Barbara Hartley have identified a building that already has a licence for over 55's accommodation

**ALMUÑÉCAR.** Most people will remember the 1980s US sitcom, the Golden Girls, in which a group of older women lived together in a large house and shared the trials and tribulations of ageing together. Move on 30 years and the concept of shared living, or 'cooperative housing', is becoming the norm in many countries as people are living longer.

A British couple are hoping to get what they believe is the first international over 55s housing cooperative in Spain off the ground. Frances Gillard and Barbara Hartley, who have lived in Almuñécar for 15 years, first came up with the idea around two years ago. "We started to question how immigrants to Spain manage in their later years, especially if they are on their own," explains Frances. She adds, "We found that there are lots of single people, especially women, living in quite isolated areas in the countryside around Almuñécar."

Inevitably the word Brexit comes up too and they explain that they have met people who have either returned, or are thinking of returning, to the UK in light of the uncertainty surrounding the final outcome for Britons living in other EU countries.

Una Vida Buena is currently op-

erating as an association and the couple, who worked as social care and education professionals in the north of England, are hoping to get cooperative status for their project. "Cooperatives have a special status in Spain," says Barbara.

Frances and Barbara have already identified a potential building for the cooperative and are waiting for the outcome of a report into the feasibility of the project. The complex boasts 55 apartments as well as communal spaces and already has a licence for over-55's accommodation, but the pair point out that it still needs a lot of work doing to it before anyone can move in. They

themselves hope to be two of the residents once it's up and running.

The couple explain that Spain is "way ahead of the UK" in terms of this type of living arrangement for older people. As Spanish culture changes, so is the way that the older generation are thinking about where – and how – to live in their older years. In the past parents and grandparents would have lived with younger members of the family. However, this is changing with the younger generations moving away from home for work and people living longer.

There are already a number of successful projects around the coun-

try, and at least three in Malaga province, including Residencia Santa Clara and Puerto de la Luz in Malaga city and Proyecto Residencial 51 in Antequera. What sets Una Vida Buena apart from those, say Frances and Barbara, is that the residents in the existing ones are all Spanish and are Spanish-run cooperatives.

"We already have members from Germany, the UK, Norway and Switzerland," says Frances. But they are keen to point out that they would like to get Spanish people on board as well. "We have had a lot of interest from members of Spanish cooperatives and Almuñécar town hall have been very supportive," they

say.

In fact in 2017 Una Vida Buena invited Aurora Moreno from the Residencia Santa Clara initiative to talk to them about her experiences. "Aurora and a group of friends and acquaintances in Malaga found a way to achieve their dream of having personal autonomy and planning for a dignified old age," states the report of that meeting. Santa Clara, which is located in the Montes de Málaga, was built from scratch and has 76 apartments, a swimming pool, chapel, hairdresser's and gym. There are also rooms for activities as well as on-site medical care facilities.

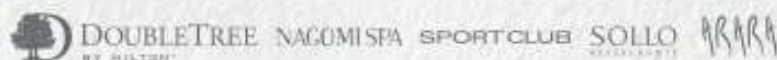

## The couple's vision for Una Vida Buena reflects the WHO's research into cooperative housing for older people

Another thing that makes Una Vida Buena different from other similar projects is that the building already exists. In the case of Santa Clara, the members had to build the complex. Barbara's and Frances's idea is that the building is not just used for the residents, but that the communal spaces can be opened up to community groups in Almuñécar. They are also clear that the place "will not be a nursing home or OAP residence" and that while neighbours will be encouraged to help each other and social events will be organised, individual autonomy and privacy is central to the vision.

Other points included in that vision are "to build a self-run, not for profit co-living community based on democratic decision making principles and create an environment to foster solidarity and communal self-help support with comfort and security."

This vision reflects the World Health Organisation (WHO) and other bodies' research into housing cooperatives for older people. The WHO questions the definition of health asking whether it is strictly based on a clinical definition of the word and highlights the importance of sense of community but also personal autonomy for older residents within its Global Network for Age-friendly Cities and Communities. The London School of Economics

## There are similar projects operating in Spain, northern Europe and North America

has also done research into the benefits of cooperative housing ventures in the UK and looked at a women-only scheme in north London. The global Cooperative Housing International Alliance states that in Spain the idea of cooperative housing schemes has actually been about since 1957 when the National Union of Housing Cooperatives was established. This was replaced in 1988 with the Confederacion de Cooperativas de Viviendas de España (CONCOVI); a national umbrella organisation for housing cooperatives.

Whether the Golden Girls really were early pioneers of housing cooperatives, or the idea has been growing in Spain since the 1950s, such initiatives appear to be flourishing, particularly in Europe and North America and Almuñécar's Una Vida Buena could just be the first international venture, at least in Spain.

#### REF. R. E. P.

My brother, who lived in Spain, sadly passed away one month ago. He was not married and had no children, and as far as I know, he lived in a rented apartment. He had a UK will, and the executor has got in contact with me to inform me that I am the sole heir. However we have discovered

that he only left debts. My financial situation is not good at the moment. Do I have to take charge of the debts, or can I refuse to pay them?

Inheritances can be rejected, but they can also be accepted with the heir obliged to pay the debts only with the assets inherited. Therefore, if the debts were higher than the value of the assets, they would be paid only up to what the assets covered, and nothing more. In order to give you a more accurate answer on whether it would be advisable to accept the inheritance or reject it, it would be necessary to make an inventory of the assets.

#### REF. P. O. T.

Our neighbours have installed air-conditioning and they have mounted the external unit on the wall next to their window, in the well of the building. At first it didn't bother us at all, but the point is that the unit makes a lot of

noise, so much that we can hardly sleep even with the window closed. We have spoken with them, and to our knowledge they have not asked for the community's authorisation to install it. They say that as they have mounted it on the well and not on the façade of the building, that they did not need permission from the community. Is that true?

No, it isn't. According to Spanish law, the wells of the buildings are common elements and belong to all the owners of the building. None of them can, without authorisation from the rest, make alterations of any kind. Therefore, installations are not forbidden, but they require the permission of the owners to be carried out. If an owners' meeting is called and the owners do not approve the installation, your neighbours will have no other option than to take it down.

# Discovering an inherited home

Thousands emigrated from Malaga to Hawaii in 1907 to find work. Susan Tavares, one of their descendants, has travelled to Cuevas de San Marcos to search for her family

**MALAGA.** Martha Fernández always wanted to visit Malaga, but she never got the chance. However, when she died in Maui (Hawaii) in August 2016, her dreams were passed down to the next generation: her daughter, Susan Tavares-Kenney. Almost 13,000 kilometres away from Hawaii, Malaga is the distant European home of her ancestors.

Susan had been told that, in 1907, her great grandparents María and Esteban had been part of the passage of the ship SS Heliópolis, which left the port of Malaga carrying thousands of Andalusians who were to work on sugar cane plantations on the Pacific island. When Martha realised that she was too old to make the trip to discover her roots, she asked her daughter. "She asked me to bring her a shell or a pebble from the coast of Malaga," explains Susan, who, as part of the fourth generation of the Benítez Molero family, has come to the Cuevas de San Marcos to search for traces of her heritage and the land that her mother was desperate to see.

Susan Tavares-Kenney's story began more than a century ago, when poverty and economic difficulties forced her great grandparents to abandon their hometown in the province of Malaga. María and Esteban got married in 1889, but life in the countryside kept them on the brink of poverty. The couple moved to Cadiz for a more prosperous future. Next, they went to Chiclana de la Frontera and Fuengirola, where, in 1901, they had their fifth child, Rosario Benítez Molero, Susan's

grandmother. In 1907, they returned to bid farewell to their family. Esteban and María had decided to embark on a trip to Hawaii, which promised a better future for themselves and their five children. "That was the last time they saw their family. They put all their belongings in a trunk and set off on a journey that would change their lives and that of their descendants forever," describes the American, who never knew her great grandparents.

Susan did, however, meet her grandmother, Rosario. "She told me that her parents, Esteban y María,

and their siblings were from Malaga and so I began thinking about my place of origin," said Susan, who has memories of her grandmother telling stories in English, with "sprinklings of Spanish" in between.

During the journey to Hawaii, Rosario was barely six years old, but she remembered the "large ship" on which they travelled and a few scenes of a Spain gone by, where "women washed their clothes in streams and fountains with large brown cakes of soap that would blister their hands". Memories of misery and a lack of resources also marked the mind of the young emigrant, who recalled having seen "a mother dipping a rag in some coffee mixed with a little milk and then wetting her baby's lips to soothe it."

## "We are family"

A graduate in Library Studies from the University of Hawaii, the great granddaughter began to trace her heritage using the internet and digital archives. It was there that she found the full name of her great grandfather, Esteban María Benítez Gómez, on a family tree. She sent an email to the author of the document, Concepción Terrón, in which she spoke of her search for family members in Malaga after her ancestors left for Hawaii in 1907. "She replied the following day with excitement, saying: 'We are family'," recalls Susan, who had just found her third cousin. From then, she knew a trip to Spain was inevitable.

A few weeks ago, Susan Tavares finally saw the Malaga that she had spent many years thinking about. "I was amazed at the buildings lining the coast. This was not the same sight my family had when they left in 1907," says the woman, who, together with

her husband, Marty Kenney, has gone through an emotional experience which is difficult to put into words. In Malaga, she met with José Mateo, author of a blog about Cuevas de San Marcos, who provided Susan with facts and details before she began her trip, along with Miguel Alba, author of the book, 'SS Heliópolis. La primera inmigración de andaluces a Hawái 1907', who has also helped this descendant of María and Esteban to find the missing pieces to her family history puzzle.

## Walking the same streets

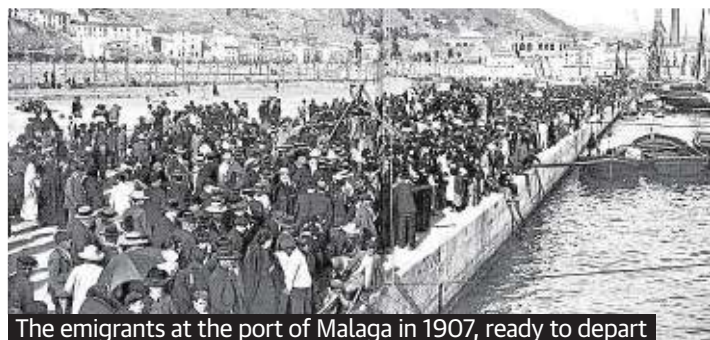
After getting to know the city and the port from which her great grandparents departed, Susan and Marty moved on to Chiclana, the home of her cousin Conchita Terrón. "We hugged and cried. This wasn't just for us, it was for our deceased relatives," she explained, clearly emotional. Together, they confronted the last and most important step of the journey: the return to Cuevas de San Marcos. Susan could never have imagined what would be waiting there.

"They received us with hugs and kisses on the cheek - as is custom in Spain - and councillor Ana Doblado came to greet us." Susan was told that many of the welcome-party were cousins of hers. Afterwards, they took her to see the house where her great grandfather was born and the modest residence in which he lived with María after their wedding. "It had not been refurbished, so I could get a real idea of what their home was like," she remembers. The American says she feels "privileged to walk the same stone streets as her grandparents and their children".

The visit was celebrated with a very crowded lunch, in which Susan Tavares Kenney met many of her 'new' cousins, like Antonio Benítez and Antonio Terrón, who served as a translator between English and Spanish. It was a welcome that the prodigal daughter could never have imagined. Her Spanish family members have asked that she learn their language for her next visit, which is planned for summer 2019. "I felt like I was coming home," said Susan. This sense of home will accompany her back to Hawaii, along with photos and the shells that she promised her mother.

# "Women's voices are refusing to be silenced"

Her voice, which filled the Nerja Cave last Saturday, comes with a message in defence of human rights. But she insists: "Music does not replace real citizen activism"

**MALAGA.** Barbara Hendricks uses her powerful voice to perform opera, gospel or blues but she also raises it to cry out against injustice, to warn against populism and to urge on the feminist movement. The US-born soprano with Swedish citizenship is an activist by word and deed, as Goodwill Ambassador for UNHCR. In fact it was her voice and her commitment that won her the Prince of Asturias Prize in 2000. For Hendricks (Arkansas, 1948), music and the de-

fence of human rights are one and the same. To open this year's International Music and Dance Festival, she broke the daunting silence of the Nerja Cave with The Road to Freedom, a programme of gospel songs, blues and spirituals which inspired the fight against slavery and racial segregation in the United States.

**-The Road to Freedom looks back at the fight for human rights led by Martin Luther King. 50 years later, is the fight still going on?**

-Absolutely. It's going on, it's going on everywhere and it's more important today than it has been in my lifetime. Today we are facing on a global level the fight for justice for solidarity - the same fight Martin Luther King was leading.

**-After the recent cases of police brutality in the States, might it be fair to say that we're going backwards on this issue?**

-No, I don't think so. The news emphasises everything that is wrong, but I think that on a global level we're advancing as a human race. There are more people who are aware of human rights - just look at the situation of women. It's very, very bad in many countries but it is mov-

ing slowly in the right direction. If we stand back and look at some of the things that don't become newsworthy, we see people showing love and solidarity all over the place, but they don't make the news. With the American presidency now we have someone who hogs the 24-hour news cycle with his antics and who is also a great inspiration for the forces of hatred and separation and isolation and so he sucks all of the air out of the planet, not just out of the room. So everyone is focused on that kind of news and I do think we are constantly moving forward. But the fight is not over until the last breath has been breathed.

**-What can music do in the middle of all this?**

-During the civil rights movement music played an important role, just by inspiring people and giving them courage. They would meet in the church and they would start marching and singing and when they were being beaten they continued to sing. Music was a force that made the blows less painful. Music can remind us that we all belong to the same family which is called humanity. It goes past our heads and into our hearts and makes us vibrate together and just for a little while we realise that somehow we're more alike than we're different. Art has that power

because it is the expression of our human condition and when we recognise that we share a human condition we become better people. If music could stop wars and change the world all we'd have to do is go to a big concert and everything would be fine, but it is a part of the struggle - it does not replace real citizen activism.

**–You once said that being an activist is every citizen's obligation. Do you think people need to be more demanding with their politicians?**

–Of course, because the reason they become lazy and unresponsive to their duties is because we are not demanding. We've been very lucky; I'm old enough to be a part of that blessed generation after the Second World War when we lived in a time of growth. When I graduated from university my friends could just look in the paper and pick and choose the jobs. It was a positive time, with the civil rights movement, the continuation of the women's movement, there was hope. But just before 9/11 the world took a change and I see young people in their 20s today still have enthusiasm but the world is not the easy place it seemed to us. Democracy is no stronger than we are, and because we are not perfect democracy is not perfect, but we have to continue to make it work if it's going to survive. And we just can't say, 'OK, now we've arrived' and sit back; that's when things start to go wrong. We have to stay awake and be willing to take a stand. We're not pushing our politicians to do what we've elected them to do so they get lazy and comfortable, but it is our job to remind them that they work for the citizens.

**–Populism and far-right groups are getting stronger in Europe. Italy is the latest example. Does that worry you?**

–It worries me but in my opinion Italy has been chaotic since the Second World War, their political system has always been full of corruption. I stay positive because I'm a mother and a grandmother and I want the world to be a better place for my children. The food of populism is fear, it would not survive without fear. And the media has a part to play because fear also sells papers, it sells television shows. And so the populists have built-in help as it's so easy to make people feel fearful, and that fear becomes hatred and rejection.

**–You've lived in Europe since 1976. How do you see Donald Trump's government from a distance?**

–Now fortunately, or unfortunately, it's as if you were there, with the internet, so much so that I have to put it off because no-one should know what Donald Trump does every day. I'm a Swedish citizen and I think the EU is a wonderful adventure that I wanted to be part of. It is the only union of nations that has ever been developed and founded based on the principles of human rights and peace and I find that so extraordinary.

**–What do you think about Spain taking in the migrants refused by Italy?**

–Well isn't it funny - just a bit more

than a week earlier Spain had a different government that probably would not have done that. My mother always said, the Lord works in mysterious ways. Italy says no and Spain comes and fills the gap. As I said, a week earlier we wouldn't have been able to imagine that there would be another government in Spain and that would be composed mostly of women - it's extraordinary.

**–Women are saying enough is enough in all sectors with the #Me-Too movement. Have you found yourself in an uncomfortable situation for being a woman?**

–Not as a soprano, no. I've always sought out personal relationships based on mutual human respect and if that was not there then that relationship ceased. Women's rights begin at home like any other human right. I've been greatly inspired by this women's movement and I think that it is going to be at the forefront of the resistance against the populism that is happening right now. I think women are going to be playing the most important roles. Women's voices are refusing to be silenced. This movement goes across from left to right. Women on the left and women on the right in politics have been exposed to the exact same obstacles. It is something that is very uniting. Women with different ideas are able to talk and acknowledge our differences and be able to find solutions.

**–For many opera is still an elitist art. How can we change that idea?**

–By making it accessible. Making it possible for kids to realise that opera started out as a very popular music form. It was the pop music of the time. It's now put in museums but it's a living art form. For a child not to know who Mozart is is poverty of education.

# Marbella plays Florida in the UK's hit series 'Living The Dream'

**The production company decided to use the Costa del Sol rather than move everything to the USA for this series**

**MARBELLA.** For those who may not know, 'Living The Dream' is the TV series of the moment in the UK. It is about the Pemberton family, a couple with two children who decide on a radical change of life, leaving behind their home in Yorkshire and moving to Florida, in the USA, to set up their own business: a caravan park.

The first season was filmed entirely on the other side of the Atlantic, but for the second one the producers decided to look for somewhere in Spain which would look like Florida but cost much less in terms of logistics and money.

"It's not just the financial cost, it's an operational matter. It is not the same to move the logistics to America as it is to Spain. Everything is much easier here," says Carlos Durán, the head of locations at the production company.

The Florida the viewers will see in the second season - which will be shown early next year - was actually on the Costa del Sol. Filming has been taking place between Málaga and San Roque (in Cadiz province) and in the 12 weeks of work Marbella, halfway between the two, has become the major beneficiary of a production which has a budget of between six and eight million euros: that's over one million euros per episode.

"It is the biggest major production to come to the Costa del Sol this year, after Snatch," says Carlos, emphasising the length of the filming period, which started on 9 April and will end on 29 June.

The six episodes in the series were divided into two parts for filming.

Each had a different director. The first focused on Sotogrande and San Roque.

The Living The Dream team (150 people, who use 50 vehicles for the equipment) made Marbella the centre of activity for the second phase of their work. Several locations were chosen to portray Florida, where the Pembertons live: the beach at San Pedro Alcántara, Puente Romano, the coastal path at El Pinillo, the offices of the Tembo company (turned into the mayor's office in the story), the Guadalpín secondary school (used as the police station) and the Bellamar

school. Earlier this week, the filming took place in a luxury newly built villa in Guadalmina Baja, which the production company rented from the Marbella company Rhoner Property and used as the home of the main character's posh friend, a passionate golf enthusiast who opens the doors of his mansion to Mal (Philip Glenister) and his wife Jen (Lesley Sharp), the famous couple from the series.

The house has a constructed area of 163 square metres, swimming pool, six bedrooms, nine bathrooms, a cinema and even an indoor garden in the wine cellar, and those are just a few of the features of the residence (which is for sale for around eight million euros) selected by the British production team. It is in one of the most exclusive areas and situated just opposite the villa owned by former Spanish prime minister José María Aznar.

"We looked at various houses,

and this was the one we chose," says Carlos Durán. "We spent a few days here filming some of the first part, and then the director wanted to come back," he explains.

### Moving around

Moving the equipment needed for the series, which is shown on Sky 1 in the UK, involved close coordination with the local authorities. Not only were permits needed, but they also had to find space to deposit equipment, material and items for the administrative work.

Several offices at the Single Home building at the entrance to Marbella were used, and an area for the props. A warehouse unit on the San Pedro industrial estate became an improvised storage facility.

"The Marbella tourism department was great. They went to great efforts to help us and made things much easier by centralising everything through the Marbella Film Office, which coordinated the different town hall departments," says Carlos.

In Málaga city a few days ago, the series turned the Teatinos university campus into an American institute.

Will the adventures of the Pemberton family be returning to Marbella? That will depend on the audiences, it seems, although the actors have signed up for three seasons.

# Taking business a little less seriously

## Entrepreneurs laugh at their own shortcomings at Fuckup Night in Malaga

**MALAGA.** Fifty entrepreneurs, employees and students based on the Costa del Sol gathered in Malaga last week to share business experiences. There were no success stories, however; the speakers had gone along to share their failures.

The event was part of the international Fuckup Nights movement, which began as a group of friends in Mexico talking about their failed companies over a beer. Now, 120 cities around the world hold regular events where entrepreneurs can network and listen to others tell them where they went wrong in the past.

This was the third Malaga Fuckup Night, held at the Living Room co-working space in the city centre. Organiser Julia Sycheva works in sales and marketing but hopes one day to set up her own business.

"Running the event is great for me because I get to hear about what not to do in the business world," she told SUR in English. She has lived and

worked around Europe and went to her first Fuckup Night in the Czech Republic. She enjoyed it so much that she decided to get involved in the Malaga edition.

The first speaker was Living Room co-founder Ben Kolp, originally from Austria. He explained how he had decided to set up his own business, Orca Social, with two former colleagues

four years ago. The business was designed to facilitate commercial connections between large B2B companies. He admitted that one of his biggest mistakes was trying to "marry" together all three of them, admitting that he spent a lot more time with his colleagues than he did his actual partner. Luckily for Ben, he had enough of a financial cushion to be

his 15 telesales employees in order to cut costs, thinking that the business would be as successful using the fledgling internet. This proved to be a disaster and the business soon failed.

"I still believe in the idea in principle," he said, "It's just that reality doesn't always live up to your expectations."

Brenda Padilla Ericksen, an American cross-cultural trainer, had gone along to share her experiences with public speaking. She told the story of one of her first jobs, to produce a presentation on anti-ageing treatments for a panel of businesswomen. The presentation that she put together was very critical of the industry; "I realised that it was all just a scam," she said, but her audience clearly disagreed and were soon laughing and talking over her. The experience turned out to be a one-day blip in Brenda's successful public speaking and radio career, and she went on to found the Malaga branch of Toastmasters.

The Living Room has recently been given the Members' Choice Award as the best coworking space in Malaga by Coworker.com. Since 2015, more than 100 freelancers and start-ups from over 20 countries have shared the space in Malaga.

# Luminous Shasta daisies

**Daisies are always popular and the Shasta daisy is probably the best of them all, with sturdy stems and large flowers**

Commonly called the Shasta daisy, *Leucanthemum x superbum* was hybridised by Californian Luther Burbank in his quest to find the whitest flower possible - one that would reflect the moon's glow in the evening and look luminous. He crossed a Japanese daisy with an American one and the result was

named after the snow-capped Shasta Mountain.

*L. x superbum* Becky is one of the best cultivars; it flowers a little later than others and has the largest flowers. However there are many others: some

are doubles such as the German Christine Hagemann, others have twisted and frilly petals such as Belgian Lace and there are even yellow forms such as *L. x superbum* Gold Finch.

Shasta daisies need moist, rich soil but are drought resistant for short periods once fully established. Situations with partial shade or one that receives some shade during the afternoon are preferable to ones in full sun.

The daisies will form a clump about 60cm high and although the flower stems are sturdy, they may need staking in exposed areas. The clump can be divided in alternate years to produce more plants or the seeds can be collected and sown in early spring.

Dead-heading before seed is produced will prolong the flowering period which starts in late spring and continues through until autumn. As the flower forms on a single stem, the stem should be cut off at the base once the bloom goes over.

In cold inland areas, frost may kill the top growth which can then be cut back. Mulching will help to protect the root ball but Shasta daisies are very hardy and should survive a hard frost.

Shasta daisies have a pungent smell that some people find off-putting but they are ideal for borders and bedding or in containers, attracting lots of pollinating insects to the garden.

## GARDENING HINTS

## Taking cuttings

Summer is the ideal time to take semi-ripe cuttings. This type of cutting is usually hard at the base but still soft and flexible at the tip. Plants suitable for propagating this way are lavender, buddleia, box, coleus, pelargoniums, star jasmine (*Trachelospermum*), Philadelphus, Solanum, Forsythia and Salvia. Cuttings 5-10cm long should be taken early in the morning and placed immediately into a plastic bag to

preserve moisture. Remove the lower leaves and dip the base of it in hormone rooting powder or liquid if you have it. Several cuttings can go in each pot; the soil should be a gritty mix of compost and sand or vermiculite. Cover with a plastic bag and place somewhere light but not in full sun. With some luck the cuttings should start to show signs they have taken in about three weeks.

An eventful day for England and Spain in the Mexico World Cup

The 1986 World Cup in Mexico is famous for two phenomena in world football. The first is the Mexican wave, an effect resembling a moving wave produced by spectators in a stadium standing up, raising their arms, lowering them, and sitting down again in turn. The second is Argentina's victory over England. The World Cup was originally going to be hosted by Colombia but in November 1982, four years before the World Cup was due to start, the South American nation withdrew its bid due to financial difficulties. FIFA Executive Committee officials then voted unanimously for Mexico.

On 22 June, as Felipe González was winning his second term as prime minister in the general election back home, the Spanish na-

tional team was knocked out in the quarter finals. They faced Belgium, one of the favourites to win the tournament, which had two players included in the FIFA All-Star Team, goalkeeper Jean-Marie Pfaff and midfielder Jan Ceulemans. Ceulemans scored in the 35th minute and it looked as if the match would be decided by that one goal until Juan Antonio Señor managed to equalise in the 85th minute, much to the delight of La Roja fans. After extra time, the match came down to a penalty shootout which Belgium won 5-4 after Eloy failed to score against Pfaff. Strangely, the result in the tournament (8th) was better than their performance at the previous World Cup, which was hosted in Spain itself (12th).

On the same day, England faced Argentina in another quarter-final. Argentina's 2-1 victory is remem-

bered for the two goals from Diego Maradona which would ultimately settle a contest simmering with political overtones. Four years earlier, Britain and Argentina had fought in the South Atlantic over the Falkland Islands, which ended in defeat for Argentina. Six minutes into the second half, a mis-cued clearance from England's Steve Hodge fell towards Maradona. England goalkeeper Peter Shilton came out of his goal to punch the ball



clear. Maradona reached for the ball with his outside left hand. The ball went into the goal. Referee Ali Bin Nasser of Tunisia claimed he did not see the incident and allowed the goal.

Argentina's second goal would be voted 'Goal of the Century' in 2002. Maradona began a 60-yard, 10-second dash towards the England goal, passing four English out-field players: Peter Beardsley, Peter

Reid, Terry Butcher (twice) and Terry Fenwick. Maradona finished the move with a feint that made England goalkeeper Peter Shilton fall over, before slotting the ball into the net to make the score 2-0 to Argentina. England then brought on two strikers but Gary Lineker could only score a consolation goal.

The tournament was won by Argentina, who were world champions for the second time after defeating West Germany 3-2.

## All the wards at the Costa del Sol hospital to get new furniture

The Andalusian health service has spent 1.3 million euros on the new beds, armchairs and tables for the bedrooms and Emergency Department

### ■ SUR IN ENGLISH

**MARBELLA.** The Costa del Sol Hospital in Marbella is currently in the process of replacing the furniture in all its rooms, including electrically operated beds, armchairs and tables. The existing items of furniture will be recycled.

It is costing 1,367,581 euros to replace this furniture in all the wards of the hospital, including the Emergency department.

The provincial delegate for Equality, Health and Social Policies, Ana Isabel González, was given a tour of the hospital by its manager, Torcuato Romero, this week to see how the modernisation is going. It began at the end of May and is expected to be completed very soon, but has not affected the normal working of the hospital.

"The new equipment offers more comfort, safety and mobility in the rooms for patients and their families, and also for the hospital staff. We apologise if anyone has felt inconvenienced, but the result will be a considerable improvement for everyone," said Ana Isabel González.

The new beds can be adjusted to a variety of positions, so they will be more comfortable for patients and also make it easier for nurses and doctors to carry out procedures and treatments.

The beds can be adapted according to patients' weight and height, and can be extended by 15 centimetres if required. The headboard and footboard are removable, giving staff better access where needed. The controls are clearly marked and easy for the patients to use.

From a safety point of view, the new beds include a function which minimises pressure on the patient's pelvic area, reducing the possibility of bed sores for immobile patients. They are also fitted with safety bars to prevent falls, and a nightlight which can be activated by the patients or their relatives.



The new furniture is the latest in a series of improvements. ■ SUR

The mattresses are of visco-elastic material and designed to support the spinal column in its natural position.

The bedside table is designed to offer the patient independence and is easy to manoeuvre. The drawers are also easily accessible from both sides. The armchairs are 180° reclinable and the arms and footrests can be adjusted for comfort.

The hospital management is training staff on how to move and

operate the new items of furniture, and has also produced explanatory videos which can be watched by patients on the TVs in their rooms.

This is the latest improvement to be carried out by the hospital. In recent years, phenolic screens have been installed to protect the walls, the call system by which patients can request assistance from staff has been replaced and the fire detection system has also been renewed, among other projects.

## New site chosen for the prefabricated units at San Pedro health centre

**MARBELLA.** For more than a month San Pedro town hall and the Costa del Sol Health District have been looking for a new location for the prefabricated units which currently house consulting rooms at the health centre in San Pedro. They will have to be moved so the new one can be built.

It hasn't been an easy task and several possibilities were ruled out but the provincial Health delegate, Ana Isabel González, says the decision has now been made and a site has been selected not far away from the existing health centre. Once the paperwork has been completed the units will be moved straight away and the works on the new facility can begin. The units are likely to be transferred to their new location over a weekend, to reduce the inconvenience caused to patients.

The new health centre will be on the same site as the present one but will be three times as big. The project is costing 4.6 million euros and should be completed some time next year.

## Alzheimer's charities swap experiences in a fact-finding visit thanks to an online meeting

Dr Kelly Hall from Birmingham University was on the Costa this week to assess the impact of the new Support in Spain website service for British residents over 55

### :: SUR IN ENGLISH

**MALAGA.** The project leader of a recently launched online directory to help UK expatriate residents over 55 was on the Costa del Sol this week to see the impact it is having on local community life.

Dr Kelly Hall, of the University of Birmingham School of Social Policy and who instigated the new Support in Spain website in partnership with the British Consulate in Malaga, was meeting with local charities that have been using it to help their work, including Age Concern, Red Cross, AV-ISA interpreters in the Axarquía and local Alzheimer's groups.

Dr Hall explained, "The Support in Spain website launched last autumn as a directory of organisations helping British residents over 55 and other people who may be

in a vulnerable situation. We wanted to put all information in one place, including both Spanish-run and expat-run services, helping people find support since of-

ten different organisations don't know the others exist. We've had 8,000 visitors to the site so far who are searching for everything from information on residency and get-

ting disabled parking badges to the addresses of their local town halls, charities or health centres."

"One positive result of the Support in Spain website is that groups

with similar interests and activities are finding out about each other for the first time," added Dr Hall. This is the case of groups supporting Alzheimer's and dementia sufferers. This week she was able to witness first-hand how established Alzheimer charity, AFA Benalmádena & Torremolinos was able to open its doors to a group of expatriate residents who are establishing their own Alzheimer's support group on the Costa for English-speaking sufferers and their families called Alzheimer's & Dementia Support International (ADSI). Both groups got in touch with each other through the Support in Spain website initiative.


Visiting AFA at its Arroyo de la Miel day centre along with Dr Kelly Hall on Wednesday were Jacqueline Claxton-Smith and Rebecca Flowerdew of newly born ADSI, which aims to help families with Alzheimer's sufferers in the area between Sotogrande and Marbella.

Both Jacqueline and Rebecca explained that they were encouraged to launch their support group for English-speaking residents after their personal experiences with their own family members who

lived in Spain.

“Unless you have been through it, it’s hard to explain what it is like looking after an elderly relative with Alzheimer’s. You lose your day-to-day life,” Rebecca explained. “There is very limited social care available in the Spanish system so we really want to provide a help group, and eventually a respite centre, for other English-speakers who are going through what our families did.” So far ADSI has been organising regular coffee mornings and is about to become a registered charity.

#### A motivating visit

Both Jacqueline and Rebecca agreed that the visit to AFA in Benalmádena was inspiring, seeing the work of the established day centre in action. “It’s motivating to see that the people who founded AFA were also driven by their family experiences like we were at ADSI,” said Jacqueline.

AFA Benalmádena, part of the AFA network of Alzheimer’s help centres in Spain, of which there are 16 in Malaga province, has been providing support to local families for over 20 years.

Discussing how this AFA centre

operates, clinical psychologist Lucía Yeves Leal explained that English-speaking patients and their families are welcome to take advantage of the facilities and experience. “We often have users who are originally from other countries and who are suffering from Alzheimer’s, whether they attend the day centre or just pop in to chat for a few hours. We speak English and it is very emotional to see the relief on a family member’s or carer’s face when they realise that there is

someone here at AFA whom they can share experiences with.”

Now the AFA Benalmádena team has an ambitious new goal of their own after two decades which is to build on a fresh site in Arroyo de la Miel that will allow patients to stay overnight and so give respite relief to family carers.

President of the centre, Mari Cruz Azuaga, said, “The two-million-euro project already has most funding promised from the local authorities but we are relying on fundraising to make up the difference before construction can start.” A campaign has been launched called ‘Construye Memoria’, (build memory, hashtag #ConstruyeMemoriaAFAB), and there will be a fundraising singing competition in La Paloma park, Arroyo, on 7 July.

Reflecting on the meeting between AFA Benalmádena and ADSI, Kelly Hall of Support in Spain said, “This is a perfect example of how established Spanish charities and new English-speaking groups can share experiences to improve the lives of vulnerable local residents. We’re pleased the new Support in Spain website was able to bring them together.”

# The WHO now recognises addiction to videogames as a mental disorder

Transsexuality has been removed from the mental illness section in the updating of the Classification of Diseases

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has excluded transsexuality as a mental illness and incorporated abusive use of videogames as a behavioural disorder in the first update of its International Classification of Diseases for nearly 30 years, which was published this week.

After 11 years of work, the WHO has decided that transsexuality, as a gender identity disorder, should be removed from the section of mental illnesses - something that LGBT associations have been demanding for years - and included in the section of sexual behaviours.

This way, it remains within the classification so that when a person seeks medical help they obtain it, because in many countries, if the diagnosis is not included on the list, neither the state nor private health system will fund the treatment.

"We want people with these conditions to be able to obtain medical assistance when they need it," Shekhar Saxena, the director of the WHO's Mental Health and Substance Abuse department, told the

press conference.

Another important modification to the classification is the inclusion of videogames in a new disorder, that of pernicious "gaming", which is now included in the same list as the harmful activity of betting.

"We included the disorder of addictive gaming after analysing the small amount of evidence we had and after listening to a Scientific Committee which suggested that this new phenomenon should be included as an illness which can and should be treated," stressed Saxena.

That lack of empirical data was one of the reasons to include this

disorder in the list, because all the information which was analysed pointed in one direction, but the WHO wanted to make sure and evaluate it properly.

In fact, the WHO estimates that between two and three per cent of those who play videogames suffer from abusive and pernicious behaviour, but it wants there to be scientific certainty. Also, the fact that this disorder is included in the list of illnesses means that people who suffer from it can obtain official help, as the system recognises it as a condition and it is therefore covered by health systems and insurance companies.

## UNWINNABLE WARS



**P**resident Trump prefers not to learn from history. Turning his back on the experience of centuries, in the same way he has turned his back on the fight against climate change, the Trans Pacific Treaty, the G7, and other established international co-operation initiatives, Trump's tweeted political innovations just make many people nervous.

Any national leader who states baldly that if things go wrong he will lie his way out of any situation, and that the North Korean leader has the respect of his people because he had many members of his own family killed, hardly commands respect. Quoting national security as the reason, Trump put tariffs on imported products from

the EU, Canada, China and Mexico, among others. "Trade wars are not bad," he commented, apparently forgetting – if he ever knew – that when the US did the same thing in 1930 with 20,000 imported items, the producing countries took counter-measures. US exports plummeted by 61% and the tariffs were soon removed.

Once again the affected countries have retaliated with unexpected consequences. It will be US wineries that will feel the effect. The defensive tariffs have made US wines 15-25% more expensive in China and many other countries, and largely uncompetitive with Australian, Chilean, Spanish, etc, products. Even little Georgia, that enjoys a free trade agreement with China, could end up selling more wine there than the Californians.

China, as it happens, has in the past behaved as badly as the US; in 2013 it taxed European wines in retaliation for the threat of limiting imports of Chinese solar panels. But Torres Wineries' director in China, Alberto Fernández, thinks the Californians will shrug

it off. Why? Because the Chinese don't much like their wines anyway, preferring South American and Spanish varieties.

Whatever happens, wine-producing countries affected by Trump's trade war will lose sales to the US, but US wineries will see their sales drop too. Obviously such tit-for-tat measures are the stuff of which trade wars are made, which just goes to show what nonsense they are.



## EXOTIC TROPICAL RED BANANAS

Many markets in the province of Malaga are now selling this rather unusual fruit, the red banana. Reddish-purple on the outside and pale pink or yellow on the inside, the red banana is fatter than the Canary version and a bit smaller. The flavour is said to be reminiscent of raspberries but slightly sour. It hails from Sri Lanka, one of 29 varieties grown there. Expect to pay around eight euros a kilo.

# Hawaiian poke is conquering the world

Filling, refreshing, versatile and quick to prepare, poke can be made to suit everyone's taste

Poke is an old Hawaiian staple of preserved vegetables and meat which has been transformed by the influence of Japanese cuisine

**MALAGA.** Since it became fashionable in 2016 in the US, poke has become a global phenomenon. In Malaga, the first specialised restaurant, Ohana Poké & More, has had such a good reception that a year after its inauguration, a second restaurant has now opened. Many fusion and Asian restaurants, tapas bars and fast food outlets now include it in their menus.

But what is poke? In the plentiful images on social networks like Instagram, it appears as a sort of salad in a bowl, composed of a rice base (which can be substituted by quinoa, other cereals or noodles), a protein (raw tuna, salmon and octopus and also chicken, another type of meat or tofu); vegetables (seaweed, edamame, avocado, red onion, spring onion, etc.), soy sauce combined with different mayonnaise-based sauces, and 'toppings' of sesame seeds and nuts. A complete, simple, versatile and fun dish.

Little is known about its history. We know it comes from Hawaii and if we take into account that currently the native population of Hawaii represents no more than 6.6% of the total population, and that the main group of residents is Asian (40%), mainly Japanese, it becomes obvious why the preserved fish or meat became popular among surfers as 'Hawaiian sashimi'.

By 1970 a mixture of marinated tuna with red onion, spring onion, soy sauce and sesame was available in supermarkets with a range of toppings. Each family then mixed it to their own taste and, given the

Japanese influence, rice or seaweed was usually added.

Food journalist Rachel Tan points out that poke was definitely launched on the world from the restaurant Pololi, a Hawaiian restaurant that opened in Hong Kong in 2014.

Rachel Tan places the expansion of poke to the US in 2016, and the conquest of Spanish palates was not long after. The second specialised restaurant in Spain, which is on its way to becoming the biggest poke brand in Europe, was born in Malaga.

Ohana Poké & More opened in Echeverría del Palo on May 4, 2017.

Just one year later they set up a branch in Teatinos, and on July 4 they will be opening in the centre of Malaga.

# Bringing back the mares

**T**he Huelva village of El Rocío is preparing for one of its biggest events of the year. Scarcely a month has passed since El Rocío hosted the largest and most famous 'romería' pilgrimage in Europe, and now the village and the entire municipality of Almonte to which it belongs is looking forward to the famous Saca de las Yeguas. This coming Tuesday 26th

hundreds of horses will pass the shrine to Our Lady of El Rocío as part of a tradition that has taken place annually since 1504, apart from last year when it was cancelled for exceptional circumstances.

The cancellation of last year's event will surely mean that there will be even more anticipation and excitement this year.

The aim of the Saca de las Yeguas is to remove the mares and foals from their home in the marshes outside of the town.

The mares will be taken from their natural habitat by skilled 'yegüerizos' who herd the horses through the town to the church, where the horses are blessed.

Later, the yegüerizos will take the animals out of the village to clean them and the foals will be shod for later sale (those that are not sold will be returned to the marshes).

This centuries-old tradition has its origins in an ordinance passed by the Duke of Medina Sidonia which began the tradition of moving the mares and foals in order to celebrate the San Juan festival.

The fair of San Pedro, the town's patron saint, later in June, is another celebration in Almonte.

As well as being home to the village of El Rocío, Almonte is also an ideal place to get to know the Doñana national park or to enjoy pleasant Atlantic beaches, such as those of the famous resort town of Matalascañas.

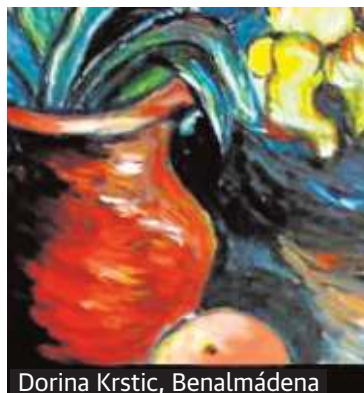

# Summer begins with San Juan

**TORREMOLINOS.** The Costa del Sol will be illuminated by blazing bonfires on Saturday 23 June, as thousands of revellers head to the beaches to enjoy the Fiesta de San Juan. At midnight, huge firework displays will mark the arrival of the Feast of Saint John the Baptist. The festival is celebrated on 24 June, but in most countries, festivities are held the night before. This is one of the few saints' days which commemorate the anniversary of the birth, rather than the death of the saint.

The festival of San Juan, which marks the beginning of the summer, is shrouded in pagan rituals; of which fire and water are the main protagonists. Fires are lit to ward off evil spirits that are said to roam freely at sunset. It is said that jumping over the fire three times will eliminate one's problems, while a midnight dip in the sea will clean and purify the soul. According to tradition, the water is at its purest on the eve of San Juan and it is also believed to bring happiness for the next 12 months.

The celebrations, which generally start around 9pm, are

part of the traditional 'moraga', which means to 'roast in the open air'. In this case, it refers to the grilling of sardines on the beach. Prizes are awarded for the most inventive juas or effigies, similar to the British custom of Guy Fawkes, which is then burned on the bonfire.

The night arrives with special intensity on Malaga's Playa La Malagueta. This is one of the bigger fiestas and includes live music and entertainment, which continues until the early hours.

Torre del Mar holds a huge beach party on the Paseo Marítimo Levante, while in

Rincón de la Victoria, the party takes place on the Playa El Tajo.

The moraga de San Juan in Torremolinos is celebrated in the Plaza del Remo in Carhuela, but one of the most stunning firework displays will be found on the area of beach between Santa Ana and the Castillo Bil Bil in Benalmádena Costa.

Other parties take place on the Playa San Francisco in Fuen-girola; in Marbella, where the event is concentrated around the Playa El Pinillo, and on the Playa de Rada in Estepona.

# Third time lucky: Juan Ramón Muñiz completes Malaga CF return

This is the Asturian's third spell as head coach, having earned the team promotion to La Liga back in 2008

**MALAGA.** Almost 110 days have passed since then sporting director Mario Husillos sat down for a meeting in Valencia to gauge the interest of Juan Ramón Muñiz in taking over as Malaga head coach. Muñiz, who had just been sacked as Levante boss, had his reservations, but now, almost four months later, the vacancy has been filled by the man who had been the favourite all along.

Muñiz signed a two-year contract on Wednesday morning to lead Malaga CF, albeit only as a head coach, not in the general manager role mooted (and then discarded by owner Sheikh Abdullah Al-Thani) some weeks ago - the second time Malaga approached the 49-year-old.

While it looked like the move would never come to fruition and the club's new sporting director José Luis Caminero started to shortlist new candidates, Muñiz's name returned to the table after his family made it clear that their hearts were set on a return to the city and that they were devastated when it fell through. What's more, Muñiz was the first choice of Husillos, club consultants Abdallah Ben Barek, Francisco Martín Aguilar and Antonio Benítez, Al-Thani and now Caminero.

**"The future has been clarified"**  
Speaking at his presentation on

Wednesday afternoon, Muñiz thanked Caminero for the opportunity, and explained why the job was a better fit now than it was in March. "The first contact took place many months ago. There were 10 or 12 Liga games still to be played; now there's a new situation, the project is very defined, and the future has been clarified. Being here is a pleasure [...] I thank everyone who contacted me to be part of this project."

He also made it clear that collective responsibility would be the key to success. "Everyone always has responsibility at work, and you have to respond to that expectation. It's about maintaining enthusiasm and being willing to improve every day, starting with me," he said.

"It's not about just one person accomplishing a goal, it's about a group of people. If one of those parts fails, the project will begin to experience problems."

Despite talk of unity and hard work, one word, however, was not mentioned: promotion. While this is clearly the objective for the club, Muñiz was reluctant to talk about it. When asked, he said: "The most important thing is to take it step by step and to ensure that by March, we are near the top of the table."

This will be no easy task, said the 49-year-old: "The [second] division is getting better all the time; there are better stadiums, better players and a higher level of skill."

"There are no favourites in any match... When you see the table it can be scary. There are teams that competed in Europe not long ago, teams that believe that their badge is enough to win matches. But we know that that only thing that mat-

ters is what happens between now and June 2019. If you're not up to scratch, the division is most unforgiving."

## Familiar surroundings

This is the Asturian's third spell in charge of the team. Muñiz was first at the club as assistant to Juande Ramos in 2003, before taking up a role as head coach with neighbours Marbella. However, he returned to Malaga as coach in 2006 and earned promotion to La Liga for the Blue and Whites in the 2007/08 season.

Shortly after, he joined Racing Santander but was released at the end of the season and returned to Malaga for a short-lived second spell in late 2010. He led them to safety but was not kept on after a last-gasp 17th-place finish just before Al-Thani's arrival at the club heralded a new era and the appointment of Jesualdo Ferreira.

Muñiz then travelled to Ukraine to be reunited with Juande Ramos

## Movilla under consideration for academy role

Former Malaga player José María Movilla, 43, is among several names being considered to fill the vacant role as head of the club's academy.

Movilla, who played for Malaga for three years before moving to Atlético Madrid, has overseen Rayo Majadahonda's rise to Segunda as the club's sporting director and has been sounded out by Malaga as a potential replacement for Antonio Tapia who resigned last month.

In the meantime, former captain Duda has been carrying out the role, but it is believed that he is not under consideration at this time.

at Dnipro, where he acquired a detailed knowledge of the European market.

In 2015, he was appointed Alcorcón boss, earning a move to Levante the following season with whom he gained promotion back to La Liga in his first season. Their return didn't go to plan, however, and Muñiz was relieved of his duties this May.

However, it is his experience of twice earning promotion back to the big time, as well as his close ties with the club, which attracted Malaga.

Even though fans were calling for his head at the end of his second spell in charge, his work in getting Malaga to La Liga in 2008 has not gone unnoticed. During a time in which he was also acting as sporting director, Muñiz restructured the squad completely and turned the side, which narrowly escaped relegation to the third tier the year before, into one that finished second, an automatic promotion spot.

# The departure of Ignasi Miquel moves one step closer

Interest in the defender is high and Malaga could make an immediate return on a player they signed for just 350,000 euros

**MALAGA.** Another La Liga club has joined the race for the signature of in-demand Malaga defender Ignasi Miquel. The former Arsenal man, who joined from Lugo in January after Malaga activated his 350,000-euro release clause, is wanted by both Eibar and another unnamed La Liga side.

Miquel, who was one of Malaga's better performers last year, has his current release clause set at 3.5 million euros, but Malaga could receive only a proportion of that if they do not renegotiate terms as a matter of urgency. This is because the release clause will fall to as low as 1.5 million euros in July following the club's relegation and Malaga do not want him to leave on the cheap.

So far they have been unwilling to negotiate on anything below 3.5 million euros as he is considered one of the club's few saleable assets and the money could go a long way in overhauling the squad.

The squad currently boasts 30 players under contract (the maximum that can be registered to play is 25) while a number of players (Keko, Michael Santos, Federico Ricca and Luis Hernández) have wages incompatible with a Segunda team.

# Hierro restores order for Spain at the World Cup

Following a thrilling 3-3 draw against Portugal, Spain successfully negotiated their way past plucky Iran and sit joint top of Group B

**MALAGA.** Recovering from the shock departure of Julen Lopetegui just a day before the tournament's start wasn't going to be an easy task for new coach Fernando Hierro's Spain team. However, after a Cristiano Ronaldo hat-trick sealed a late point for Portugal to put a dampener on Hierro's first game in charge last Friday, a hard-fought win against Iran on Wednesday night sees Spain sit joint top of Group B, going into the final group game.

## VAR to the rescue

Iran, who started the day ahead of Spain following their 1-0 win over Morocco, were no pushovers in Kazan on Wednesday night. Though Spain had the lion's share of the possession, a fortunate rebound off Diego Costa's knee provided the only goal of the contest.

Having defended in a 6-3-1 formation until the go-ahead goal, Iran suddenly flew out the traps and Karim Ansarifard's volley from the edge left David de Gea motionless but found the side netting.

Mehdi Taremi also came close with two headers, but Iran thought they had earned an equal-

iser when Saeid Ezaatollahi poked home from close range, only for the VAR to spot that he had strayed off-side when the ball was flicked on.

## 'The game of the tournament'

The drama in Kazan, nonetheless, still doesn't match up to what is being described as the game of the tournament so far, when Spain and Portugal played out an entertain-

ing draw in Sochi on Friday.

Cristiano Ronaldo gave his side an early lead in the Group B opener when he won and then converted a penalty in the fourth minute.

Spain, however, levelled it in the 24th minute when Diego Costa used his strength to beat Pepe to the long ball before lashing the ball low past a helpless Rui Patricio.

Despite controlling the play, Spain gifted Portugal a second goal just before half time when Ronaldo's powerful low shot crept into the corner after keeper David De Gea failed to get his whole body behind the ball.

# My mate the Mexico manager

**Juan Carlos Osorio was the brains behind Mexico's win over the world champions, but his route to the top was an interesting one**

Juan Carlos Osorio is currently the darling of the World Cup coaching circles after masterminding Mexico's defeat of the pre-tournament favourites Germany... and I couldn't be prouder of my old amigo.

I can imagine there's a conversation where some bloke is saying, "Doesn't that Mexican manager look like the bloke who once turned out in the Birkenhead Sunday League for the Woodchurch pub?" And he'd be right.

Our friendship stretches back to 1985 when he was the star signing for the New Haven Chargers in the American NCAA league. With his inquisitive mind, he was always questioning myself and fellow English roommate Keith McCormick on the methods employed in Europe.

I still maintain he was the most skilful footballer I had the pleasure of sharing a pitch with (and I've played with a few in testimonial games - John Barnes, Kenny Dalglish, Gazza etc). He'd spend

hours perfecting tricks that would now be known as freestyling, but sadly we didn't see enough of his talents as he was restricted by injury and he drifted into coaching.

Spin forward twenty-three years and picture a freezing cold day outside the Liverpool FC training ground as Spanish photographers gathered to grab a picture over the fence. Wrapped in several layers, one of the pack approached me, "Keith, Keith... it's Juan!"

I had no idea, maybe it was

someone I'd met on a trip to Valencia? "Juan, from Colombia" he continued.

Despite his inability to tell one Englishman from another, it clicked, it was our old team mate from Connecticut using a milk crate to get a glimpse of the Liverpool training session.

He explained that he'd rented a room from a family overlooking the Melwood headquarters so that he could note the methods of the famed Gérard Houllier.

We renewed our friendship, once I'd reminded him that I was Rob - not Keith - and he accompanied me on many trips to Premier League training grounds where I would interview the manager and he would devour the training sessions. We'd use our extra press pass for the Champions League games to use him as a translator or sound man. I only remember him blowing his cover once to ask Zinedine Zidane for a selfie.

He was a zealot for new methods, studying Sports Science at Liverpool John Moores University, combining it with trips to the Netherlands to further his coaching credentials. On our excursion his watch would alarm every two hours which signalled that he needed a home-prepared snack.

'Juncho' hadn't lost any of his talent and asked if I could set him up with a game of football. So we were reunited for a match in the Birkenhead Sunday League where he had to endure the expected pre-game 'banter' when they discovered he was Colombian. For the first five minutes of the game he just stretched and jogged in his own world before collecting the ball, beating five players and clipping the cross bar with a rabona (before anyone knew what a rabona was).

After a year he headed back to the USA and I thought that was the end of our acquaintance until one day I got a call, "Rob, I'm flying to Manchester to speak to City."

By a remarkable coincidence I was interviewing the Manchester City chairman for Sky Sports the day before he was to interview Juan for the new role of 'conditioning coach'. David Bernstein asked me more questions than I asked him and 48 hours later Osorio was appointed much to the surprise of manager Joe Royle, who wasn't expecting a fitness guru.

We kept in regular touch as Kevin Keegan and then Stuart Pearce tapped into Juan's encyclopaedic and academic approach to the game before he headed back to the USA to start his head coaching career.

At a farewell meal in a Liverpool tapas bar he emotionally declared to my wife Bo and I that, "One day I will be back as the manager of Colombia." We didn't doubt it and he wasn't far off.

## Harry Kane saves England with late winner against Tunisia

The Tottenham striker's header in injury time won the match after a largely uninspiring performance

**MALAGA.** England got their World Cup campaign off to a positive start on Monday night as they scored late to secure a win in their Group G opener against Tunisia in Volgograd - a game overshadowed by refereeing decisions and swarms of mosquitos that had descended on the stadium from their breeding grounds in the nearby Volga river.

Strong favourites England, whose players were seen covering themselves in repellent before kick-off, started with purpose and spurned a number of clear chances in the opening exchanges, through Raheem Sterling, Jesse Lingard and John Stones. However, when Harry Kane tapped home the rebound

from Stones' header in the 11th minute, many were expecting the floodgates to open.

An injury to Tunisia keeper Mouez Hassen, though, disrupted England's rhythm and Gareth Southgate's side were pegged back in the 35th minute when Kyle Walker conceded a controversial penalty, thanks to a stray arm on Fakhreddine Ben Youssef, which was converted by Ferjani Sassi.

This boosted Tunisia who came out of their shell in the second half and started to get in England's face.

However, after being denied two clear penalties, England's persistence paid off and Kane scored a brilliantly-placed header in stoppage time from Harry Maguire's flick.

Having won the opening game of a major tournament for the first time since they beat Paraguay in the 2006 World Cup, England face Panama, who lost 3-0 to Belgium on Monday, in their next match on Sunday (kick-off 2pm).

**Classmates of boy with leukaemia enlist pop star Yazz to raise money for charity**

**MALAGA.** When captain of the English International College (EIC) football team, Louis Spinola, discovered that his friend wouldn't be able to take part in a tournament after having contracted leukaemia, he decided to do something to help. A fan of Michael Jackson, the year six pupil opted to record a cover of Heal the World with his classmates at the school in Marbella in order to appeal for donations to Make-A-Wish Foundation, a charity which grants life-changing wishes to seriously ill children.

Mr. Dave, who supported his pupil's plan. "He said yes straight away," explained Louis. The young boy also made contact with British pop star, Yazz (best known for her 1988 dance track 'The Only Way Is Up'), who teaches singing at EIC.

SUR in English recently caught up with Yazz, who currently lives on the Costa del Sol. She was keen to help Louis' plans materialise: "This was one of those moments when you love your inbox. In popped a young boy's hope to do something for a close friend," explained Yazz. The singer arrived in Spain some time ago and "fell in love" with the country. Eighteen years later, she is married to a Spaniard and leads Music Worship at the International Baptist Church in Calahonda. "One of the best and greatest of things is being a part of some-

thing that supports young people's dreams," said Yazz of her current posting at EIC.

Louis, Yazz and two music teachers gathered together a group of 30 people to help create their song. Most of the helpers were Louis' fellow pupils; the school choir a drummer from year three, a bass player, percussionists and a pianist from year six. After two months of work and rehearsals, a local recording studio lent their facility to the group. For her part, Yazz helped with the song arrangement and vocal coaching, put the group in contact with a sound technician and supplied "copious doughnuts".

Louis and his friends are very pleased with the resulting track. "It ended up sounding even more amazing than I thought it would," he declared.

Louis was in touch with his teammate throughout the recording process: "His mum was very emotional. I'm looking forward to going round to play some Xbox with him when he is feeling a bit better."

In tribute to Louis' friend and other children who suffer from serious illnesses, the team have made a professional music video for their Heal the World cover. "I hope lots of people donate," said Louis.
