British family almost cut off airport's fuel supply, court hears

Four members of a family from the UK are on trial in Malaga for siphoning off diesel from a pipeline that ran underneath a Guadalhorce valley farm

A Malaga court has heard this week how a British family of four stole 156,000 litres of diesel fuel from a pipeline that serves Malaga Airport. The defendants, who have admitted the theft, had rented a farm located above the pipeline and used

homemade equipment to siphon off the fuel. Their system, described in court as dangerous, was spotted by a helicopter investigating a loss in pressure at the airport, which could have suffered cuts in its supply, said investigators. **P2**

Latest local killing: bullet-ridden body found on water's edge of Mijas Costa

So far, investigators have not linked this death to the spate of fatal shootings on the coast in recent weeks believed to have been carried out by organised drug gangs

MIJAS. The Guardia Civil is investigating the death of a young man after the discovery on Wednesday morning of a bullet-ridden body on the edge of the sea next to the A-7 motorway in Mijas Costa.

The victim was reported to be a 20-year old Slovenian with a police record. He was spotted face down at the base of the low cliffs that run alongside the motorway.

The find was made near the bar at Peñón del Cura beach, the last stretch of coast before the border between Mijas and Fuengirola.

Sources said that 15 spent bullet cases were found around the body, which had at least seven gunshot wounds, probably from an automatic weapon.

Fire crews were called to help

funeral services remove the body from the difficult-to-reach position at the base of the cliff.

Meanwhile a Guardia Civil diving team and patrol boat scoured the water by the rocks looking for

clues and investigators worked on land until mid-afternoon.

The alarm was initially raised by a passerby walking alongside the main road above at about 9am, and the large emergency services' presence by the water's edge caused tailbacks on the A-7 as drivers tried to see what was happening.

Police have so far not linked this suspected murder to the recent killing spree on the Costa del Sol. In late October and November, four people were found dead in Mijas and Marbella in separate attacks linked to organised crime and drugs, although investigators say they are all unrelated.

Guardia Civil unions call for Mijas police reinforcements

MIJAS. The union representing Guardia Civil officers, who are responsible for investigating crime in Mijas municipality, has called for more support in the face of a wave of fatal killings affecting the area. They say there are half as many Guardia Civil staff covering the 150-square-metre area of Mijas compared to National Police officers who patrol the much smaller, neighbouring Fuengirola area. "Colleagues are run down, tired and in low spirits, they feel abandoned and with no resources," said a spokesperson.

Meanwhile, a multidisciplinary team headed by National Police officers has been formed to tackle the organised violent crime that has emerged recently and work across a wider area. Head of the unit said last week, "We are up against very professional people, they are contract killers that travel round Europe and go where they are called to work."

Malaga Airport almost lost its fuel supply due to Britons siphoning off 156,000 litres

MALAGA. Staff on the pipeline that brings fuel into Malaga Airport noticed something was wrong when

the pressure dropped. Using a helicopter, they found a suspicious tube in the ground on a farm in the Guadalorce valley. In October 2011 police were called and a British family of four were arrested.

The family had rented the farm and drilled down to the vital pipeline under the land. The father was arrested in a white van with a tank of 1,000 litres of diesel inside. A neighbour said that he had seen the van coming every day to the land at around 1pm. Analysis showed that

156,700 litre of diesel went missing.

At the trial this week, one investigator explained how dangerous their activity had been, using homemade equipment to perforate a pipe that also carries kerosene and gasoline. The airfield was on the verge of losing supply, he said.

The mother and father (now divorced) and children admit the thefts, saying they were ordered by somebody else to take the fuel valued at four million euros. The trial continues.





Marbella toddler who fell six floors goes home after just three days in hospital

Relatives have described the survival of two-year-old Álvaro, who dropped more than 20 metres out of a window, as a 'miracle'

MARBELLA. After three days in the Costa del Sol hospital two-year-old Álvaro went home on Tuesday unaware that his survival was being described as a "miracle".

He had fallen out of a window at his home in Marbella on Saturday afternoon, plunging six floors to the pavement below where he was found conscious and with no more than a few scratches.

Washing hung out on the fifth floor cushioned the fall of the toddler who then bounced off a small roof, before landing outside the front door of the block in Calle Salduba.

"It's not luck, it's a miracle," the boy's uncle, Jorge Jiménez, told SUR on Sunday, recounting the events

of Saturday afternoon in the flat he shares with Álvaro's parents.

Jorge explained that it all happened at around 4.30pm when his sister put Álvaro to bed for a siesta in his room while they cleared up after lunch.

"Álvaro was sleeping and we were busy in the kitchen, and when we went back into the living room we heard people shouting below, saying that a child had fallen. I rushed into his room and he wasn't there," explained Jorge. By that time the boy's mother was already rushing down the stairs.

The alarm was raised by a neighbour who was sitting on a bench outside the building. He said he saw "something" fall, but thought it was "a doll". When he realised it was a child he called over a man who was nearby on a motorcycle to help. He in turn stopped a car and the driver picked the boy up and drove him straight to the nearest health centre where he received first aid. Álvaro was later transferred to the Costa del Sol hospital where he remained

in observation until Tuesday.

Jorge said that Álvaro must have climbed onto a chest of drawers next to the window before he fell more than 20 metres.

Miracle street

This is the second time that a child has survived a fall in this same street in the Marbella neighbourhood of Plaza de Toros.

Twenty years ago, in November 1999, a five-year-old boy was saved after he fell from a fifth-floor balcony. Salvador Moreno, a neighbour who worked for a funeral company, was deemed a local hero after holding his arms out to catch the boy. The five-year-old bounced from his arms into a garden and suffered several fractures, but lived to tell the tale.

Brits arrested after baby intoxicated by cannabis

:: H. B. The parents and uncle of a 17-month-old baby have been arrested after the child was taken to a Marbella health centre having ingested cannabis. The three adults, all British, were at home when the little girl came into contact with the drug without them noticing. During a later search of their home, police seized more than 200 grammes of cannabis and materials used for growing marijuana plants. An investigation into possible public health offences and neglect is under way.

Police dog finds drugs in schoolbags during demonstration

Construction of Antequera dry port will begin next year

The first stage will cost 46 million euros, partly financed by the regional government, and take two years to complete

ANTEQUERA. The Junta de Andalucía plans to start building the first phase of the dry port in Antequera next summer and says the construction will take two years to complete. This phase will cover 102.26 of the total of 392 hectares, strategically located near Bobadilla station.

This stage of the project will cost 46 million euros and will be financed by the Public Ports Agency of Andalucía (43.26 per cent) and the Puerto Seco de Antequera company (56.74 per cent). The Junta has already assigned 13 million euros from its 2020 budget for the scheme.

The information was provided by the president of the Junta, Juanma Moreno, at the official presentation of the project to 400 invited guests at the Torcal Municipal Theatre in Antequera. Those present included the town's mayor, Manuel Barón, the president of the Malaga provincial government, Francisco Salado

and regional ministers Elias Bendo and Marifrán Carazo.

Juanma Moreno explained that the project will play a fundamental role among the 11 logistical areas of Andalucía and it will include the construction of a railway terminal linked to the Andalusian port system, the dry port and areas for transformation logistics and other uses.

"This project is going to create

an unprecedented change to the logistics sector in Andalucía and it will be a benchmark for others," he said.

He also stressed that the initiative will create jobs and generate wealth for the region. "The dry port presents a future of possibilities, opening up Andalucía to the rest of Spain, Europe and the world."

Successful maritime freight service

MALAGA

I. LILLO. The maritime freight service between Malaga Port, Tangier and Canada has "exceeded expectations" with around ten per cent more business than initially forecast by the German company

Hapag-Lloyd, which runs the service. One reason is that the company is transporting high-value technological and industrial products, in addition to fruit and refrigerated foods. After a five-year gap in the service, goods are transported once again by train from Madrid to Malaga Port and from there by ship to Tangier and on to Canada, as Malaga now forms part of the MCA route.

Airport will end the year with record figures

MALAGA

P. MARTÍNEZ. Malaga Airport is expected to close the year with a record-breaking figure of nearly 20 million passengers. Statistics show that in the first 11 months of this year, 18.7 million passengers used the airport, which was an increase

of 4.5 per cent compared with the same period in 2018. There were 135,896 flights, which was nearly three per cent more than last year. The majority of travellers took international flights, although there was an eight per cent increase in flights to other Spanish destinations. The AENA airport authority believes it is unlikely that Malaga will break the 20 million barrier, this year but the final figure will be very close.

Spain keeps a close eye on the UK General Election results

Britons living in Spain realised the importance of the so-called Brexit election and many were upset they could not vote

MALAGA. As the UK went to the polls on Thursday, not only were Britons living in Spain watching closely, but also Spanish citizens residing in the UK.

The UK media claimed the 2019 General Election was “the most important in a generation” and news was coming in by midmorn-

ing of unprecedented numbers of people forming queues outside polling stations, following reports of a surge in people registering in the weeks leading up to the vote.

Anti-Brexit groups were calling for voters to vote tactically in order to get the pro-Brexit Conservatives out of government.

Britons in Spain, many of whom were unable to vote having lived abroad for more than 15 years, were well aware that the outcome of the election will affect how and when Britain leaves the EU, and therefore could make a difference to their future rights.

Anne Hernandez of the association Brexipats in Spain said on

Thursday: “Our futures are dependent on today’s vote and our 9,000 members are worried.” She added, “Despite being a general election, it is being labelled the Brexit election because our futures here could all change at the drop of a hat in a no-deal.”

Sue Wilson, Chair of the association Bremain in Spain, said, “Brexit has been the most damaging and painful experience that many Brits in Europe have ever experienced. Yet, even after three and a half years of living in limbo, we absolutely do not want to ‘Get Brexit Done’ - rather, we want to ‘Get Brexit Gone’.” She went on to say, “This election is the most un-

predictable in living memory.”

Michael Soffe, long-term Malaga resident and businessman, also expressed his concern and frustration at how the outcome of the election could affect British residents in EU countries. “I and many other disenfranchised voters are watching the proceedings today,

consigned to the sidelines yet again, no vote on our futures,” he said on Thursday. “If a Tory government is returned I have a feeling that the whole ‘leave with no deal’ scenario will be back on the table again in a year’s time as the chances of having a trade deal in a year are not realistic.”

Malaga pays annual tribute to Torrijos

On the anniversary of his execution in the city in 1831, Malaga recalled General Torrijos with a series of commemorative events

MALAGA. The city of Malaga remembered, as usual, on Wednesday a local hero, General José María Torrijos y Uriarte, who was shot along with 48 companions after rising up against the absolutist rule of King Fernando VII in 1831.

A procession of the Asociación Histórico-Cultural Torrijos 1831 set out in the morning from the San Andrés convent to the memorial cross to Torrijos in El Bulto, where a wreath was laid. The procession then continued to the English Cemetery, which is the resting site of Robert Boyd, an Irishman whom

Torrijos persuaded to join his cause when exiled in London.

Homage was paid here to the bravery and internationalist outlook of Boyd, before the procession moved on to its last stop, the Plaza de la Merced. This is the resting place of Torrijos and all of his companions bar Boyd.

In a ceremony attended by the city’s mayor, Francisco de la Torre, several more wreaths were laid by civic organisations at the foot of the obelisk dedicated to the general and his men. A reenactment of the execution of Torrijos and his companions was carried out by the associa-

tion and Torrijos’ last letter to his wife was read out.

Irish links

Also in attendance at the day’s events was Irish journalist Ciaran O’Neill, who was in Malaga filming an inde-

pendent documentary about Robert Boyd. The story of Boyd, like O’Neill a native of Londonderry, caught his attention after the Asociación’s José Antonio Sierra gave a talk on him at the town’s Central Library this summer.

O’Neill admits he had not even heard of Boyd until this talk, but was immediately fascinated by his story. “It’s an amazing tale of how this young Irishman gave up his fortune” - Boyd had inherited around 4,000 pounds from his father - , and poured it all into Torrijos’ project - “and ultimately his life, for a cause in a country that he had never even been to.”

Torrijos and his followers aimed to overthrow the despotic King Fernando VII and restore liberal, constitutional rule to Spain. After several months of fairly blatant plotting in Gibraltar, an attempt at an insurrection was launched.

However, Torrijos had been betrayed by someone known only as ‘Viriato’, thought to be a pseudonym of a trusted collaborator, and he and his men were captured at Alhaurín de la Torre.

They were shot on San Andrés beach on 11 December. Later, he came to be celebrated as a liberal hero, and the obelisk to him and his followers in the famous Plaza de la Merced was erected in 1848.

Puerto Banús plans its 50th anniversary**ESTEPONA**

M.** Puerto Banús celebrates its 50th anniversary in 2020 and is planning events and festivals all through the year, special activities in collaboration with luxury brands and a campaign aimed at 'millennials' to focus more of its attention on young people, especially via social media. The aim is to attract more

tourism, not only to the port but to Marbella as a whole, says CEO Juan Nuñez Insausti.

Puerto Banús has always been popular with jet setters, but the 50th anniversary is seen as a turning point in its marketing and promotion.

The marina is currently celebrating the festive season with its Christmas Market, which continues on the Muelle de Ribera until 5 January from 10am to 8pm. It includes 27 stands selling a variety of goods, and there are activities for children.

Starlite impact is 183 million euros, says study**MARBELLA**

∴ **H. B.** A report drawn up for the organisers of Marbella's Starlite music festival calculates the event's economic impact on the area to be 183 million euros. In 2019 260,000 people visited the Nagüeles venue during the two-month summer event which generated 870 jobs. Names have already been released for the 2020 Starlite festival, including Lionel Richie and Raphael.

La Cañada owner Tomás Olivo now controls most of the land in Marbella

The president of the company that owns La Cañada is now also buying up land elsewhere in Malaga province and Andalucía

MARBELLA. The entrepreneur Tomás Olivo, president of the company which owns La Cañada shopping centre and considered by Forbes magazine to be the richest person in Malaga and seventh richest in Spain, now controls most of the land in the urban expansion areas of Marbella and is about to become the biggest landowner in the province.

Olivo is believed to be worth around 2.1 billion euros. His wealth has increased tremendously since his company - General de Galerías Comerciales - was launched on the stock market and since he won a legal case against the Junta de Andalucía and was ordered to be paid 165 million euros in compensation for the paralysing of the Nevada shopping centre project in Armilla (Granada).

He has embarked on a strategy of buying up land and other assets to consolidate his presence in the sector of commercial centres and gain a predominant position in the real estate sector.

In 2014, Olivo bought one million square metres of land in the Guadaiza area, between San Pedro Alcántara and Puerto Banús, for around 30 million euros. It stretches between the AP-7 toll motorway and A-7 highway near the entrance to the tunnel at San Pedro and is considered one of the most privileged locations not only in Marbella but on the whole of the Costa del Sol because the terrain is flat and strategically located.

His biggest property transaction in Malaga province, however, was in February this year, when he purchased two million square metres of land in Marbella for 25.7 million euros, which he paid for from his personal funds. Most of this land, including 800,000 square metres at La Serranía, to the north of and bordering La Cañada, used to belong to British magnate Judah Binstock, who died in December 2016. With this purchase, Tomás Olivo gained control of so much land overall that he

has become a decisive actor for the future of the town.

The General de Galerías Comerciales company is now planning to build an additional 50,000 square metre car park on part of the land acquired from Judah Binstock's widow, with platforms and lifts between the parking area and the shopping centre.

Olivo has already begun to develop projects on some of the land he holds, aiming to do so before the new Urban Plan for Marbella is approved and comes into force.

He is also expanding into other parts of the province. For instance, in July he announced the purchase of several plots of land in Rincón de la Victoria for 9.8 million euros plus IVA, where he plans to build 1,200 homes, and the acquisition of the whole La Azucarera site, 83,000 square metres in Malaga city beside the Guadalhorce industrial estate, for four million euros.

He has also invested 17 million euros in land in Huelva province, and since the company was launched on the stock market he has increased his number of commercial centres from six to nine.

New centre for the homeless planned by Red Cross in San Pedro

MARBELLA. If all goes according to plan, a centre for homeless people will be run by Cruz Roja in council-owned premises in Calle Fantasía, in the Fuente Nueva area of San Pedro, next year. The agreement with the local authority just needs to be ratified by the provincial committee of the NGO. From its regular patrols, Cruz Roja has ascertained that between 12 and 14 people are living permanently in the streets of San Pedro, as well as others who spend some time there and then move on. Councillor Begoña Rueda says it is hoped the centre will be able to open in the spring.

I have a Spanish driver's license so I am subject to the point system. Lately I have received three fines and lost six points for parking improperly, but it is possible that within a while I may forget or not be sure about how many points I have. Is the DGT obliged to inform

the driver when he runs out of points? On the other hand, is it possible to recover the points before they run out?

The administration is obliged to inform the driver the moment the points on the card are all gone, but in order to be informed of the balance you must register on the DGT website. On the other hand, it is possible to sign up for awareness-raising courses when points are lost. With these courses, which may be held once every two years, or once a year in the case of being a professional driver, a maximum of six points can be recovered.

I have had a villa with a garage for several years and every year I pay the tax for the entrance. Last week I was in a hurry and left the car parked in front of the garage door. I assumed that

there was no problem, because the garage is mine and therefore I am not blocking the exit to any car, but to my amazement, when I left the next day, my car was not there, the municipal tow truck had taken it! To recover it I had to pay a penalty, plus the costs of the car's stay in the depot. My question is, if I pay the tax for the entrance and I did not bother anyone, is it legal for them to take my car?

It is normal to think that if your garage has a right of entry, and you are not bothering anyone, you can park without any problem, but this is not the case. When you pay for the right of entry, what you get is the right to go onto the pavement and drive across it, either to get in or out of the garage, but it does not give you the right to park in front of it, because the pavement is not your property, it is part of the public road.

Costa Christmas ham heist: lorry driver sleeps as 300 legs disappear

:: J.C. / A.F. It's one product that a Spanish Christmas meal cannot be without, which makes cured legs of ham particularly attractive loot for thieves at this time of year.

Last week robbers made off with 300 of the delicacies destined for Costa dinner tables as the driver of the refrigerated truck they were being transported in slept on obliviously. The robbery took place at a truckers' rest stop by the motorway near Antequera.

Investigators said that the driver had not heard anything suspicious above the noise from cooling motors. The first he knew of the theft was when he woke up at 5.45am to drive the last few kilometres to a supermarket in Malaga. The thieves had disconnected the trailer from the cabin and emptied it of the legs of ham, each of which could be worth up to 140 euros, sources said.

Police said the type of operation suggests it was carried out by an organised gang and warned retailers and logistics companies to watch out for people on the look out for valuable festive produce.

Preparatory works begin on the recreational area at The Mount

The historic estate, which was traditionally the home of senior Navy officers, will become a park with research and discovery facilities

GIBRALTAR. Preparatory works are about to begin for the project to turn The Mount into a green area, resembling the Commonwealth Park but with woodland and in the south of Gibraltar. It will become a recreation area with a research and discovery park, and the plans also include an adventure park, padel tennis and an events centre. In the future, the civil wedding registry will be based in the gatehouse at The Mount, so civil marriages will be able to take place there with the reception in the events hall which has use of the grounds.

The 18th-century Mount estate is 3,350 m² in size and has an interesting history. It was the home of Major General Sir William Green from 1778. He was responsible for strengthening Gibraltar's fortifications prior to the Great Siege and for the raising of the forerunners of the Royal Engineers. The plot was purchased by

the Admiralty in 1797. The residence was reconstructed in 1846 and the stables after a fire in 1859. It has traditionally been occupied by senior naval officers.

The Mount was owned by the Ministry of Defence for many years and at that time the people of Gibraltar were unable to access the grounds. Once it was no longer in MOD hands there was a proposal to turn it into a private residential development, but the government decided it made no

sense for the public to be denied access to it once again, and that it would be an ideal additional green space for the Rock.

The site has become very overgrown over the years so the contract has now been awarded for removing some of the vegetation so the condition of the walls, structures and paths can be determined. The squash court will also be cleared out to ground level. This will be the first phase of the project.

European Commission announces target of zero emissions by 2050

EARTH MATTERS

The proposals would mean a 50 to 55% reduction in emissions by 2030, as opposed to 40% in current plans

BRUSSELS. While UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres has bemoaned the bureaucratic obstacles blocking significant progress at the COP25 climate summit in Madrid, the EU has launched a serious climate project of its own.

Just 11 days into her presidency, the leader of the European Commission, Ursula Von der Leyen, announced on Wednesday the ambitious so-called European Green Deal, a far-reaching set of proposals which aim to decarbonise the European Union by 2050.

Her plans would affect multiple sectors of the economy, including agriculture, transport, construction, and energy production. Von der Leyen insists that the move towards zero net emissions is as much an opportunity as it is a challenge, and that growth need not be affected by a move towards a green economy. Ac-

According to the latest Eurobarometer, public opinion is on her side: 77% of EU citizens believe that action to protect the environment could boost growth.

Current EU plans involve a 40% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions by 2030, which estimates suggest would require an annual investment of 260 billion euros, or 1.5 per cent of the EU's combined GDP in 2018. Von Der Leyen's new plans of 50 or even 55% reductions by 2030 would raise this cost further, but the

German stressed the huge costs of inaction; droughts and floods currently cost EU countries 15 billion euros a year.

The Commission's plan would involve a yearly investment of 100 billion euros, and also involves the European Investment Bank incentivising billions of euros of green investment between 2021 and 2030. Her plans may, however, meet resistance from Poland, Czech Republic and Hungary. Poland notably relies on coal for 80% of its electricity production.

Greta Thunberg has accused the world's rich countries of failing to live up to their climate pledges at the COP25 conference. She accused the politicians at the summit of "negotiating loopholes and avoiding more ambitious targets". Meanwhile, Fridays for Future have announced a global strike today, since they believe that the COP25 "has failed us all" and demonstrated a lack of ambition.

King names Pedro Sánchez as candidate to be prime minister

PSOE and opposition politicians are worried about the concessions that he will have to make to Catalan separatism to win support in Congreso

MADRID. King Felipe held separate meetings with all party leaders this week, as the constitution demands, to decide on who to nominate to the Congreso as candidate to be the next prime minister.

It was no surprise when, on

Wednesday evening, the Speaker of parliament, Meritzell Batet, announced that the King had said that Pedro Sánchez should be candidate to be PM. Sánchez's PSOE party has the largest number of seats in Congreso after last month's general election but not a majority.

MPs will now debate and vote on his candidacy, although the date for that is unlikely to be set until the PSOE has exhausted all possibility of winning majority support.

Sánchez's party has been talking with the separatist Catalan republican party, ERC, to try to win their abstention. He already has agree-

ment with left-wing Unidas Podemos to go into coalition but still needs an abstention or more support.

In a press conference on Wednesday, Sánchez blamed opposition parties for not abstaining to allow the government to start work and also agreed to call Catalan leader Quim Torra, something ERC had been demanding.

Many politicians inside and outside the PSOE are nervous about the talks with the Catalan republicans. Worried about the effort and concessions needed to gain their support, one PSOE party grandee said "I don't want vaseline for Christmas".

Separatist protest threatens Barça-Real Madrid clash

The Tsunami Democràtic activist group has warned it will block access to Nou Camp if its messages are banned from the ground

BARCELONA. A high-profile Catalan separatist group behind recent street protests has threatened to disrupt the forthcoming 'Clásico' football match between Barcelona and Real Madrid in the Catalan capital next Wednesday, 18 December. The

match had already been rescheduled after fears of violence in Catalonia.

In messages over social media, Tsunami Democràtic has called for its supporters to gather at strategic points close to FC Barcelona's Nou Camp stadium and told organisers that if they allow banners into the stadium saying "Spain Sit and Talk", then they will not prevent people entering the stadium.

Tensions were rising this week amid concerns over whether the game could go ahead. The Mossos d'Esquadra regional police have said they are confident they can protect the match.

Government puts out to tender the contract for 'big brother' facial recognition borders

MADRID. The Interior ministry has put out to tender a contract for facial recognition border control technology.

The government is offering 4.1 mil-

lion euros for the design and running of the Spanish version of the Entry/Exit System (EES), under new EU rules to monitor the entry from outside the common Schengen travel area, including from UK and Ireland.

The technology chosen should "be able to record and store the time, day and place of entry and exit of nationals of third-party countries".

In addition it should automatically calculate "the authorised length of stay" and "generate alerts".

It will use biometric and facial recognition technology and cover both airports and ports when up and running.

Malaga needs large amount of new, modern office space to keep up with demand

MALAGA. The rise in demand for office space in Malaga city and surrounding area that started in 2016 continues, and real estate agents estimate that 50,000 square metres more are urgently needed in prime locations to keep up with demand. The most sought after areas for offices include the city's business district, near El Corte Inglés department store and the María Zambrano main railway station.

According to consultants Savills Aguirre Newman, Malaga city has a stock of about 420,000 square metres and under ten per cent is available to be leased. This amount should increase by 100,000 square metres in the next five years, as more office building projects are completed.

The analysis says that companies from outside the area looking to set up locally are attracted by the lifestyle and available workforce. They need modern, open-plan spaces that are flexible. New developments near the coast to the west of the city centre are expected to create another prime area in the future.

Local vehicle sales fall 11% so far this year and dealers call for incentives

The Malaga association of car sellers claims there is lots of pent-up demand and that the government needs to step in

MALAGA. These past twelve months will go down as a bad year for vehicle sales in the province of Malaga, including the Costa del Sol. Although there are a few days left of December still to go, sales to private individuals up to November were down 16.7 per cent year-on-year. At just over 18,000 vehicles sold, it's one of the lowest figures in recent times.

When company vehicles and those bought by the dealerships themselves are added in, the total rises to 25,652, 11.7 per cent less.

In an analysis carried out by SUR, talking to members of the industry in the province, the reason for the decline appears to be down to a number of factors. Will diesel be scrapped? Will electric cars triumph? Other reasons include fears over job security, growing lack of interest among younger generations in having a car and also a fall in birthrate.

The decline is also being put down to improvements in public transport, more people using bikes or electric scooters and new online services, such as renting mopeds by the minute.

Decline doesn't make sense

The head of the association of local dealerships (AMA), Carlos Oliva, said that although there are long-term sociological factors at play, their impact is more gradual. Instead, he believes that people are

just keeping their old cars longer. "There is pent-up demand; the cars on the road haven't been replaced, and the average age has gone up from seven to thirteen years, the second highest in Europe. People are still driving, but cars are getting older. It doesn't make sense."

Oliva called for the government to incentivise people to change their cars, as happened in the past. "They don't have to be electric. A 2019 petrol engine gives off 30 per cent less than ten years ago."

On Wednesday, the King of Spain yet again asked Socialist (PSOE) leader and acting prime minister Pedro Sánchez to try and form the country's next government. Sánchez, as leader of the party that took the most votes on November 10th, is now headed for a second bout of investiture votes, in which he is by no means guaranteed to succeed. Given the continued political uncertainty, the changes that Sánchez has suggested making to the 1978 Spanish Constitution may appear entirely reasonable.

The PSOE leader has proposed altering Article 99 of the Constitution, believing that governmental deadlocks would thereby be prevented. Article 99 states that, once nominated by the King, a prospec-

tive president must secure an absolute majority in the first investiture vote in congress or, failing that, a simple majority in a repeat vote held no more than 48 hours later. If he or she fails in the second investiture, there are two months for a new candidate to be proposed. And if that also fails to happen, parliament is dissolved and new elections are called.

Sánchez wants to change the Constitution so that the party with the biggest share of the national vote - in this case, his Socialists, who took 28.7% on November 10th, 12 points ahead of the second-placed party, the Conservative PP - automatically gets to form a government, without having to first go through a nerve-wracking investiture process.

Well, why shouldn't the leading party automatically have the first shot at putting together a government (which is always what ends up happening anyway)? Surely that is a democratically earned right for the political group that's first past the post on election day? The investiture process, you could argue, is a convoluted and unnecessary step - one that often triggers a repeat election because the prime ministerial candidate can't secure enough support.

However, if the proposed changes to Article 99 meant that Sánchez's Socialists automatically became the next government, Spain would be ruled by a party lacking either a parliamentary majority or more than 50% of the national vote. To come at it from another angle, imagine that, after No-

vember 10th, no investiture votes were necessary because Sánchez had automatically assumed the responsibility of forming the next administration. The PSOE leader would still have had to try and create a coalition with or secure parliamentary votes from other parties to govern. But it was precisely the impossibility of either feat that triggered the last election, which was itself the result of Sánchez's failure in investitures held after the April 28th vote.

Perhaps the real problem lies elsewhere. Might it be Spanish politicians' refusal to recognise the importance of compromise in a fragmented political landscape, rather than Article 99 of the Constitution, that is preventing the formation of a stable government? I think it might.

Golden Globe nomination follows top European award for Banderas

News of the Malaga actor's nomination for his role in Pain and Glory came just days after he won the Best European Actor award

MALAGA / BERLIN. Malaga actor Antonio Banderas sees his chances of an Oscar rise as yet more success has come his way this week. On Saturday he was named Best European Ac-

tor at the European Film Academy awards in Berlin, and on Monday he learned that he had been nominated by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association for a Golden Globe.

The performance that has taken him this far, and could even take him as far as the Oscars, is his role in Pain and Glory, Pedro Almodóvar's quasi-autobiographical movie.

The film has not stopped reaping in international praise since it premiered in Cannes, where Banderas also picked up the Best Actor award.

On Saturday the actor accepted his

prize from the European Film Academy by videoconference from Malaga, where he is currently starring in the musical A Chorus Line at his own new theatre project.

"Almodóvar, whom I've known for 40 years, has been a miracle in my life, I respect him and love him," said Banderas in his message.

Almodóvar will be accompanying the actor at the Golden Globes gala in Los Angeles on 6 January, as Pain and Glory also competes in the Best Motion Picture - Foreign Language category.

For the award Best Performance by an Actor in a Motion Picture - Drama, Banderas faces fierce competition from fellow nominees, Christian Bale (Ford v Ferrari), Adam Driver (Marriage Story), Joaquin Phoenix (Joker) and Jonathon Pryce (The Two Popes).

The Malaga actor however goes to the Globes with heavy support, from the Cannes prize and the European award, to the Hollywood Actor Award, a recognition at the Palm Springs Festival, Goya nominations and being named actor of the year by Time magazine.

In the foreign language film category, Pain and Glory is less strong, up against favourite Parasite from South Korea.

Clean-up removes 650 kilogrammes of waste from Fuengirola river

FUENGIROLA. Environmental awareness group Mi Moana brought together around 35 volunteers on Saturday for their monthly cleanup, this time on the river Fuengirola.

The volunteers, aided by divers from Diving with Nic, retrieved over 650 kilogrammes of waste from the river, including an floating island which had formed, made up of wetwipes, condoms and sanitary pads.

"It's clear that this has something to do with an open or broken sewage pipe," said Mi Moana co-founder Natasha Wegloop. "The divers informed us that they felt that they were walking on wetwipes," she added, pointing out that these are causing lots of damage to sewers and are non-biodegradable.

Dead fish and rats

"Several people approached us during the cleanup, telling us that in the last year they had seen lots of dead fish and rats floating in this part of the river [between Dunnes Stores and the Miramar shopping centre]."

"Our marine biologist has taken a water sample and we hope to get

the results back this week."

Mi Moana has brought this "urgent" problem to the attention of Fuengirola town hall and have offered their help in resolving this "unhealthy situation".

"This river belongs to Fuengirola and is connected to the part of the beach where people are swimming and renting small boats," Natasha warned.

Mi Moana organises monthly underwater and river cleanups across the Costa del Sol, details of which can be found on their Facebook page.

IN THE FRAME

An innovative life on the Costa del Sol

Gill Scott-Gribler first arrived on the Costa del Sol in 1965, and she opened the first beach bar in Los Boliches shortly after. Since then, she has worked as a secretary to several high-profile tycoons, including Henry Tiarks, the last generation of one of the City of London's merchant banking dynasties.

Born in Coventry in 1941, Gill was brought up in Bournemouth. She left England at the age of 20 and went to Tehran to work as secretary to the director general of Radio and Television Iran. She had decided to go to the Middle East in order to learn some of the languages, although she only stayed for three months, returning to the UK after her mother suffered a stroke. Gill never returned to Iran, because the political situation was uncertain at that time, but she still holds a warm spot for it in her heart.

"I loved Iran and would have loved to have gone back. I found it wonderful. It was very sophisticated and cultured, and the people were wonderful and extremely welcoming," Gill explains to SUR in English.

On returning to the UK, Gill shared a flat with a friend whose business partner would eventually become her husband. Ian Gribler was looking for a new business venture and had decided to go to Spain, inviting Gill to go with him. She agreed and they settled in Los Boliches.

Noticing that there was nowhere to eat on the seafront the couple came up with the idea of opening a small bar on the beach.

"There were no bars along the beach at that time and we didn't know anything about how to open one. I went off to Malaga with just half a dozen words in Spanish and a short skirt and I got permission to open a beach bar," she says, smiling as she recalls the period.

They opened their bar - which was the first chiringuito in Los Boliches - and called it the Sugar Shack. It quickly gained a reputation and gave the couple a steady income. They ran the bar for one year, before returning to the UK briefly. They had decided to get married and shortly after Gill became pregnant, so her husband thought it best they settle in the UK. However, Gill soon persuaded

her reluctant husband to return to Spain, where their first child was born in 1967.

"I had cravings for everything Spanish, even Spanish onions, so I said look, I want to go back to Spain.

He thought I was crazy, but agreed to return for a five-year period."

Pioneering idea

The couple brought a house for 2,000 pounds and reopened their

bar. It would be one of their regular customers who would give the couple the opportunity to start their next business venture, which again proved to be a pioneering move.

The customer admired Gill and Ian's capacity for hard work and offered to finance a new business project that they were considering at the time. After spending years peeling vegetables at their beach bar, they came up with the idea of supplying bars with prepared potatoes. At the time, the catering trade was taking off in the area and so they couple opened the first processed potato factory in Fuengirola.

"Cafes, bars and restaurants were opening up like mushrooms so we set up a factory to supply peeled and chipped potatoes. We had many women from Ronda working in the factory, and boy did they work," Gill says, appreciatively.

The couple eventually sold the factory, and it was around this time that they also sold their bar.

By then, Gill had three children and decided to stop work and become a housewife. It was during this period that her marriage broke up and she found a small escape in writing poetry, although she never published anything.

"I went off to Malaga with just half a dozen words in Spanish and a short skirt and I got permission to open a beach bar"

She decided to go back to work, taking a job as a secretary to a yacht broker in Puerto Banús. This was a position she held for almost ten years. After this, she worked as secretary to merchant banker Henry Tiarks. He died in 1995 and left Gill a "sizable amount of money". He also left her 3,000 books, although she had nowhere to store such a large collection and was forced to sell them at the flea market.

Gill has now lived in Fuengirola for more than 50 years. Although she fell in love when she arrived in 1965, there are a few things that she still misses about England.

"I have to return to England at least once a year. I miss policemen's helmets, country lanes and celery that isn't so stringy," the sprightly 78-year-old concludes.

The delicate Aztec lily

The fiery red blooms of this relation to *Hippeastrum* may not appear very often but they are worth the wait

A member of the Amaryllidaceae family (of which the popular Christmas Amaryllis bulb is a member), *Sprekelia formosissima* is native to Mexico and Guatemala. Unrelated to true lilies, com-

mon names for *Sprekelia* include Aztec lily, Mexican fire lily, Jacobean and St James' lily. It is a herbaceous perennial with shiny, strap-like leaves and the fiery red blooms, up to 12cm

across and one per stem, are more reminiscent of an orchid than a lily.

The bulb is tender and often grown as an annual in cold climates and is therefore best grown in a container so that it can be moved under cover in cold winters, especially inland from the coast.

In bloom, the Aztec lily can reach 35cm tall. Even with regular feeding during the growing season blooming can be unreliable. Planted in groups, only two or three may flower in a year.

However it may sometimes bloom twice in one year, in the spring and again in the autumn. Other times it may not send up a flower for several years.

Although this bulb was common in conservatories and greenhouses in Victorian Britain, the inconsistency of flowering has made *Sprekelia formosissima* less popular nowadays than *Amaryllis* (*Hippeastrum*) but the exceptional beauty of the crimson velvet petals with green throat makes up for its unreliability.

The Aztec lily needs a sunny or partially shaded spot and rich, moist soil, preferably slightly acidic. Propagation can be carried out by sowing seeds collected after flowering however a lot of patience would be needed until the resulting seedlings flower. A better method is to remove and pot up the bulblets; left undisturbed *Sprekelia* will multiply and form a large clump.

The birth of ONCE, help for the blind

Old ONCE 'cupones', or lottery tickets, are collectors' items, with designs changing to represent major events in Spanish history

On 13 December 1938 ONCE, an organisation to provide assistance to blind people in Spain, was created.

A government decree endorsed its foundation and granted the then national organisation of the blind the right to sell the so-called "pro-blind" lottery tickets, to provide members with a livelihood. The very first draw was held on 8 May 1939.

ONCE stands for Organización Nacional de Ciegos Españoles (national organisation for Spanish blind people).

Although ONCE now has several gambling products available, the organisation's traditional product is the charity lot-

tery ticket known throughout Spain as the 'cupón'.

Sales of the ticket are the main source of income for ONCE and can carry huge tax-exempt cash prizes. The draw has different tickets for different days of the week, a special weekend ticket as well as special tickets with higher prizes at different times of year.

The draw has for many years been broadcast live every night on Spanish TV channels, including Telecinco, Cuatro and

CNN+. From January 3, 2017, it has been shown on the Spanish television channel La 1.

The basic graphic designs on the cupón are always the same, but the theme changes to correspond to current

events, for example when the Euro became legal tender in 2002, or cultural references such as national or local monuments. Collecting old issues of the cupón has become a hobby for many people in Spain.

In September 2013, coinciding with the organisation's 75th anniversary, ONCE was awarded

Spain's Príncipe de Asturias prize for Concord. From 1989 to 2003 ONCE sponsored one of Spain's leading cycling teams.

As of September 2013, membership of the organisation was 71,460 people, of whom 40 per cent were over the age of 65.

visually impaired people, is made up of three pillars: the Directorate-General; the Foundation; and CEOSA, ONCE's business corporation. This employs over 136,000 staff, of whom 88.5 per cent are people with disabilities.

ONCE continues to raise funds to provide services for the blind and people with serious visual impairment, as well as those with other disabilities, and sellers are a familiar sight in all Spanish towns, cities and villages.

The art of the 'matanza': keeping rural traditions alive

Whether because of tradition, local pride or identity, or because bought chorizo doesn't taste the same, the annual killing of a pig is still carried out in many villages

MALAGA. With the arrival of the cold, dry weather I start to think of 'morcillas' (black pudding). I think about eating them and especially making them as this is the time of year when they can be cured. I used to go to my village to chop onions and clean innards; I was an expert in tying off blood sausages and chorizos, as well as in the art of preparing marinades in which to cover the pork loin.

Perhaps if I had lived many years ago I would be proficient enough to be regarded as a 'mondonguera' like Juanita La Larga from Valera. She had an amazing ability to salt hams, render fats and prepare 'longanizas', 'morcillas', 'morcones' and 'embuchados' that would be the envy of the best.

A mondonguera was a woman whose job was the art of slaughtering the pig. She received a fixed amount for travelling to homes and farms where she worked her magic. She was responsible for collecting

and stirring the blood so that it did not coagulate, preparing the intestines to fill them, seasoning the meat, tasting, stuffing, cooking, smoking, preserving the excess in lard and, in many cases, giving evidence of her mastery of cooking by preparing the feast of the 'matanza'.

Depending on the area, the star dish would be the stewed liver, the pork rinds, the matanza gazpacho or the special stew with all the spare bits (ears, head etc) thrown into a large pot. The 'matachín' were the men of the house who sacrificed the animal and carved it up but it was the women folk who did all the mixing and seasoning.

To some of you all this will sound like Chinese, but to many Spanish people who lived in small villages, the 'guaro' will bring back memories of a festive atmosphere, of work shared between the family and done with joy, of the smell of smoke, freezing icicles and the distant squeals of a pig in the early morning.

In the houses where it is still carried out, it is by tradition, by pride, by identity; because the bought chorizos never taste like their own. Not so many years have passed (five or six decades at most) since the annual slaughter of the family pig was the basic subsistence technique of the Spanish. In a time when there were no refrigerators, killing the pig was the difference between going hungry or not hungry, so you had to use your

imagination to try to use everything, from the tail to the snout.

Like many other typical rural tasks born out of necessity (harvesting, threshing...), slaughtering needed many hands and was the perfect excuse for socialising and bonding.

The Terrae event, which is centred on rural gastronomy, was held in Zafra (Badajoz). Cooks from Spain and Portugal signed a manifesto in defence of village cuisine there. The document emphasises the role of gastronomy as an economic and cultural engine of the more unpopulated areas. It demands institutional

measures that favour the rural environment and underlines the importance of the primary sector, local products and culinary tradition.

One gastronomic author made the killing of the pig an art form. Isabel Gallardo Gómez was born in Orellana de la Sierra in 1879. She published a recipe book entitled 'La cocina, tratado completísimo del arte culinario' (1922) which was almost an encyclopaedic manual in two volumes containing over 3,000 recipes.

The second volume starts with an extensive chapter dedicated to home slaughtering and with various recipes. Sausages, hams, six

kinds of morcillas, seven types of chorizos, eleven different ways to prepare pork loin, tongue etc.

A whole universe of pork and centuries of knowledge compressed into thirty pages that, in the words of its author, were of exceptional importance for those "accustomed to buying all the pork preparations ready made and who have never seen a slaughter, either because they live in the capital and live in flats and it is not easy to make them, or for other reasons". That's us.

Hopefully we will always preserve this rural knowledge and the flavour of the chorizos.

WHO'S WHO?



Which restaurant guide do you trust? Surely not the Michelin, unless your taste is for expensive and minority gastronomic experiences.

The Spanish Campsa Guide? Very reliable but in no way user-friendly. TripAdvisor? Perhaps the best option if you are in a hurry and are content to base your personal leanings on a star system, while running the risk of being conned by false reviews published by professional phoneyes.

Well, if you live on the Costa del Sol you are in luck. SUR has just published its annual 'Who's Who in Málaga Gastronomy' for 2020.

The Guide is sort of clubby, and if you read between the lines it is easy to understand the relationships involved.

The chefs mentioned have not just made their name in one restaurant, rather in several, and taking as an example Juan Luis Fernández, who runs Marbella's new Maison Lu, had worked previously in what is the most notable fish restaurant in Spain, Aponiente, in El Puerto de Santa María (Cadiz province).

The editor/creator of the Guide is Enrique Bellver, Diario SUR's long-serving food and wine expert, who makes the earth shake when he enters a restaurant. He is also a

very nice guy, whose main fault is to take his job too seriously and to cut short what could be a delightful three-hour lunch by protestations that he has to start writing up the meal he has just consumed.

What is truly notable is that there is nothing like this Guide published anywhere else in Spain. Facing life with motor neuron disease

British expat Della Hall, 45, was diagnosed with the disorder in 2017 and she is now confined to a wheelchair

BENALMÁDENA. A 45-year-old British expat who once enjoyed an active life on the Costa del Sol has had her life shattered by the devastating muscle disorder motor neuron disease (MND). Prior to 2014, Della Hall, who has lived in Benalmádena for 25 years, had run her own business and brought up two daughters with her husband Simon, but the last few years have seen them struggle to cope with a disease that currently has no cure.

MND is an umbrella term for a number of conditions caused by the degeneration of motor neurons, the nerve cells responsible for carrying electrical instructions from the brain through the spinal cord to the muscles. When this happens, the muscles become weak and waste away, affecting movement, speech and breathing.

Della, who is now confined to a wheelchair and relies on the constant support of her husband, was diagnosed in 2017, but she had been suffering with the symptoms for more than two years.

Uncommon condition

MND is an uncommon condition and no two cases are the same. Symptoms - which may include weakness in the ankles or legs, muscle cramps, trouble swallowing and slurred speech - come on gradually and may not be obvious at first. It

is nearly always fatal and will significantly shorten life expectancy, but some people live with the condition for many years.

"There are four types of MND. They all end the same way but all start differently. I have limb-onset, which affects my lower legs. The problem is that we don't know when or why it started and, because it is a relatively unknown disease, it took the doctors more than two years to diagnose the problem," Della explains to SUR in English.

Della first realised that something was wrong in 2014, when she went on a girls' weekend to Mallorca in order to celebrate her 40th birthday. She was queuing to get into a nightclub when her ankle suddenly gave way and she collapsed. She sought medical help on returning

Friends join forces to raise money for a better quality of life

Some of Della's friends and associates, both here on the coast and also in the UK, have been busy raising money to help pay for expensive medicines and the equipment she needs to carry out simple daily tasks. The couple have had to buy a specially adapted vehicle, an electric wheelchair and various other equipment to make life more comfortable.

Della pays around six hundred

euros per month for medicines, and her friends are busy campaigning to raise money for a possible new treatment that should be available in the USA next year.

The Welsh Society has also shown its support and its members will be active during this weekend's Christmas Traditions Festival in Benalmádena in order to raise funds to help Della have a better quality of life.

However, it has been Della's devoted husband Simon - "my angel" - that has been a constant pillar of strength, and the person who has given her the will to survive.

to Malaga and doctors soon discovered that she had a B12 deficiency, so they started her on a course of injections.

"It was really strange, because I was on a girlie weekend away and suddenly collapsed for no reason. I didn't trip; I wasn't drunk; I just fell over. After that, I just kept falling over all the time and so we just assumed it was the B12 deficiency," she says.

Della was having the B12 injections every two weeks and this gave her energy, but it did not solve the problem with her ankle, which had started to become extremely painful. She saw 11 doctors and specialists before eventually being sent to see a neurologist, who diagnosed her condition after administering an electromyography (EMG), a test that measures muscle response or electrical activity in response to a nerve's stimulation of the muscle.

Della is now taking IBILF, a drug that is generally used to treat asthma patients. She needed the aid of a Bi-Pap ventilator to help her sleep because she had high CO2 levels and her breathing was deteriorating.

"Three months after taking IBILF my CO2 levels were back to normal and it is definitely because of this drug. I still use the machine to help me sleep, but I am not as dependent on it as I was before," she points out.

There is no cure for MND and the medicines that Della uses simply slow down progression and help to prolong her life. The family home has been adapted with ramps and widened doorways to allow easy access, but the couple's main concern is that Della's condition does not have an effect on their two teenage daughters.

"We act normally at home and we don't really let the children see any different. I would say they are quite at ease with the situation," she says.

Della visits Cudeca twice a week for physiotherapy sessions and these have had a positive effect. After just

one week of therapy, Della's pain had stopped, and she has nothing but praise for the "compassionate, friendly staff" who are "just amazing".

She is now in contact with others who suffer from MND and uses several social media platforms to keep up with the latest medicines and treatments.

"I have friends all over the world. I have an amazing group of people who research every new drug that becomes available. If something new comes along, they source it and we guinea pig it," Della says smiling.

Della is hopeful that a new treatment currently being tested in the USA will become available soon. Tests have proved positive and have reversed the symptoms in several cases. The trials for the drug end in July 2020, but she is keeping an open mind for now. She is a fighter and believes that a positive mind is paramount.

"I always tell my neurologist not to doom and gloom me. I am positive so they need to be positive with me. If they haven't got anything positive to say, I don't want to listen. I have difficult periods, but when that happens, we just find a way around the problem and continue," Della concludes.

British expat Mick Slater put his best foot forward to walk an incredible 1,000 miles in aid of charity last month

MARBELLA. A Marbella resident is celebrating after completing a gruelling 1,000-mile walk in aid of charity.

Mick Slater spent one month walking from Marbella to Monaco in a bid to raise £30,000 for the UK mental health charity Mind.

Walking approximately 33 miles a day, the dad of three had to contend with blisters, guard dogs and a few near misses with vehicles along the route.

The 55-year-old set off on 1 November and finished his challenge on 30 November, walking up to 13 hours a day.

Mick, who is originally from Derby and moved to Marbella just

over a year ago, told SUR in English: "I had originally wanted to walk a distance of 30 miles as I really enjoy walking.

"I started researching routes on Google and this idea of walking to Monaco started creeping in. I

thought is it possible to walk 1,000 miles? It was a crazy idea, but it worked out in the end."

Mick, who runs the family business Cheeky Nutrition, said he wanted to raise money for Mind as it was "dear to my heart".

He explained: "Everybody I know knows someone who has been affected by mental health in some way, so it seemed like a great cause to raise money for."

During the challenge, Mike was accompanied in the evenings by his wife Karen and his daughter Claire, who drove ahead each day to find accommodation.

He added: "The worst parts were the guard dogs and the traffic, as I had a few near misses, it was terrifying and quite hazardous in that respect. Walking in the dark, you didn't know who was around."

Mick spent several months training for the challenge and said that it wasn't his legs that hurt, but the multiple blisters he developed along the way.

After driving 16 hours back from Monaco after the event he added: "If I had driven the route before the event, I wouldn't have walked it, as the distance looked too overwhelming.

"But I've achieved something that I thought was impossible to do. I'm really pleased to have raised awareness of mental health."

The Doctor's House: the story of Malaga's first modern health centre

ALHAURÍN DE LA TORRE

Professor and historian Carlos San Millán describes in a book the process of creating a pioneering medical facility in the 1950s

|| **FERNANDO TORRES.** In the 1950s, Alhaurín de la Torre became the first place in Malaga province to have a Rural Hygiene Centre and Doctor's House. This was a new concept in health care, and a type of medical facility which until then had not existed, combining the doctor's home and a medical centre in the same building. There were two beds, a clinical room and a consulting room.

"This was an important step forward for the time, because until then the doctors had nowhere to see patients or attend to someone who was injured and needed to be monitored," says Carlos San Millán, associate professor of History at Malaga university and the head of studies at El Atabal school, who considers himself an 'alhaurino' by adoption.

San Millán has published a book called 'La sanidad en Alhaurín de la Torre en la segunda mitad del Siglo XX' (Health care in Alhaurín de la Torre in the second half of the 20th century) which details the construction of the 'Centro Rural de Higiene y Casa Rural del Médico'.

"Before they built that centre, the doctors used to rent somewhere to live and see patients in one of the rooms there," he explains. These fa-

cilities were constructed in the early 1950s and inaugurated in 1952.

After carrying out long and complicated research, San Millán has compiled the principal information about the project, which was considered a pioneer not just in Malaga but in Andalucía as well.

The plans were drawn up by architects José Pulido and Santiago Sanguinetti Lobato and the official opening was attended by top local and provincial officials, including the then civil governor of Malaga, Manuel García del Olmo. Diario SUR carried the news of the opening on its front pages.

In the book, the author also describes Alhaurín de la Torre in the early 1950s, when it had a population of just over 5,000. That figure entitled it to have an APD (Atención Pública Domiciliaria) doctor, a nursing assistant, a midwife and a pharmacist. "In other words, a team of four people to attend to more than 5,000 inhabitants, many of whom lived in outlying areas some distance away, like El Romeral, Santa Amalia and Zapata. The doctor often had to walk or cycle out there to see them," he says.

Until 1970 Alhaurín de la Torre only had one doctor. "Once the population reached 6,000 it was able to have another doctor as well. That was very

different to the present ratio of one doctor with 1,200 patients on his or her list," stresses San Millán.

His book includes the original plans, of which he gives a comparative analysis "through the perspective of time". He also describes the human resources in health care, the building plans and regulations, the architectural perspective and construction and budgetary aspects. "It cost the equivalent of around 1,000 euros to build, whereas nowadays something like that would cost 180,000 euros," he says.

Lack of resources

San Millán also managed to find someone who had worked on the construction project, who provided him with information about wages and working hours. The works on the Rural Hygiene Centre and Doctor's House began in the summer of 1951 and were completed in March 1952. Thanks to labourer Cristóbal Vega Benítez, the author learned that five bricklayers and five labourers worked on the project. The former earned 30 pesetas a day, and the latter 15 or 18 pesetas.

"From my research, I have learned about the lack of resources in those days and the medical staff had to work all hours. On the other hand they were treated as part of the village community, almost like family," says San Millán.

The book was launched at the library in Alhaurín de la Torre, and the event was attended by the mayor, Joaquín Villanova, and relatives of some of the first medical staff who worked in what at that time was a state-of-the-art health care centre.

Until the centre was built, the doctor had to rent somewhere to live and see patients in a room there

Malaga, however, had several, with Maria Ruiz the standout player. She created two chances and had one herself, a shot from outside the area which deflected off an opponent and grazed the post. Another

José Rodríguez attracts interest from Real Oviedo

MALAGA. As a result of Malaga's disastrous summer transfer window, one of the club's star signings of that period, José Rodríguez, has not been able to feature for the first team this season.

With little sign of an imminent reduction in the wage bill, it looks highly unlikely that he will be able to be registered in January either - especially given that he is among the highest earners at the club. There could now be an escape route for him, however.

Former Malaga captain and sporting director Francesc Arnau has this week been appointed to the latter role at direct league rivals Real Oviedo. It is believed that he would be interested in bringing the midfielder to the Asturian club as Arnau in fact signed José Rodríguez the first time the 24-year-old joined the club in 2017 and has a good working relationship with his agent, Alberto Toldrá - the same man who represented Pablo Fornals during his

controversial departure from the club.

Mula and Rolón

Malaga urgently need to move players on in January to help balance the books and another player who finds himself in the same situation as José Rodríguez is academy product Álex Mula.

Arнау always rated the youngster highly and could look to capitalise on his former club's financial situation with a move for the attacker.

Malaga, however, would be loath to lose the pair and interim sporting director Manolo Gaspar is looking at other ways to generate revenue.

One is to offload midfielder Esteban Rolón who is most certainly surplus to requirements. There is some interest from the MLS, US-based journalist Niko Moreno told SUR. It would be a similar deal to that which took Emanuel Cecchini to the Seattle Sounders - a loan deal until at least the end of the current season in Europe.

Minority shareholders to meet with judge in the coming days in bid to oust Sheikh Al-Thani

A judge must decide if the lawsuit against the Malaga CF president, with the backing of local administrations, can go ahead

MALAGA. With talk of a takeover of the club now over, the latest attempt to remove Sheikh Al-Thani as Malaga club president is gaining

momentum.

In the coming days, the Association of Minority Shareholders will meet with a judge in Malaga to discuss a criminal lawsuit against the majority owner for improper management of the club and misappropriation of funds. It will be the judge who decides whether the association has a case and if the lawsuit can continue.

At this meeting, the judge, the

association's lawyer, Francisco Valverde, and another representative are expected to attend and discuss the complicated situation the club currently finds itself in and the need to take urgent action to prevent a points deduction and, worse still, the club going under.

Should the lawsuit go ahead, the minority shareholders can expect to count on the support of Malaga city hall and the provincial and regional governments.

Information and evidence is currently being compiled in the hope that the process can be speedy and instigate a change of ownership in time for the January transfer window so that the current campaign can be brought back on track.

A force of nature

Joaquín is far from a conventional footballer. At 38, he scored his first hat-trick and has recently extended his contract past his 40th birthday

Some footballers invest millions in experts to cultivate their brand and personality, Joaquín Sánchez needs none of that.

You could make this fellow up. He's the most loveable player, at one of the most likeable clubs – Real Betis. Last weekend he went into the record books as the oldest player to ever to score a La Liga hat-trick – aged 38. He beat the great Alfredo Di Stéfano's record.

Quite deservedly he claimed the Marca front-page and headline 'Joatrick' (I hope our sub-editor doesn't steal it!).

This is a man who has been entertaining us on and off the pitch since his debut in the year 2000. I remember the Liverpool manager Gérard Houllier comparing him to Luis Figo as one of the best wingers in the world.

Many major clubs were inter-

ested in signing him but the Betis owner Manuel Ruiz de Lopera stubbornly stood in the way of any move and threatened to loan him out to lowly Albacete as a punishment for showing ambition. Joaquín called his bluff and drove for five hours across Spain to pose for a picture at his proposed new club. The deal was halted.

He did thrill fans of Valencia, Fiorentina and Malaga where he was a star of the team that was so close to a Champions League semi-final. But he will always be associated with Real Betis and has just signed a new contract beyond his 40th birthday. In fact, he now also owns two per cent of the club who signed him as a promising teenager from an underprivileged background.

One of nine children, he

dreamed of being a bullfighter. His upbringing wasn't conventional. It's folklore that he was breastfed until the age of seven. Maybe when he finally retires, he could launch his own energy drink?

There must be some secret to his longevity? It took him just 18 minutes to score three goals against Athletic Bilbao. "It's the first hat-trick of my life and I don't think I will get another one," he said humbly, before adding: "I will never forget this day, but I'll stay at home. I'm tired. But no one believes that, I'm going to have a drink." You don't doubt that he did and it wasn't milk!

These days, leading footballers employ professionals to run their social media accounts and invent things to make them sound interesting. Joaquín is just

a natural. A bit like Gazza but not as daft. When he signed for Malaga he was requested to perform the obligatory keepie-uppies. He opted to grab the microphone and perform an impro-

vised stand-up routine.

This is the man who once accepted the challenge to hypnotise a hen on Spanish television and is still hypnotising defenders at the age of thirty-eight.



Ambassador's search ends with a sad discovery

Britain's top diplomat in Spain, Hugh Elliott, hopes to raise awareness for multiple sclerosis after a search launched on Twitter came up against the illness

MADRID. British ambassador to Spain Hugh Elliott could not have predicted the outcome of his search for a woman who helped him 35 years ago in Burgos.

Last week, coinciding with his visit to northern Spain, the ambassador posted a video on social media explaining how he wanted to find a woman from Burgos, Lourdes Arnaiz, who took him into her home 35 years ago when he had nowhere to stay en route to Santiago de Compostela.

Now, as British ambassador in her country, he wanted to thank her again for her kindness. His appeal was successful; Hugh found news

of Lourdes but was unable to deliver his thanks. She had died when she was just 35 years old, after suffering from multiple sclerosis.

The ambassador posted a second video last Saturday explaining his sad discovery.

He learned of Lourdes' illness and death from her brother Alfonso, whom Hugh also met in Burgos during that first visit to Spain of which he holds such fond memories.

Despite the sad outcome, Hugh and Alfonso agreed to share the story to help raise awareness of multiple sclerosis, an illness that is "devastating" for both sufferers and their families, the ambassador explains. Now he calls for all those who helped his search when his first message received an "overwhelming, unexpected and kind" response, to also do their bit for the battle against the disease.

In Burgos, and all over Spain, there are associations for multiple sclerosis patients and their relatives, and the British ambassador has encouraged everyone who can to con-

contact with Alfonso (who lives with his family in Burgos) had been friendly, and they agreed to make the most of the opportunity to raise awareness for multiple sclerosis.

"Many of us know someone who is affected," said the ambassador, who also shared links for associations in Burgos, Santiago de Compostela, Salamanca (where he worked as a young man) and the national organisation. "It's the least we can do for Lourdes," he said.

No bike and no money

The story of how Hugh and Lourdes' paths crossed was revealed in his Tweet last week. In a video the ambassador explained how he arrived in Burgos in 1984 by train from Carcassonne in France. He had been following the Camino de Santiago but decided to go by train to Burgos and continue from there.

His bike, however, did not arrive on the same train; he had little money and no means to get to the nearest campsite where he could put up his tent. His luck changed however when he met a Canadian who had gone to Burgos to visit his girlfriend, Lourdes. She and her brother did not hesitate to take the young British man into their home for the five days it took him to recover his bike. He never forgot her kindness.
